Director Johnson's Efforts Rewarded On September 10 After Two Years of Work

The Board of Regents of the University System, in a meeting on September 10, authorized the Southern Technical Institute to award its graduates an Associate in Science Degree in the specialized field in which they do their work at STI.

(Several weeks ago Georgia Tech recommended that STI be allowed

to grant the degree.)

This action comes as a result of the persistent, energetic efforts of Mr. L. V. Johnson, Director of Southern Tech, who for several years has favored offering the Associate Degree and who was an instrumental factor in influencing the American Society for Engineering Education, Georgia Tech officials, and the Board of Regents to approve the move.

ASEE Favors Degree
After a thorough two-year study by the Completion Credentials Committee of the Technical Institute Division of ASEE, of which Johnson was a member, the committee went on record this year in favor of technical institutions being granted the Associate Degree.
