Southern Tech tracksters finished their season by winning third place recently in the Georgia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference meet at Rome.

Berry took first spot with 156 points, followed by Oglethorpe with 59. The Hornets scored 29 points to take third spot, followed by Georgia Southwestern with 25 and Piedmont who failed to score any points.

Although STI is a member of the South Atlantic Conference, the team is invited to participate each year as an affiliate of the GIAC. The meet brought STI's season record to 8-8.


According to Hornet track coach Clancy Head, all of the Hornet tracksters exceeded their season's best times in the final meet.

"Their performances were certainly something to be proud of, " said Head.

Outstanding in the field events said Head were Johnny Baker (3rd place shotput - 36'7") and Barry Jiske (3rd place discus - 102' 5 3/4"). In running events, the coach pointed to David Poteet, a standout from Sprayberry who ran the 440 yard dash in 50.7 seconds for third spot and the 220 year in 24.2 seconds to capture fourth place. Tommy Nelson, a graduate of North Cobb, finished fifth in both the mile and 3 mile runs with times of 4:41 and 16:47 respectively.

While proud of his team's performance Head admits that "lack of depth" hurt his trackster's performance at the meet.

"Both Berry and Oglethorpe had more depth than us" said Head. "They were able to put three freshmen in each event. Most of our team are freshmen and they need some more experience".



Coach Head and his team are looking forward to next season, and a recruiting campaign has already promised to add several outstanding more tracksters to the STI squad from Cobb, Bartow, DeKalb and Fulton Counties.

Southern Tech wrestling in association with the United States Wrestling Federation will host the Peach State Open, Saturday, May 24 on the STI campus.

According to Hornet head wrestling coach John Martin, over 100 wrestlers representing more than 20 colleges along with leading high school matmen will participate in Cobb's first freestyle tourney. Entries will be limited to current members of the US Wrestling Federation. Entry fee is \$3.00.

"One of the top contenders for both the most outstanding as well for most pins will be Southern Tech's assistant wrestling coach Gary Donatelli" said Martin. This year coach Donatelli placed third in the Southern Open losing only to Tom Hazel of Oklahoma State. He most recently represented the United States in the 220 division against the Mongolian team in Indianapolis.

Other standouts will include Middle Tennessee State's Tommy Smith and former Ga. Tech standout Billy Saville.

According to Martin, newcomers both from the high school and college ranks
