
The Marietta campus has proven to be the great asset that was anticipated, and we shall continue to lend all possible support to its further development and to the growth of its programs.



### **ATHLETICS**

The athletic program at Southern Tech consists of two parts, varsity athletics, and intramural sports. Class room theory is correlated with laboratory work in which the student becomes familiar with the basic tool and machines used in the mechanical field.







### GAS FUEL

One of Southern Tech's major distinctions is its gas fuel technology department—the only course of its kind in the United States.

The gas industry is one of the top leading industries in the United States, and the demand for trained technicians seems almost in atiable.

The course encompasses the transmission, distribution, and utilization of natural and liquefied petroleum gases. Of course, basic science subjects, English, management courses, and courses related to the major technical specialty are included. The program is constantly surveyed by leaders in the gas industry to assure that the curriculum is designed to adequately train gas technicians.


Through the Engineering Extension Division, Georgia Tech extends its resources to serve approximately 12,000 people each year.

### SOUTHERN TECH WINS STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

For the first time in the history of Southern Tech, Georgia's junior-size rendition of the Ramblin Recks, athletic distinction is merely a step from realism.

Never before 1963 had Southern Tech won a state baseball championship, but last week chance, strong pitching and hitting turned to their favor and Coach Harry Lockhart's boys won the rule of an Eastern and Western Division split in the Georgia Junior College Conference, taking, in turn, the state title. "We're waiting now to get final confirmation on who wins in Florida," said Coach Lockhart on Saturday. "Whichever team it is will come here for a play-off that will decide who will represent our area in the nationals in Colorado.

"The games for the play-off will be a best two-of-three, starting here on May 17," added Lockhart. "We don't know yet if we'll be playing night or day games."

Southern Tech won its right to meet the Florida entry by compiling an overall record of 13-3 and winning the Western title. They then met Norman, Eastern division champs, in a play-off and won in a two-of-three series.




### A.S.T.M.E.



As was evident from this exposition, the textile industry is becoming extremely concerned with the development of new techniques toward a higher quality product.







The members are always ready to provide emergency communications during periods of disaster. The Hams are a valuable asset to the community and to Southern Tech.





The Southern Tech Library provides services for both students and faculty. Six people—four of them student assistants—keep the library open for 90½ hours per week. All of the 130 seats are usually occupied in the mornings and early afternoons, and many students work during the late afternoons and evenings. Some work on Saturdays and Sunday evenings. The library is small, but it provides facilities and opportunities for Southern Tech students to learn things outside the classrooms and adopted textbooks.

Although the seating space is limited, the library provides a number of services. Available to students are over five thousand books, over a hundred periodicals, and a half dozen newspapers. Three typewriters are available for students who want their themes and reports to have a neat, professional appearance. A Verifax copying machine is available for making copies of materials needed in reports or notes. Maps, globes, and atlases are also available. All these things are provided to aid students and to help them learn more about science and technology while they are at Southern Tech.






