

THE RACE IS ON...

The world's only motorized bathtub race on land, the 9th Annual Southern Tech Bathtub Race, sponsored by participating McDonald's Restaurants in Cobb and Fulton counties, will be held Saturday, May 10 at 2 pm here at STI.

Favored to get the checkered flag first in the world famous Bathtub Race will be the white, gold and green racing machine of Lambda Chi Alpha fraternity, "Porsche Pusher," No. 76, driven by Tommy Onsrud. Onsrud won the Winter '75 preview Race held on the campus in February with his sleek, chrome-moly racing machine with an engine that can be switched to either side of the tub, depending on which side the curves are.

Defending '74 champion, "Zeke The Teke," sponsored by Tau Kappa Epsilon, is expected to make another strong bid to retain the 1st place trophy for another year. Winner of the '69, '72, '73, and '74 annual Bathtub Races, this solidly constructed tub features a 5-speed transmission and rear wheel drive. However, "Zeke the Teke" failed to finish the Preview Race in the winter because of mechanical difficulty.

Always an interesting attraction for the spectators is the electric tub sponsored by the STI chapter of the Institute of Electronic and Electrical Engineers. The quiet sound of this racing machine is a startling contrast to the

roaring engines of the other racing tubs. It features four batteries mounted on each side of the tub powering a 300 amp. 10 horsepower motor.

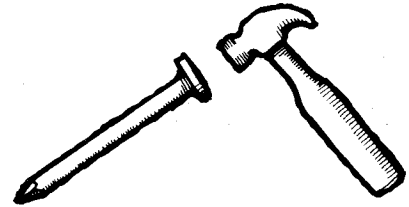
For the first time ever in the annual spring edition of the Southern Tech Bathtub Race, there will be a tub driven by women. STI coed's Vicki Aldred, and Jean Banks will pilot "The Streaker," sponsored by the college chapters of the Society for the Advancement of Management and the American Institute of Industrial Engineers. The black and orange tub, powered by a Tecumseh engine, finished fourth in the Winter '75 Preview Race running a consistent 30 miles an hour while some of the more highpowered machines went down the drain after only a few laps. This tub was voted the "Most Comical" in last year's annual spring race.

The day of the big race, Saturday, May 10, will find the campus with all the color of other major race spots around the world. Refreshment stands, music, programs, celebrities, and track marshalls composed of students and McDonald's employees will line the raceway in colorful uniforms.

At 1:00 pm, Ronald McDonald will lead a parade around the track in the pace car followed by Miss Bathtub Race Queen, Georgi Boone, a 19 year old STI coed.

At 2:00 pm, the pace car will lead the tubs around the track, a signal will be given, the pace car will pull away, and then, if everything is "go," the green flag will be waved to start the 1975 Southern Tech Bathtub Race.

Bathtub Racing made its appearance on the Southern Tech campus about ten years ago when fraternities, using tubs mounted on wheels as a means of carrying beer, spontaneously began a race. Other clubs and fraternities picked up the idea, and bathtub racing as an organized sport began. The original tubs were pierced-together racers with little more than ropes to guide them and powered by the energy of unfortunate pledges. Despite its crude beginnings, the Southern Tech Bathtub Race has now evolved into a major racing attraction that draws national attention.

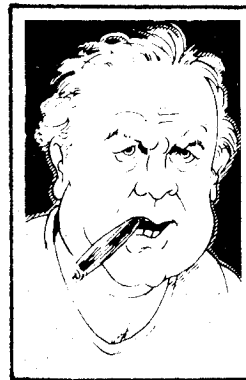

Both started as reporters--but reporters with an all-seeing eye and a perverse view of who we are--what we do--and what we say, with some emphasis on the difference.

Both were (excuse the phrase) "literary men" who weren't accepted as "serious" writers until they were in their forties, who were magnificent on the lecture circuit, and who had an abiding interest in the developing technology of the age. Both saw in technology a possible means to give all men an equal chance to grow, to enlarge his vision and capacity for living, by being freed from the drudgery of debasing, time consuming tasks.

And both, furthermore, used wit and humor as the cutting edge of a tool aimed at reshaping man's view of himself and his civilization.

The proposed elective (Engl. 395) will be a 5 hour course offered MWF at 6. The texts will be paperbacks: Mark Twain's Letters to the Earth; Four Plays by Bernard Shaw; The Autobiography of Mark Twain; and Shaw's fine short story, The Adventure's of the Black Girl in Her Search for God. It will be taught by Prof. A. James Hunkin.

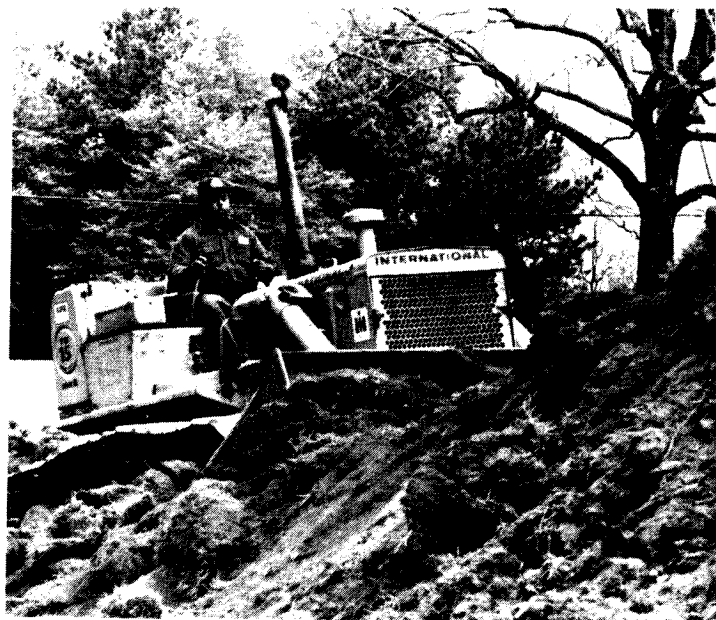

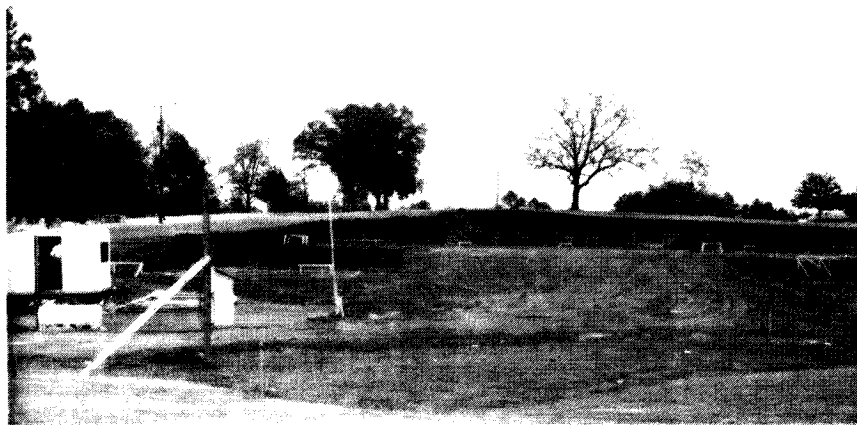

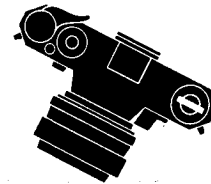
