At last week's SGA meeting, Jeff Tucker announced that he had officially vetoed an amendment to a resolution guaranteeing the Athletic Department 45 percent of the Student Activity Fees collected after next year. The amendment provided for the guarantee to be only a minimum; that is, according to SGA Night School Representative Sandy Lyons (the author of the amendment), any excess after all departments had received their allocations would go to the Athletic Department.

In presenting his veto for affirmation or rejection by the SGA, Tucker said, "I don't question that they (the Athletic Department) should get 45 percent; I feel that we should put a maximum." Dean Van Gorder suggested that a permanent Athletic Fee should be instituted as a part of the regular Student Activity Fee. He suggested that six or seven dollars out of the 15 dollar SAF fee be earmarked for this purpose.

A motion was made to override Tucker's veto, but it failed to carry. Thus, the resolution itself still stands. Dean Van Gorder urged the SGA to decide on the final form for the proposal so that the Board of Regents could act on it before next year's budget hearings. Once the Regents act, the guarantee will become permanent.

For the seventh time in as many years, a Southern Tech professor has conducted a communications seminar attracting national attention. Robert Hays, professor of English at Southern Tech, Marietta, has just returned from leading a two-day seminar on written communications, sponsored by the University of Wisconsin in Madison.

To this seminar, first offered in 1968, have come managers, supervisors, and technical writers. This year's seminar attracted participants from twenty-five companies and government agencies, coming to Madison from eight different states.

Professor Hays has earned national recognition in the field of written communications through his articles and books. He has published three books on communications and more than a hundred articles. He is a past second-place winner of the Williston award for contributions to the literature of engineering technology. He is a well-known consultant to private industry and government agencies.

Hays, a professor at Southern Tech since 1952, is listed in Who's Who in American Education, the Dictionary of International Biography, Who's Who in the South and Southwest, and Outstanding Educators of America. After heading Southern Tech's English Department for more than twenty years, he resigned from administration in 1973 to devote more time to teaching, consulting, and writing.

Hays and his wife live in East Marietta. They have three children attending Cobb County schools. Hays is a member of the Marietta Kiwanis Club.

OPINION

"Murderers. Not Liberators." The attack by the popular front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP) General Command-- in Maalot, is an additional link in a virtual chain of murder and carnage carried out recently both in Israel and abroad.

This most recent act of Barbarism proves once again that the terrorists are not brave soldiers fighting against enemy troops nor are they guerilla commandos engaged in harrassing enemy military units. They are merely gangs of murderers whose victims are defenseless civilians and children.

The activities of these gangs would be impossible without the material and moral support of various Arab governments who are financing the terrorist organizations and providing training and operations facilities on their territories.

Outwardly this support by Arab states is camouflaged by the ambiguous slogan expressing support for "Fulfilling the rights of the Palestinian people". But among themselves the Arab leaders hardly bother to conceal their support for the Terrorist organizations and for these organizations' self-proclaimed aim of destroying an independent Israel and her people. On March 5, 1974 Lebanon's Prime Minister Taki-Adin El Sulh declared "Lebanon is firmly committed to continue cooperation with the Guerilla command". Indeed it is now clear to everyone exactly what are the results of this cooperation and this tight bond between the Lebanese leadership and these murderers.

On February 14, Lebanese Minister Nasri Al Maaluf said that "the Lebanese army will not engage in a policy of force to prevent some fedayeen groups from carrying out actions from Lebanese territory".

The government of Syria is providing financial military and intelligence support to the terrorists - especially to General Command, which claimed credit for the killings at Kiryat Shmone as well as the attack at Maalot. PFLP- general command leader Ahmed Jabril was in Damascus during the Kiryat Shmone attack and met with President Assad soon after. The statements and reactions of Arab spokesmen concerning the murders in Kiryat Shmone praised "The heroic and daring action". And "The heroes that carried out the Kiryat Shmone Exploit". (Official Syrian radio commentator April 12, 1974.).

A commentator for the Palestinian radio program in Cairo declared that in Diryat Shmone the terrorists carried out one of their most glorious and daring actions: "The operation in Kiryat Shmone emphasized the Palestinians' attachment to the land of Palestine" and "has moved the struggle of the Palestinians to a new stage characterized by revolutionary violence against Zionist Barbarism".

Syria's active support of the PFLP-General command and Lebanon's responsibility for permitting the existence of terrorist bases and the launching of terrorist attacks from its territory receive encouragement from the International Community. A resolution in the UN Security Council passed a resolution condemning Israel for her reprisal without even mentioning the mass murder which necessitated it.

The silence of the International Community as well as the surrender to previous terrorist demands by various western governments and the failure of the UN to adopt sanctions against those nations which harbor and support terrorists has only encouraged Arab governments and terrorist organizations to continue their murderous actions.

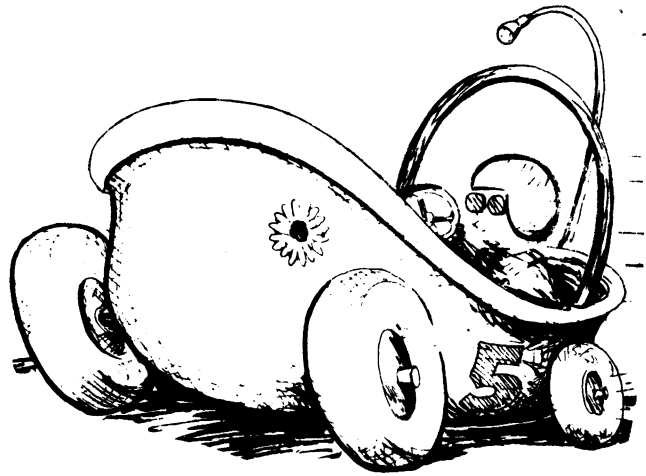

IN MEMORIAM

William J. Glenn, 49, Director of Guidance and Counseling at Southern Tech, died Sunday, May 26, at his home of a heart attack.

Mr. Glenn, a Cobb County resident for 19 years, had been a member of the Southern Tech administration since 1961, when he joined the faculty as a counselor-interviewer. He also handled public relations duties for the college.

Associate Dean H. L. McClure, speaking on behalf of Southern Tech said, "Bill's death represents a void in the counseling staff that will be difficult to fill. In his 13 years on campus, he developed a knowledge of the school and of the counseling needs of the student body. Because of his experience and time in this job, it will be difficult to fill the vacuum in this area caused by his death. His death is a deep personal loss not only to me, but to the administration and faculty as well."

Other comments on the death of Mr. Glenn were voiced by his immediate supervisor, Lewis G. VanGorder, Dean of Student Affairs, and a co-worker in the guidance and counseling area, Mrs. Emerelle Glover. Calling Mr. Glenn a "dedicated individual," Dean VanGorder said, "He had the students interest at heart. He will be sorely missed by all the individuals with whom he associated."

"As someone to work with," said Mrs. Glover, "he was a very fine, gentle person. He will be missed."

Prior to coming to Southern Tech, Mr. Glenn had served as principal of Banberry Elementary School, taught at Marietta High School, and had been a teacher in both the Cobb and Madison County School Systems. Before this, he had worked as a radio news announcer in Thomaston and as a salesman.

Mr. Glenn was born in Athens, Georgia in 1925. He attended Athens High School graduating in 1942. In 1947, he received an A.B. degree in Journalism from the University of Georgia and in 1955, he got his Master of Education in Guidance and Counseling from there. Mr. Glenn also attended Emory University Graduate School in 1959 and 1960.

He was a charter member of the Cobb County Lions Club, past president of the Marietta Lions Club, chairman of the Cobb County Mental Health Commission, and a member of Lambda Chi Alpha Fraternity.

Mr. Glenn is survived by his widow, Lucretia, his sister Mrs. Leon Vassey of Gaffney, S. C. and two brothers, Mr. James C. Glenn and Mr. Thomas Glenn of Athens.

Congratulations to the Bathtub Race Association for a well organized and safe race. Lets hope Southern Tech never goes B.R.A.-less.

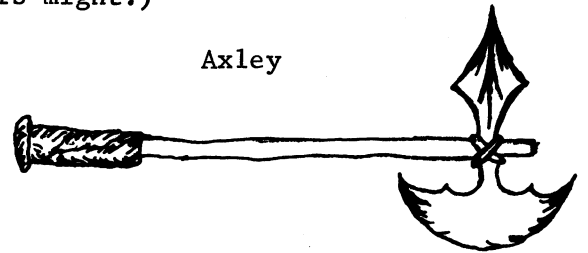

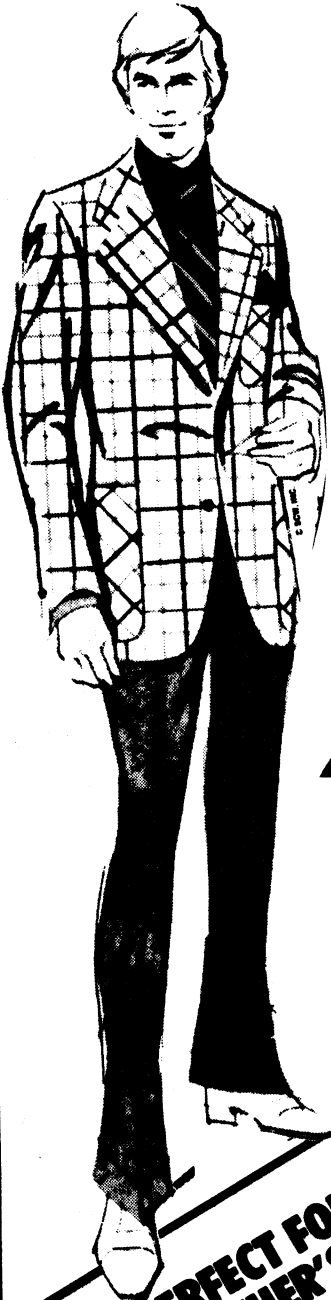

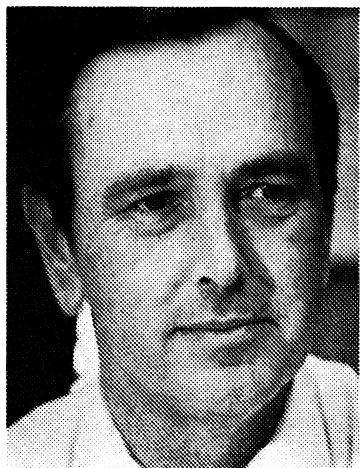
