ATHLETICS

The athletic program at Southern Tech consists of two parts, varsity athletics, and intramural sports. STI competes in intercollegiate athletics in six sports: basketball, baseball, track, tennis, golf and cross country. STI holds membership in the Georgia Junior College Athletic Association and competes with junior colleges and freshmen teams in Georgia and Florida in basketball and baseball.

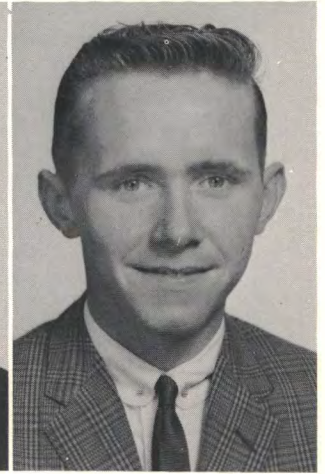
BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

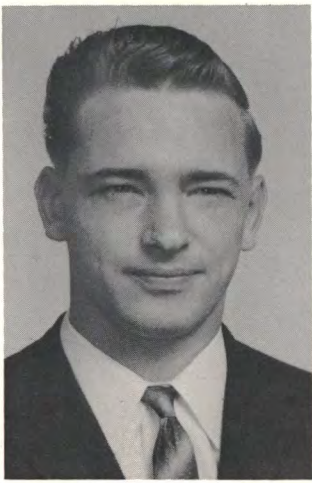
ELECTRICAL DEPARTMENT

3. Basic Courses—Subjects that are basic in any manufacturing set-up such as English, physics, mathematics, etc.

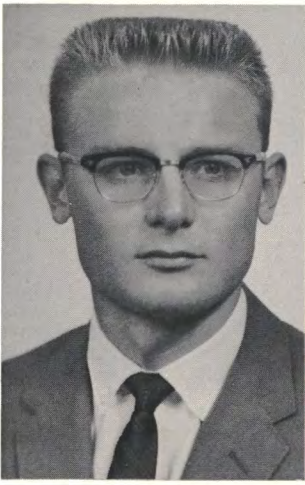

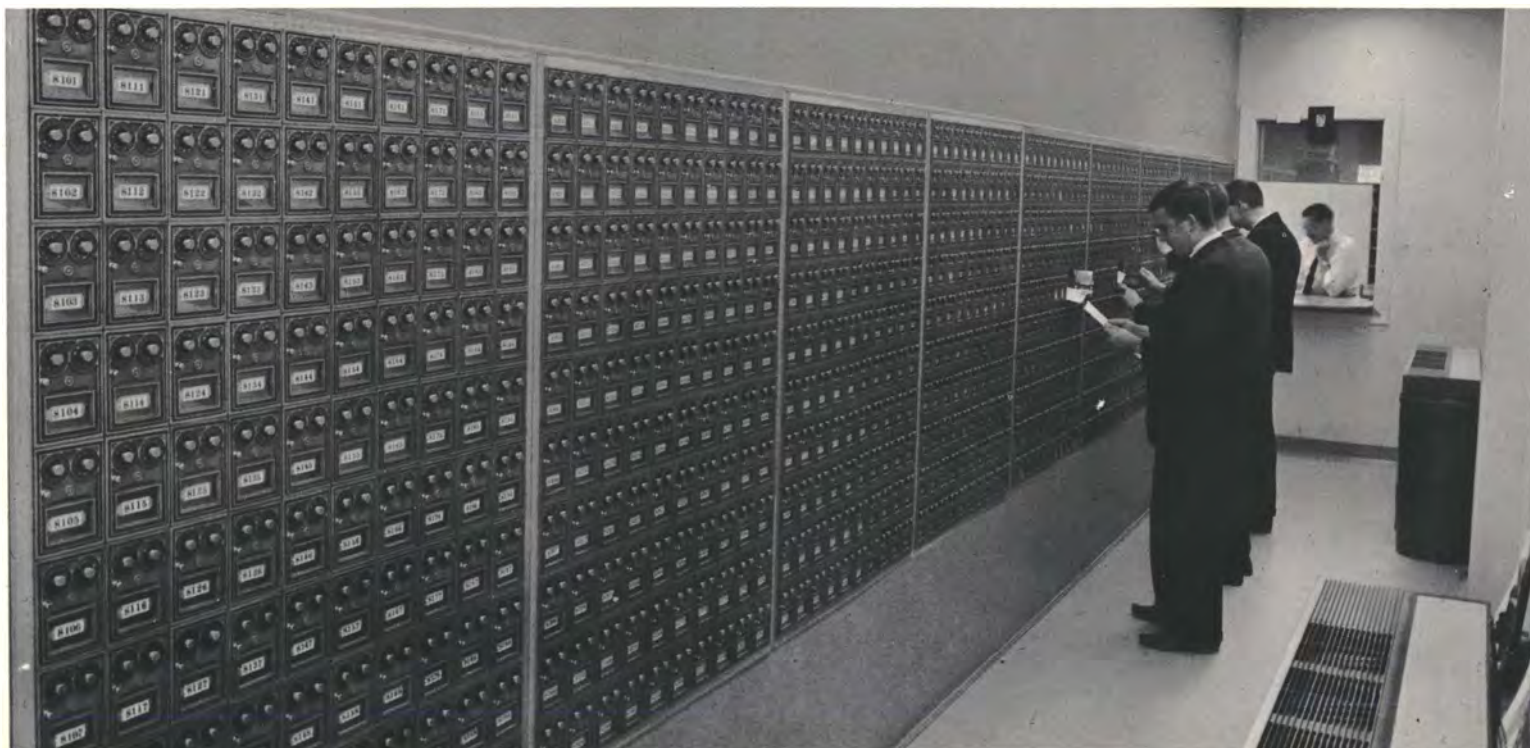
Tech Annes is a club composed of the wives of Southern Tech students. Meetings are held each second Thursday of each school month. A social get together is held each fourth Thursday.

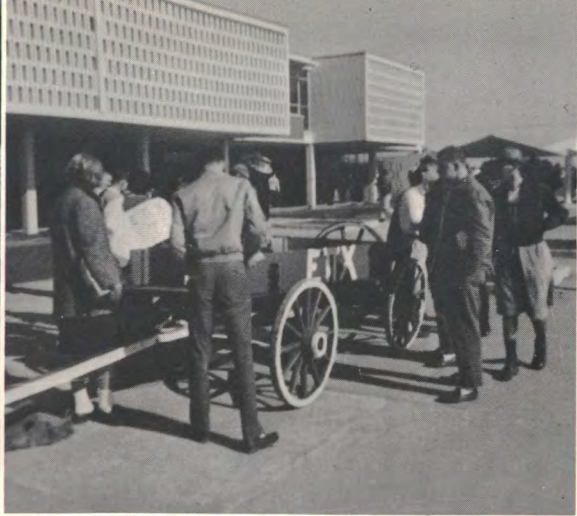
