2009 Preview

Sixth-year Head Coach Matt Griffin returns a talented group of players as well as some key newcomers for the 2009 Hornet Baseball Team. SPSU will look to continue their winning ways in the Southern States Athletic Conference. After a 39-17 overall record and an 18-9 conference record, the 2009 schedule is another challenging and tough slate of several ranked teams. The SSAC has sent a member to the NAIA World Series each of the last three years. This year, four teams are ranked in the preseason Top 25 poll, with two others receiving votes.

SPSU returns seven position players from last year's team that outscored its opponents 419-250, batted .352 as a team, and recorded 585 hits. All three records broke single season records at Southern Poly. The Hornets will have to replace hitters Ryan Pearson and Daniel Griffin. Both graduated, making their marks in the SPSU record books.

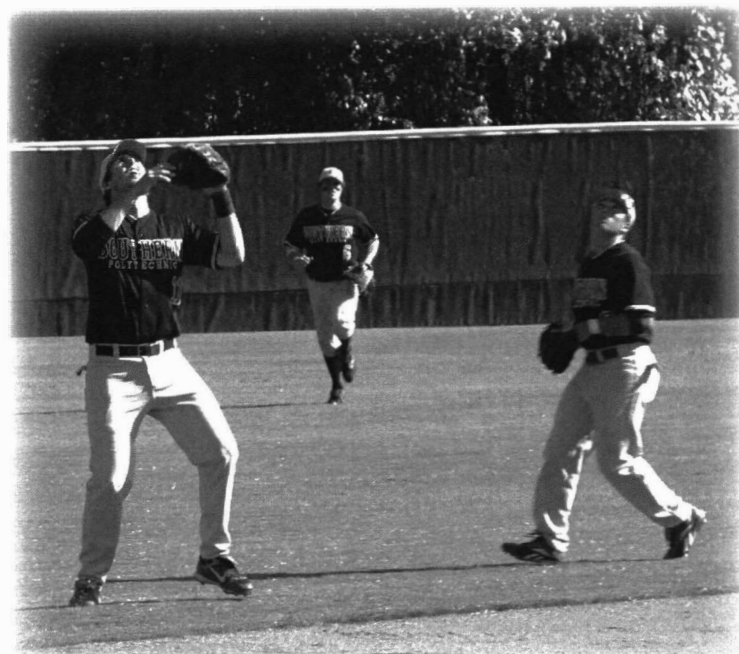
Among the returning are infielders Jake Barrow, Chaise Oliver, Corey Jones, Brett Ernst, and SPSU single season leader in homeruns, Daniel Hester, and in the outfield, Josh Grooms, All-SSAC outfielder in 2008, and Chris Hoffer.

Southern Poly added several newcomers to add depth and athleticism to the team. A talented group of infielders join the squad: Jono Waugh (Wallace St.-Hanceville), Joe Wilson and Jordan Bacon (both from Gordon College,) Tyler Weston (East Mississippi CC), Scott Haddock (Harrison HS) and Kyle Carney (SPSU). Incoming outfielders include Mason Heller (Middle GA), Ben Fleming (East Mississippi CC), Noah Hanley (Millcreek HS), and Buddy Jones (Brookwood HS.)

The catching duties will fall upon three newcomers: Justin Ray (Gordon College), Tommy Ray (Armstrong Atlantic), and Chris Rosario (Kennesaw State). All newcomers and returning players will be looked upon to provide solid defense and stability for the pitching staff.

The pitching staff returns seven strong arms after graduating second team All-SSAC starter Tom Bradley and reliever Scott Morris. Last year, Southern Poly posted a 3.71 ERA while striking out 341 batters. Among the returning pitchers are SSAC Pitcher of the Year, Mark Doll, Sean Teague, DJ Nordquist, Dustin Carder, Taylor Landrum, Ethan Carney and Peter Carney. The newcomers include Zack Ivey (Wallace St.-Hanceville), Nick Fuller (Walters St. JC), Drew Saberhagen (Western Carolina), David Harden (Mercer), and Hunter Dinsmore (Beville-Fayette JC). These newcomers, along with the talented group of returning players will try to continue the success of the Hornets on the mound in 2009.

"We are excited about our team this year," says Griffin. "We feel like our pitching staff has some quality starters and much-needed depth. Offensively, we have the team speed and talent to put up a great deal of run support."

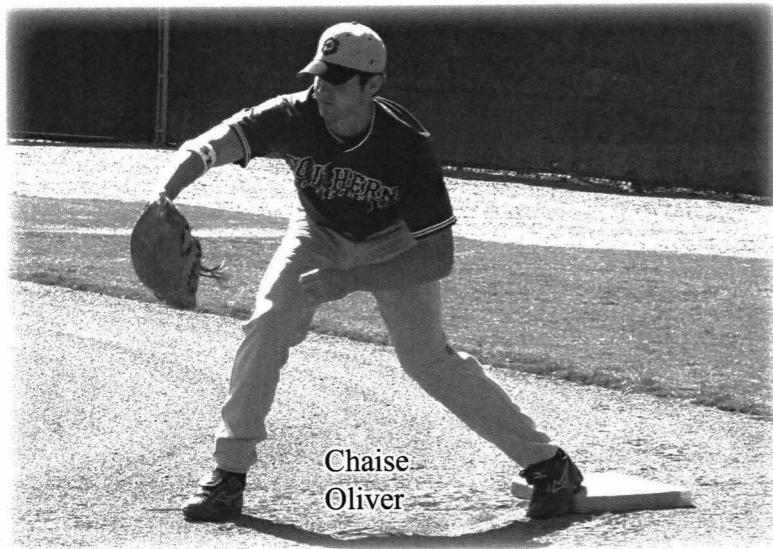

Matt Griffin is now in his sixth season as head coach of the Southern Polytechnic State University Hornets and his second year as Assistant Athletic Director. Griffin recorded his first ever collegiate win on January 31, 2004 when the Hornets defeated Thomas University 7-2. Griffin's first season proved to be memorable as his team captured the University's first ever Georgia-Alabama-Carolina Conference Tournament Championship. Along with the championship title, the Hornets secured an automatic bid to the Region XIII Tournament, which the Hornets had not been to since Griffin's playing days in 1997.

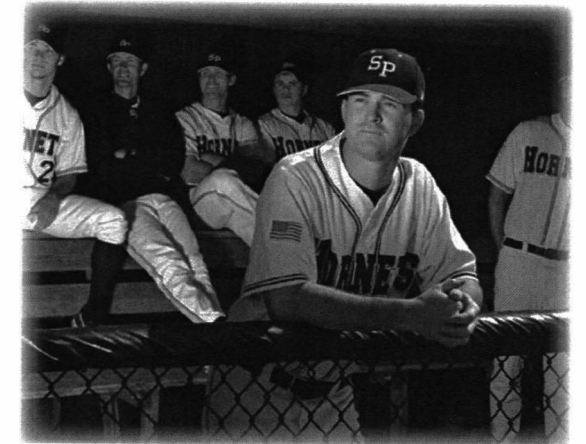
Starting with the 2004 season, Griffin began to build a program that is now known nationally as an NAIA elite program. The Hornets have won two Conference Tournament Championships and have advanced to the NAIA Regional Tournament three times over the past five years under Griffin's leadership. In 2007, the Hornets broke the all-time single season win total with 47 victories, and Coach Griffin was named the Southern States Athletic Conference Coach of the Year as well as the Georgia Dugout Club Coach of the Year. In 2008, the Hornets recorded the highest NAIA National Ranking, at number 7 in the country, and again Coach Griffin was awarded the Georgia Dugout Club Coach of the Year. The Southern Poly Baseball program has averaged 37 wins per year since 2004, and Coach Griffin's winning percentage currently stands at .640.

Formerly, Griffin was a North East Georgia All-Star shortstop at Stephens County High School in Toccoa, Georgia. Following his senior year, Griffin signed to play for the Georgia State University baseball program. After one season, Griffin transferred to SPSU and had a stellar career. In his junior and senior seasons, Griffin was named to the GAC All-Conference team as a shortstop. Griffin's resume as a collegiate player has him the holder of several Hornets hitting records, and he is currently second all time in home runs for a single season.

In the 1998 Major League Baseball Draft, Griffin was picked by the Chicago Cubs in the 32nd round and reported to the short-season A-ball affiliate in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. During Griffin's first season of play, he saw most of his action as a middle infielder in the New York Penn League. 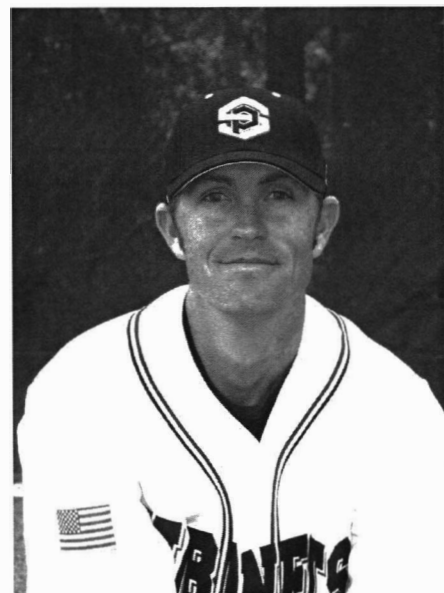

Gary Bohannon Assistant Coach

Gary Bohannon enters his sixth season as assistant coach of the Hornets. After a successful college and professional career, Bohannon has led the Hornet pitching staff to be one of the top in the SSAC. In 2007, the Hornets ranked fifth in the country in team ERA, and ranked 11th in 2008.

While a player at baseball powerhouse Kennesaw State University (1997-98), Bohannon helped pitch the Owls to the College World Series twice and compiled a 16-2 career pitching record.

At the completion of his KSU career he was drafted in the 38th round of the 1998 MLB Draft by the New York Mets. From there Bohannon's 6-3 record on the mound in the Appalachian League (1998) earned him All-Star honors. His stats for that season included a 2.56 ERA with 49 strikeouts in 60 innings, and only 5 walks. Bohannon stayed in the Mets organization through 2000 and was named Organizational Pitcher of the Month in June of 2000 for 26 scoreless innings, including inherited runners.

Bohannon came to the Hornets program after spending two years as an assistant at Chattanooga State (2002-03.) Bohannon is married to the former Bonnie Smith. The couple have a son, Cohen William, born in February of 2008. The Bohannons reside in Dallas, GA.

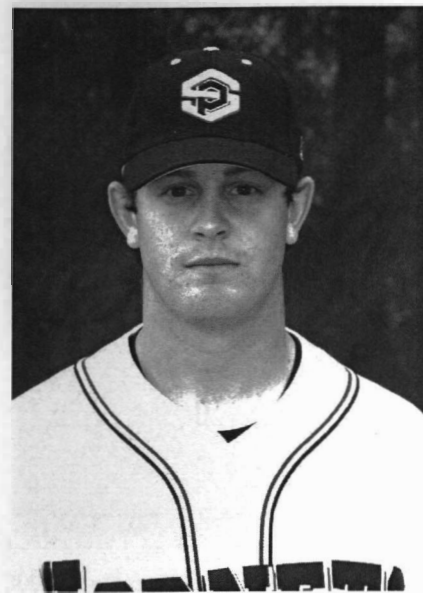

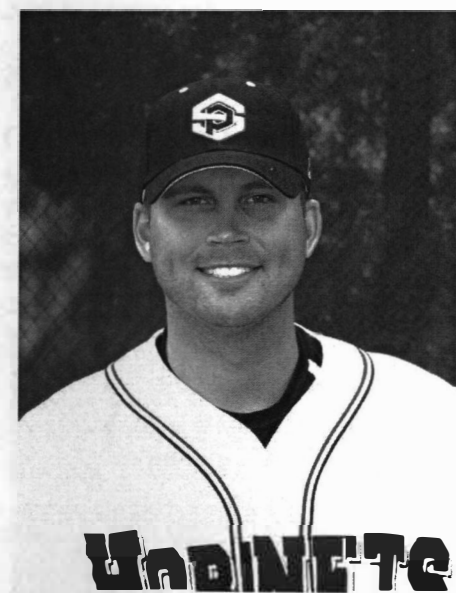
Daniel Griffin Assistant Coach

Steve Cogswell Assistant Coach

The newest addition to the Hornets staff is Steve Cogswell. Cogswell comes to SPSU with a wealth of experience at the college level. Cogswell was recently at East Mississippi Community College for the 2008 season, where he helped the Lions to a school record in wins, and led the pitching staff to the lowest ERA in school history. There he coached two All-Conference pitchers James Stoddard and Golden Grasse. Under Cogswell tenure, Stoddard broke EMCC's record for wins in a season, and lowest ERA.

Before EMCC he was at Indiana Tech, Fort Wayne, IN. There he helped Tech to a combined record of 67-43. The 2007 Tech staff finished with a 3.50 ERA which was good enough to place 15th in the nation. He coached All-American pitcher Josh Judy, and catcher Eric Ogden. Judy was drafted by the Cleveland Indians following the 2007 season. During the summers of 2007 and 2008, he coached in the Coastal Plains Summer League under Head Coach Tim Medlin.

Cogswell played for Indian Hills Junior College 2001-2002 where he was an All-American closer his sophomore season, leading the nation with 15 saves. Over his two years at Indian Hills he was 2-0 with 2.19 ERA and 22 saves in just two years. He transferred to Georgia Southern University where he played 2003-2005, achieving a 12-4 record with a 3.31 ERA and 11 saves. In 2003 he led the Southern Conference with a 1.51 ERA. His senior year he was one of four finalists for NCBWA's stopper of the year, along with current MLB players Craig Hansen, Joey Devine, and J.Brent Cox.

Cogswell is originally from Toccoa, GA, where he played for Stephens County High School. He was an All-State pitcher his senior year and was voted Northeast Georgia Player of the Year. Cogswell earned a bachelor's degree from Georgia Southern University. He is the son of Timothy and Carolyn Cogswell. Cogswell is engaged to Crystal Fales of Marietta.

Southern Polytechnic State University

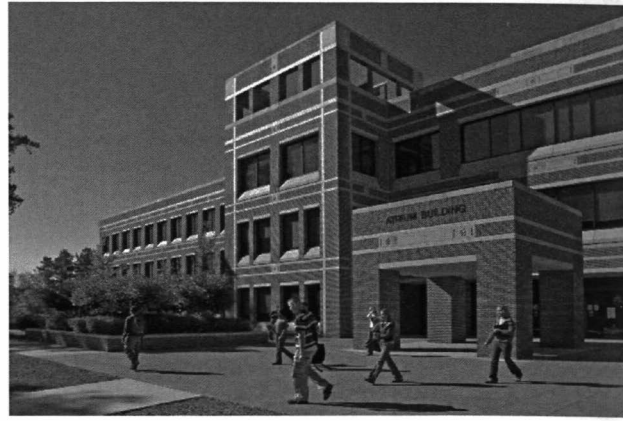
Founded in 1948 as a two-year division of Georgia Institute of Technology, SPSU was established at the request of Georgia business and industry. It first opened its doors as the Technical Institute in Chamblee, Georgia, with 116 students, all but 10 being World War II veterans, and a staff of 12.

In 1949, SPSU became the Southern Technical Institute and was recognized as a college-level school by the U.S. Department of Education. Less than a decade later, the college migrated to its present campus in Marietta, Georgia.

In 1961, Hoyt McClure was named acting director and led the movement to build eight new buildings on 120 acres of land. Since then we have continued to expand--our campus now encompasses more than 230 acres and contains 35 buildings.

SPSU became accredited as a four-year college in 1970, and was one of the first colleges in the nation to offer the bachelor of Engineering Technology degree. We also earned independence in the University System, separating ties with Georgia Tech. In the summer of 1980, SPSU officially became the 14th senior college and the 33rd independent unit of the University System.

The college's first president, Dr. Stephen R. Cheshier of Purdue University, was named in 1980 and served with distinction until his retirement as president in June 1997. He saw SPSU through two name changes--Southern College of Technology in 1987 and Southern Polytechnic State University in the summer of 1996, when the school also became a university. Dr. Daniel S. Papp served as interim president from July of 1997 to August of 1998, when the university welcomed Dr. Lisa A. Rossbacher, formerly of Dickinson College, as its president.
