REMEMBERING RON WALKER



On October 1, 1993, Kennesaw State lost the most successful basketball coach in its 12-year athletic history. Ron Walker died at his Acworth home, after a 13-month battle with Brain Cancer. The 38-year-old coach leaves behind his wife Karen and his son Corey (8).

Also staying behind are the many people that this remarkable man touched during his six years on the side-line as the Lady Owls' head coach. This tribute comes from some of those people.

Ron Walker arrived on the Kennesaw State campus under difficult circumstances. Due to a late summer (1986) resignation by his predecessor, Walker met his first team only nine days prior to their opening game. Knowing nothing about any of his players or about any of their early opponents, he prepped his

squad as best he could and went on to lead that club to a 19-9 record. That first season perhaps best sums up Ron Walker, his philosophy on life, and his tremendous ability to communicate.

In 1986, he inherited a team that was in shock over losing their coach at the last minute and he faced the task of coaching women's basketball for the first time in his career. With factors like those one might wonder "What have I gotten myself into?" That wasn't the case with Ron Walker.

Quickly, using the superior coaching and people skills that he possessed, he sold his new team on his ability as a coach, won their hearts, and earned their respect. "All we can do is our best, and that's it," was one of his favorite quotes. Another was, "You should not spend time worrying over things that you cannot control." The 1986-87 season was perfect proof of the fact that Walker practiced what he preached. That year, as it was his whole tenure at KSC, he was rarely down or negative with his team. He always trusted the abilities of his players and simply urged them to "do their best, and that's it."

That season, Walker's Team won 19 of the 124 victories that he posted in his six seasons at KSC; however, those wins on the court take a distant "back seat" to the victories he claimed as being a very special individual.

By his peers, he was highly respected, was always someone sought out for advice, and was a **true friend**. To the dozens of players that he loved dearly, he was a counselor, a coach, an advisor, and above all a **true friend**.

The years will continue to roll along, that's one of the few things that are certain "in this life." Another one is, Ron Walker was one of those special people that you meet so rarely "in this life." He will always be missed, he will never be forgotten!

Entering her second season at the helm of the Lady Owls will be Susan Montgomery. Montgomery stepped in last season for the ailing Ron Walker and led the young KSC squad to a 19-11 record, the District Championship and their second consecutive trip to the NAIA National Championship Tournament.

The Marietta native completed her B.S. and M.Ed (1987) at Valdosta State University, she remained in the south Georgia town to head the Valdosta High School squad. Her accomplishments there include guiding a team that had only won three games in the season prior to her arrival to a state playoff appearance in the 1988-89 season. She was named the *Valdosta Daily Times* Area Basketball Coach-of-the-Year in 1989, and in the same year was the VHS' Teacher-of-the-Year in 1989.

Montgomery, who also serves on the faculty of the KSC Health and Physical Education department, has given numerous presentations in the physical education field and on women's collegiate athletics. Besides serving as Director of the KSC Athletic Department's Drug Education program, Susan is the sponsor of the Kennesaw State chapter of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

Susan is single and resides in the Kennesaw area.



RANDALL GOBLE

Assistant Coach

Randall Goble begins his fourth year at KSC and his second season on the staff of the Lady Owls as an assistant coach. Randall also serves as the Athletic

Facilities Manager for the Fighting Owls.

A native of Calhoun where he graduated from Calhoun High School, Randall attended Dalton JC and the University of Georgia, before receiving his B.S. at Berry College.

While at Berry, he was a member of the Viking squad for two seasons. After graduating, he remained a valuable part of the team in the position of assistant coach.

He has instructed at several basketball camps including, Superstars Camp, the Mike Fratello basketball camp and Berry's team camp. He and wife Theresa reside in Holly Springs.

APRIL WILLINGHAM

Graduate Assistant

Joining the Lady Owl coaching staff for the '93-'94 Season is April Willingham. April comes to the staff after completing a four-year career with KSC. During her career, she enjoyed



tremendous success coming off the bench to spark the squad from the point guard position.

The native of Forsyth, Georgia is currently finishing work on a degree in Health and Physical Education and plans to graduate in the spring of 1994. She has been named to the Dean's List each of her five years at KSC and was a member of the athletic department's All-Academic team the past two years.

While prepping at Monore Academy, April was a three-sport letter-winner, playing basketball, softball and running track. Her basketball teams were Region champions for four straight seasons. At KSC, April was also a member of the Lady Owl Cross-Country squad.

April is single and lives in the Marietta area.

1993-94 LADY OWL BASKETBALL OUTLOOK

After taking over the Lady Owls last season, Susan Montgomery led the young team to a 19-11 record and their second District Title. Last season saw KSC make its second consecutive trip to the NAIA's National Tournament. This season, unlike previous years, the Lady Owls will play as an NAIA independent before making the final step into the Peach Belt Athletic Conference next year.

For the Lady Owls to continue the success generated the past three seasons, Montgomery

must rely on a talented group of returnees that sees seven letterwinners including four starters return. To fill the void created by forward Monica Fouch's departure and guard April Willingham's graduation, Montgomery has added four promising newcomers that should help KSC to another exciting season.

Senior Shan-

non Bradley (5-8/13.9 ppg/4.6 rpg) returns for her fourth season at the wing and Tara Soloman (5-9/13.6 ppg/4.0 rpg) returns for her second season on the perimeter to provide the Lady Owls with an effective one-two punch from the outside. Amy Sullivan (Sr/3.8 ppg/3.7 apg) is back for her second season as KSC's point guard. Mandy Smith (2.5 ppg); Vashti Manning (Jr/5-8/1.5 ppg); Keira Irwin (Sr/5-6/Azusa Pacific Univ.); and Dayna Ducham (Jr/5-5/Delta College) should provide Coach Montgomery with excellent depth and scoring power during the season.

At the forward and center positions, a trio of six-footers will fill the positions by committee this season. At the center spot, Kim Watts (Soph/6-0/10.0 ppg/6.8 rpg) returns after being named to the All District Freshman Team a year ago. Also stepping-in for the Lady Owls will be Aridth Gibbons (Jr/6-1/8.2 ppg/4.3 rpg), who earned considerable playing time last season in the sixth man role for Montgomery. Highly-touted freshman Sarah McAllister (6-1/Cannon County HS) could see extended playing time this season and become a dominant force for KSC. Don't be surprised to see Bradley and Solomon drop down low if needed this season, especially Solomon, as the versatile senior played four of the five positions last season.

If the Lady Owls are to make a return trip to the National Tournament, they must survive their traditionally tough slate that includes the likes of rivals Berry, Brewton-Parker and North Georgia. KSC will also face a demanding schedule that includes NAIA national power Montevallo plus NCAA Division II heavyweights Jacksonville State, Valdosta State, USC at Spartanburg and Florida Southern. The Lady Owls also have early season meetings lined up with NCAA Division I's Georgia State and Peach Belt rivals Lander and Georgia College. The squad also hosts the Lady Owls Invitational in December.



SHANNON BRADLEY

Senior...5-7...Guard

Had standout career at Parkview High School...at PHS, she grabbed MVP awards from Gwinnett County, the Georgia North/South All-Star game and participated in the Ga./Tenn. All-Star contest...as a Lady Owl, Shannon has been named to the All-District squad and was Freshman-of-the-Year in 1991...she is listed in 15 career Top Ten categories including points (3rd); field goals made

(6th); 3 pt. field goals made (126—2nd) and steals (171—7th)...Shannon's offensive and defensive leadership abilities will be heavily depended on for the Lady Owls this season...is working on a Sports Management degree...will serve as the squad's captain during the 1993-94 season.

ABOUT THE PEACH BELT ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Peach Belt Athletic Conference began its third full year as an all-sports conference this past fall. In 1991, the conference held championships in men's and women's basketball then expanded to the current level of 11 championships in 1991-92.

The idea for the formation of an NCAA Division II conference was discussed in November, 1988, in Greenville, S.C., with 11 schools represented at the meeting. Five of the colleges at that first meeting, along with two other schools, formed the new conference when USC-Aiken hosted another meeting on Dec. 3, 1989.

The seven charter members were Armstrong State College, Columbus College, Francis Marion College, Georgia College, Lander College, USC Aiken and USC Spartanburg. The name Peach Belt Athletic Conference was adopted in January, 1990. Augusta College applied and was accepted in November, 1990, with the effective date of membership on July 1, 1991.

With the addition of Augusta, the Peach Belt Conference had four members each in Georgia and South Carolina.

Another college joined the Peach Belt Conference on July 1, 1992, when Pembroke (N.C.) State University officially became a member. Kennesaw State College, located in Marietta, Ga., became the tenth full member of the conference on Sept. 1, 1993.

Former Augusta College basketball coach and athletic director Marvin Vanover was named interim commissioner in April, 1990, and served in that capacity until his appointment as the conference's first full-time commissioner in July, 1991. The conference has established an office in Augusta, Ga. which houses the commissioner and his staff. Dr. Frank D. Brown, President of Columbus College, is the PBAC president for 1993-94.

The conference will conduct championships in 11 sports, six for men and five for women. Men's champions will be declared in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer and tennis. Women's champions will include those in basketball, cross country, softball, tennis and volleyball.


