The Southern Tech track team came in second in its first meet of the season, April 1.

The Hornet tracksters racked up 34 points to outdistance Gainesville Junior College who scored 32 points. However, DeKalb Community College (central campus) took the tri-meet with 103 points.

Hornet Mark Stroud, a Marietta High graduate came in 1st in the javelin with 148', while teammate David Poteet of Sprayberry won the 440 yd. dash in 49.9 seconds. In the one mile, GJC's Myron Blackmon edged out Southern Tech's Steve Reece of McEachern in a photo finish. Blackmon's time was 25.6 seconds with Reece a fraction of a second behind him.

According to Hornet track coach Clancy Head, Southern Tech would have done better if they had more depth.

Editor,

Participating McDonald's restaurants sponsored last years Bathtub Race at a cost of \$3000.00. I feel that McDonald's received sufficient glorificaton and publicity for it.

This year the Bathtub Racing Assoc. granted McDonald's the right of first refusal since they had been last year's sponsor. McDonald's failed to relinquish their right as sponsor, therefore it was assumed they would sponsor this year's race.

Five weeks prior to the race, McDon=ald's contacted the Bathtub Racing Assoc. with the information that only \$750.00 could be offered for the Spring Race -- a \$2250.00 cut. The Association, which by now had the majority of the race planned and ready, felt that McDonald's had a moral commitment to the race as it was far too late to get another sponsor. In response of a reminder of the obligation, ALL funds were withdrawn. A further reminder of obligation evoked a telephone call to Dean Carlson. The contents of that telephone conversation is not known to us, yet.

I feel McDonald's is in the wrong. They had an obligation to the Racing Assoc. and should not have backed out at the last minute. Although we have no means of forcing McDonald's to make good their offer, they can certainly be made to regret what they did.

Consider how many times each of us eats at McDonald's each week. The McDonald's on the Four Lane Highway gets a great deal of business from Southern Tech; enough profit, I would imagine, to meet or exceed the \$3000.00 offer. My plan is simple: an old-fashioned boycott of McDonald's; specifically the Four Lane store. Of course to make this the success it can be, we will need to band together and take this seriously. A substantial drop in their business will be suffered if we eat at any of the other local food venders. A certain feeling of guilt will certainly be experienced by McDonald's as business begins to dwindle at the Four Lane store.

I feel McDonald's has wronged each of us by pulling out; and remember, we are

paying for the race now. The student government has voted to appropriate funds so that the race could be saved. I fully support them in this decision as we must fully recognize the importance of the Tub Race to the publicity of our school.

McDonald's has pulled a rather sick trick on us, so remember to "Visit the Colonel," "Eat a Brazier Burger," or get some fish that "Doesn't taste Fishy," but don't eat at McDonald's on the Four Lane until after the Bathtub Race on May 8th. I urge both students and faculty to support me for this period of time. Let's show McDonald's that neither our Bathtub Race nor our patronage should be taken as lightly as they appear to.

Up with the Bathtub Race and to Hell with McDonald's!!!
