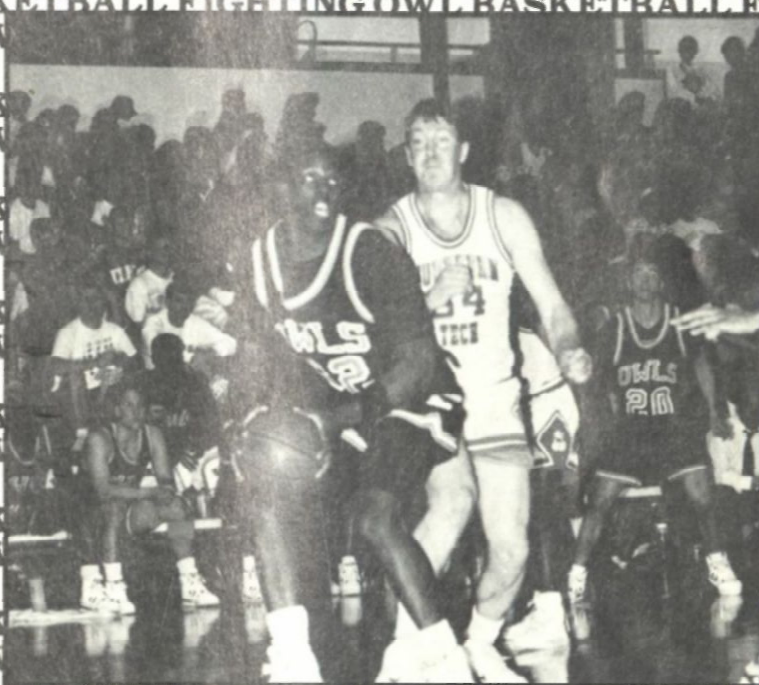

FIGHTING OWL OUTLOOK

In a season full of high expectations, Coach Phil Zenoni led a veteran Fighting Owl squad to a school record 21 victories and a sixth consecutive play-off appearance. Along the way, the squad tallied 20 school records including most points scored in a season (2699).

The 1992-93 season provides a new challenge for the KSC coaching staff as they must prepare the Fighting Owls for the eventual move to the Peach Belt Conference and the NCAA Division II. The Fighting Owls have six lettermen returning plus six new recruits to lead them toward the move.

Junior college transfers Daniel Dunlap (5-9; Wallace State, Ala. CC) and Jeff Wilson (5-11, Gordon JC) will fill the void created by the departure of two time All-District selection Kermit Turner and Pat Abney at the point guard position. Tony Williams (13.4ppg, 5.5rpg), who is listed in virtually all of KSC's career top ten categories including being fourth on the all time scoring list, returns for his fourth season at the shooting guard spot.

Red-shirt freshman Brandon Howell (Parkview High School), along with freshman Jamie Dockweiler (Pope High School) give KSC depth at either guard position and should see plenty of action.

At the small forward position, 6-2 junior Columbus Ballard (11.7ppg, 5.3rpg) returns for his third season with the Fighting Owls. Ballard, who is one of the most versatile athletes on the squad, could also see action at shooting guard. 6-3 senior Jason Hammond returns and should give KSC quality minutes off the bench at either small or power forward.

The power forward and center positions will be manned by committee this season. Senior Todd Reedy (8.5ppg, 4.9rpg) returns at the center position while senior Israel Brown (10.1ppg, 5.8rpg), second on the all-time rebounding list, returns for his fourth year on the Fighting Owl front line. Filling the void created by the graduation of David Gray and Sean Lattimore will be junior Michael Mihalick, who returns to the line-up after a year off due to injury, and red-shirt sophomore Ntumba Ndaye (6-10/Hamm, Belgium). Freshman Scott Durham (6-5/Parkview High School) could see action at either small or power forward.

For the Fighting Owls to continue the excitement generated by the success of the past two seasons they must overcome a grueling 27 game schedule that features perennial district powers Southern Tech, Life, North Georgia and Berry. They must also contest Division II heavyweights Columbus, USC-Aiken, USC-Spartanburg, Augusta and Lincoln Memorial. The Owls travel to battle the high scoring Trojans of Troy State, now in Division-I.

PHIL ZENONI
Head Coach

Coming off a school record 21-10 season and KSC's sixth consecutive playoff appearance, head coach Phil Zenoni returns for his eighth season. The Sandy Springs native has compiled a 107-101 record at KSC. This season brings a new challenge for Zenoni as he leads the Fighting Owls into the NCAA Division II.

Zenoni received his B.S. degree from Auburn University and his M.Ed. degree from Jacksonville State University. He served as a basketball assistant at JSU (1980-81), Birmingham Southern (1981-83), and Rice (1983-84) prior to taking the head job at Gainesville (Ga.) JC during 1984-85.

His Lakers went 18-8 that season, prompting his move to KSC.

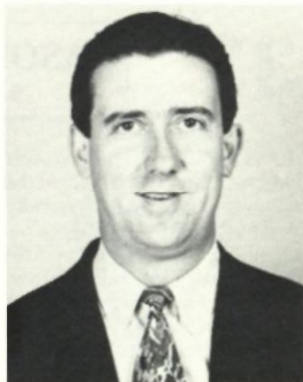
In 1989 Zenoni was named NAIA District 25's Coach of the Year. He earned a similar honor while coaching KSC's golf team to a District title and a 10th place National finish in 1986.

GREG YARLETT
Assistant Coach

Greg Yarlett enters his third season as the Fighting Owls assistant coach. The native of Gainesville, Fla. was a stand-out basketball and baseball player at Bucholz High. He began his collegiate career at Middle Georgia Junior College before transferring to Jacksonville State University, where he lettered in both basketball and baseball.

The veteran coach brings some nine years of collegiate experience with him. After a one season stint at Livingston State (Ala.) in 1982-83, Yarlett served on the coaching staff of Jacksonville State from 1983 through 1987; where he was the assistant coach on the 1985 NCAA Division II National Champion. He then returned to Middle Georgia where he held a similar position until his arrival at KSC.

Yarlett received both his B.S. ('81) and M.Ed. ('84) from JSU.

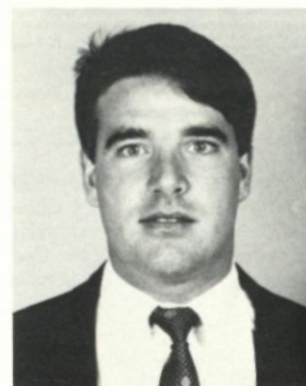
Joining the Fighting Owl coaching staff for the 1992-93 campaign is former University of Georgia center David Dunn. Upon graduation from UGA, Dunn played professionally in Mexico, New Zealand, and Japan between 1987 and 1992.

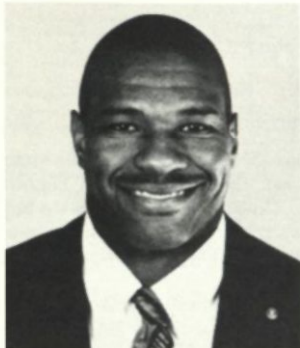
A graduate of Pebblebrook H.S. (Powder Springs, Ga.), Dunn signed a basketball Grant-in-Aid with Georgetown
