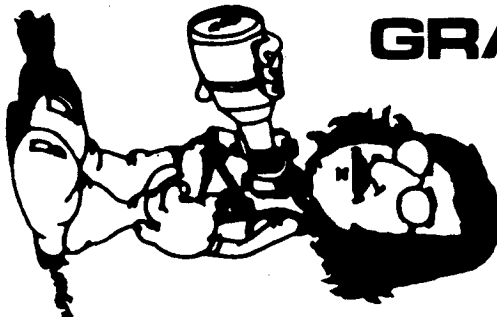
What are you doing these days ?

NOTES on REGISTRATION

PAYMENT OF FEES--Pre-registered students only

During the week immediately following pre-registration each student will receive in their post office box (1) a copy of their pre-registered schedule, and (2) a Cashier's Statement indicating the fees due for the next quarter based on that schedule of classes. After receiving this statement students may pay their fees at their convenience by taking the statement of fees to the Cashier's Window in the Administration Building and paying the appropriate amount of money. These fees may be paid at the Cashier's Window through Friday, March 28th., but Late Fees will be applied on Wednesday, March 26th. Night students may drop their fees with the fee statment in a sealed envelope into the Cashier's Office drop-slot.

All pre-registered students should pay their fees in the above manner and should not report to the gymnasium on Registration Day!

Registration--New, Readmitted & Non-Pre-registered students only, Monday, March 24th. These students should report to the gym, pick up schedule cards, see their course advisor, pull course cards and pay fees in the gym as usual. There are no changes to this procedure at this time except Pre-registered students will not need to participate.

Drop/Add and Audit--All students, begins Tuesday, March 25th. Drop/Add will be the same as during the previous quarter with the completed cards being returned to the Registrar's Office. Pre-registered students should use the Drop/Add procedure to make changes to their pre-registered schedule.

Students who wish to register for a course on the Audit basis should secure an Audit Card from the Registrar's Office, have it signed by the instructor teaching the course and return it to the Registrar's Office by the end of the Drop/Add period in order to be considered official. Changes in the student's Audit status may not be made after that time.

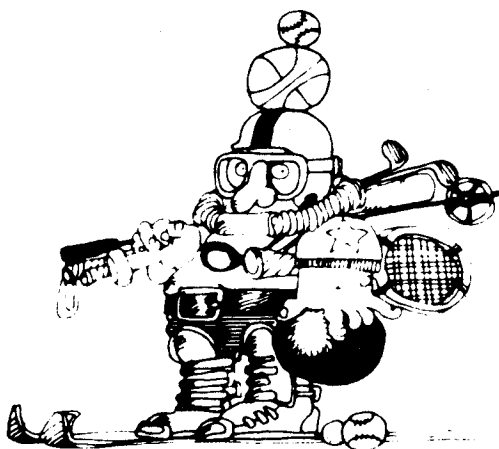

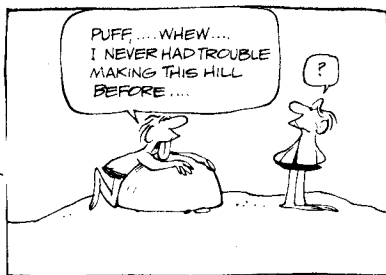

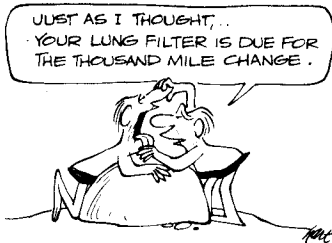
