Please read and be aware of the Scholastic regulation concerning the "W" grade. This grade is defined on page 22 of the 1974-75 Southern Tech catalog and reads as follows:

W - Withdrawn officially on or before the end of the quarter. Official withdrawal must be initiated by the student and may be accomplished by one of the following methods:

- (1) Execution of an "Official Withdrawal" form or
- (2) Written request from the Student received by the Admissions and Registrars Office on or before the end of the eighth calendar week of the quarter.

Courses carrying the "W" grade will not be counted in the students grade point average. The "W" grade will be assigned to a student in a particular course only once except upon the recommendation of both the instructor and the Committee on Standing.

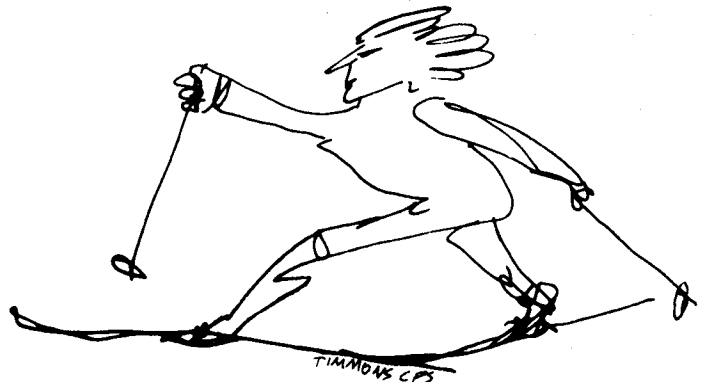

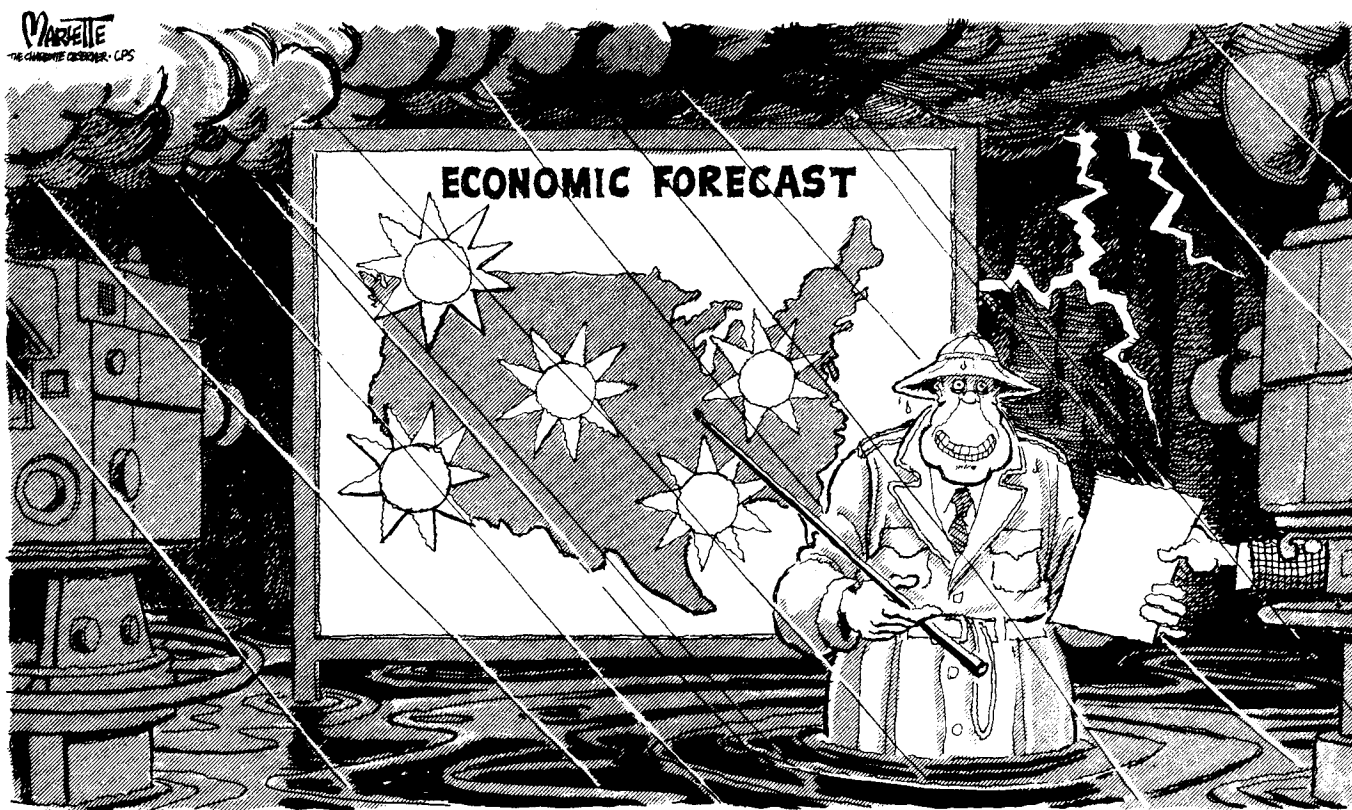
