












On January 2, 1948, a vanguard of five of the Southern Tech faculty and staff opened offices in Building 24 of the Atlanta Naval Air Station and began the job of building a college. They faced the job of converting open barracks into classrooms, laboratories, and offices, hiring a qualified faculty, designing courses, buying equipment, and selecting text-books, all for a college program practically unknown in the entire South.

This was the beginning of Southern Tech. It did not come about all at once but took years in the making. Mr. L. V. Johnson played an important role in the founding of Southern Tech. It was he who first conceived of the idea of a two-year technical school.

The first quarter opened on March 24, 1948, with an enrollment of 116 students, 106 veterans, and 10 non-veterans, enrolled in 7 different courses. Seven students graduated in Southern Tech's first commencement exercise. Our faculty and staff then totaled 12. Our enrollment this past fall quarter was 1215 students in 10 curricula of which 3 courses have more than 1 option. Today, we have a faculty and staff totaling about 100 people. We had 302 students graduating last year. This is a measure of our success to date, but it is only the beginning.




A graduating class while Southern Tech was at the Atlanta Naval Base.



An aerial view of Southern Tech while at the Atlanta Naval Air Station.







Old Navy barracks that were used for dormitories by Southern Tech while at N. A. B.

In the early days of Southern Tech the Mech club was one of the first organized on the campus. This club was changed to Alpha Mu Sigma, and a chapter of the ASTE has been sponsored by the local chapter of this group in Atlanta. The average starting salary of the first graduating class was approximately \$250 per month, and now has been gradually raised to \$569 per month.

The first big step for the construction of Southern Tech's new campus was taken with the ground breaking exercise, December 17, 1958 on the present campus grounds in Marietta, Georgia.

Southern Tech then located in Chamblee, Georgia moved to Marietta in September of 1961. The campus consisted of eight new buildings on an 188 acre track of land.








Grading for the parking lot at Southern Tech.

Leveling for construction of Norton Dormitory.


The first of Southern Tech's new dormitories was completed the latter part of December of 1964. The building provided living accommodations for 186 students, and dormitory supervisors.

The second, larger, dormitory was under construction at a spot on the campus just below the first dormitory just before the completion of the first dormitory. The second dormitory houses 300 students and dormitory supervisors.

Completion of Classroom buildings at S. T. I.



Administration building at night.


