
JEFF TUCKER SAYS,

SOUTHERN TECH ATTENDS SAC MEETING

Dr. Carlson, Dean Van Gorder, Coach Florian, Coach Ross, and Professor Summers attended the fall meeting of the new South Atlantic Conference held at Valdosta State College September 27 and 28. The SAC members determined championship schedules for basketball, baseball, cross country, golf, and tennis for the next three years and passed ligislation limiting members to NCAA membership. Plans for televising games were discussed and action on these plans will be taken by SAC Commissioner J. B. Scearce, Jr., former head coach at Georgia Southern. The SAC voted to adopt a Conference Seal designed by Southern Tech's own Coach Ross.

Southern Tech will host another first on it s campus when the first Conference game between the Hornets and Armstrong State College is played Friday, December 7, at 8:00 P.M. in the Gym. The SAC is comprised of six schools; Armstrong State College, Augusta College, Columbus College, Southern Tech, Valdosta State College, and West Georgia. The SAC is in Division 2 of the NCAA.




KENNY'S KOLUMN
