INASMUCH as the Georgia Society of Professional Engineers is concerned about the lack of acceptance of four-year engineering technology graduates by the profession, and

WHEREAS, the appropriate recognition is not given said graduates to qualify them to take the Engineering-In-Training Examination, and

WHEREAS, there is no membership status offered to the four-year engineering technology graduate in the National Society of Professional Engineers, and

WHEREAS, the four-year engineering technology graduates have proven their qualifications through assignment of tasks in industry and private practice,

NOW THEREFORE, the Georgia Society of Professional Engineers hereby resolves that, upon proper application, all four-year engineering technology graduates be recognized in an appropriate grade of membership in the National Society of Professional Engineers and the respective State Societies, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that appropriate credit for education and experience, be extended to said four-year engineering technology graduates for the purpose of qualifying them for the Engineer-In-Training status, and

BE IT RESOLVED ALSO that said graduates be permitted to take the Engineer-In-Training Examination immediately upon graduation from an ECPD-accredited four-year engineering technology curriculum even though legal recognition of such Engineer-In-Training status is withheld for a reasonable period of time pending the individual's attaining the requisite experience level to qualify for full Engineer-In-Training status as may be determined by the respective State Engineering Registration Boards.

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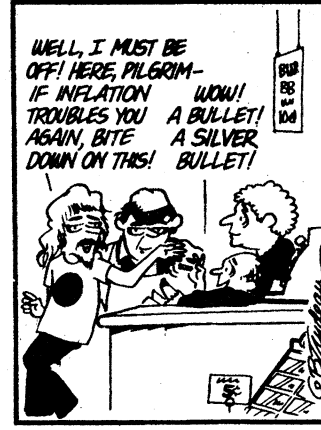
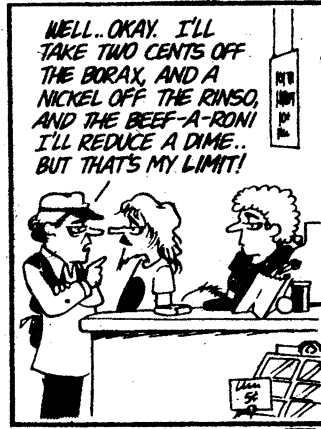
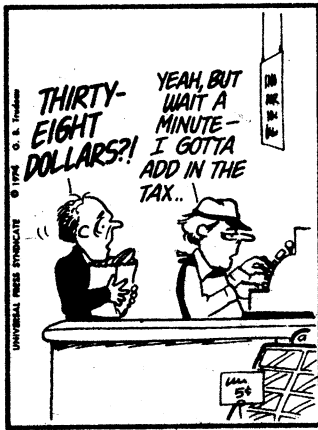
