The Vets Book Club will be operated as a service to the students of Southern Tech. It is a means for students to buy and sell books at reasonable prices.

The hours of operation will be; 10-2 and 5-7 13th - 19th (the week of finals) and 10-2 and 5-7 on the 1st week of school.

A service charge of 50¢ will be charged for selling each book.

The owner will set the price. Retail stores pay 50% of new sell price for used books and then charge 75% of new sell price when they sell it. We recommend approx. 60%-70% on books in good condition.

A student may reclaim a book he has deposited upon presentation of ticket stub.

Do you need an additional source of financial aid?

The Migrant Opportunity Tuition Assistance Program is currently providing grants to over 600 students with funds from the Department of Labor.

**Eligibility:** A student whose family earns over 50% of their income in agricultural employment may receive up to half of his or her financial need as determined by the financial aid office.

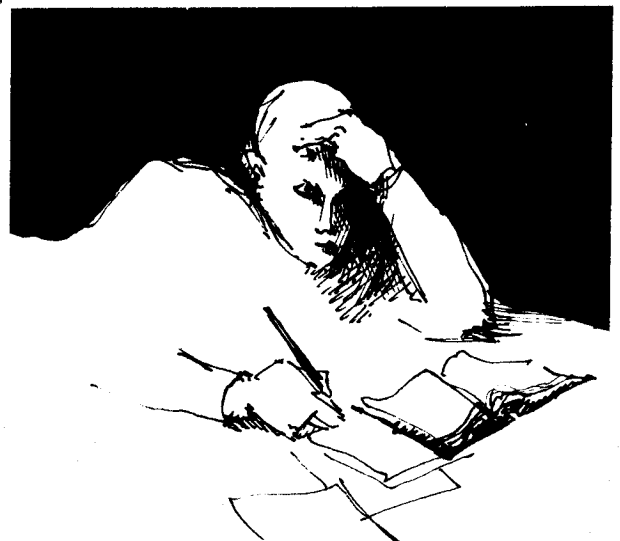

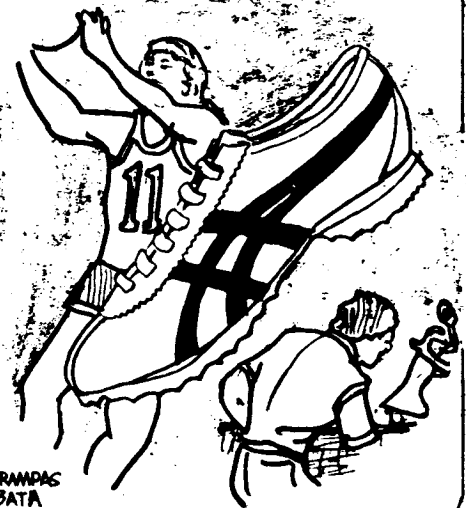
