Cheerleaders Rejoin Athletics

Those peppy people shouting at you during half-time will no longer be the family night cheerleaders. For the first time since the seventies Southern Tech is going to have cheerleaders.

They plan on cheering at all the home basketball games, and serve as public relations for the baseball and tennis teams.

They will also have to meet all the same physical and academic requirements of any other athletic team of Southern Tech, to pass the physical and to maintain at least a 2.0.

To be eligible to try-out, if you are not a freshman, then you must have completed at least twenty credit hours of classes. If you are a freshman, you must be in the top half of your high school class. All these rules are obligatory by the NAIA for the squad for sponsoring by the school.

When asked about funding for the squad, Ms. Alberta Cook responded with, "Now that's the sixty-four thousand dollar question." She went on to say that as yet there is no funding for the squad. The cheerleaders will hold fundraisers to obtain funds. Not all the money will come from the cheerleaders though. The athletic department will also provide approximately two-thousand dollars.

Ms. Cook appealed to the students of Southern Tech with, "We'll need all the support we can get."

Escort Service From The Dorms

A safety escort service is under consideration at Southern Tech. The service will be provided for male and female students, as well as faculty. The service is not a new idea. Resident Director John Stevens is the major force behind the plan at this time. He has already set up a volunteer escort service for dorm residents. His vision, however, is to set up a service that will cover the whole campus.

Many students feel that there is definitely a need for such a service. Of the students asked, most felt that although no violent incidents have yet occurred, there is always a potential.

And it would be better not to give disaster the opportunity to strike. Some see the service as being useful in the early morning of fall quarter and, of course, at night all year around. The already existing dorm service is run completely on a volunteer basis. It is hoped that the new service will begin in the same way although there is also speculation that a minor

cash incentive might later be instituted. As with the current service, volunteers would have to be clear of any prior criminal record. Mr. Stevens also expressed a desire to involve other student organizations in the effort.

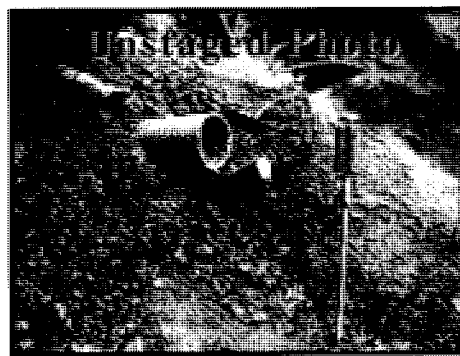

project.

Students Will Have to Pay More Tuition

The board of regents voted unanimously to increase the matriculation and tuition fees for Georgia's four year colleges and Universities.

Effective this summer quarter, Southern Tech's matriculation fee will be raised 5%, increasing the total enrollment cost for a full time, Georgia resident student from \$563 to \$587.

Nonresident enrollment cost will increase from \$1,511 to \$1,657 per quarter; an almost 10% increase. "Currently, nonresident students pay only 75% of the tuition costs," says Board of Regents Chancellor, Dr. Stephen Portch. "Over the next four years, nonresident tuition will be raised until they pay 100% of their education costs," explained the Chancellor.

Nonresident tuition will tentatively increase \$75 summer 1996 and again in 1997 by \$50.

Four-year college, in-state students currently absorb approximately 30% of their

education cost. Georgia residents are not obligated to pay tuition, only matriculation fees. The increased revenues will stay at Southern Tech and might be used for staff merit salary increases and equipment upgrades. "Southern Tech is a capital intensive school with \$500,000 to \$1,000,000 budgeted for computer upgrades and new equipment annually," said Daniel Youngblood, Comptroller of the Business

office.

A study of other colleges and universities across the nation showed that Georgia college fees are below the national average. "Only Georgia's Junior Colleges had tuition higher than national average tuition," said Chancellor Portch.

For this reason, the Board of Regents reduced Junior College matriculation fees by 5% and raised Senior Col-

lege and University fees by 5%. There are 15 Junior Colleges, 13 Senior Colleges and 4 Universities in the Regional system.

Matriculation fees were increased last year by 4.5% which is about the average annual increase.

Students at Southern Tech are also required to pay a quarterly Activity Fee, Athletic Fee and Health Fee totaling \$89.

Fraternity Row Now a Possibility

For over ten years dreams, plans and wisps of hope have been blowing around in the air of Southern Tech about a Fraternity Row.

Recently, some of the plans have been coming very close to being a reality. A parcel of Southern Tech land has been set aside for fraternity and sorority use. Preliminary surveys have been completed.

The particular parcel for this use is located across the new bridge by the Dobbins exit from campus. The latest survey results indicated two good lots could be carved out of the land.

Director of Student Affairs, Barry Birkhead, asked for another survey to determine if three good lots could be made from the land that is available. The surveyor was hopeful. Right now, Mr. Birkhead is waiting for the results of this survey.

An advantage for the fraternities and sororities building on campus would be the free land. Land in Cobb county is valuable. The land would be leased from the Board of Regents to the organizations for a negligible amount, for a long term period of time, such as 25 to 50 years. Also this land is property tax free, since it is state

land. Another advantage would be the proximity to classes.

A Greek organization seeking to build a house needs considerable resources.

It is a problem to find a bank willing to make loans to an organization when the members paying for it are different people every four or so years.

Fund raising and Alumni contributions, while helpful, take a long time to generate the thousands of dollars needed for a project of this size.

This is why many of the fraternities and sororities are not ready to undertake this project at this time.

Scott Gear, president of Pi Kappa Phi, stated that they are not in-

terested at this time because the financial resources required.

They are also concerned about the size of the house that they could build on this land.

Vice-President Smith feels that the houses could house 6-8 brothers or sisters at a time, and would be more of a meeting house and hangout.

Will Students be Co-opted by Semesters?

As most students are already aware, Southern Tech may possibly be changing its annual schedule from the quarter system to the semester system.

This change will have widespread effects all across the campus,

but how will this change affect co-op students? Approximately eight percent of Southern Tech's students participate in the co-op program.

Many companies that participate in the co-op program with Southern Tech deal with students from both quarter and semester system schools. Representatives of these companies, such as IBM, and Gulf Stream Aerospace, felt that our change from quarters to semesters will have little or no effect. Their current methods of recruiting students place much more emphasis on the specific skills of students than on time requirements.

Susan Kent, an employment officer at the South-

ern Company, said that changing to semesters would actually expand their ability to hire students.

For other companies, like Atlanta Gas, that employ only students from schools on the quarter system, more adjustments will have to be made. Dave Hirschler, of Automated Logic, said that the switch shouldn't be too hard for companies, though. He said that it will actually be better for students and companies alike because students will have more time to be trained.

How do students currently participating in the co-op program view the change? Some feel that it will have no effect on co-op students. Others, like Brent Helm, a CET major, expressed that it might be difficult to return to the academic state of mind after such a long period.

He also felt that problems might arise for seniors who are seeking to fulfill certain class requirements. The chances would be increased that the class a student might need would only

be offered during the semester that he must co-op.

The co-op students who will be most affected by the change, however, will be those who are right in the middle of their program when the changeover occurs.

The co-op system is presently arranged so that a student can meet the school's requirement for a full year of work experience over a two-year period. The student alternates between a quarter of work and a quarter of study. This allows for the year to be broken up evenly and a smooth transition between work and school.

The Director of Career Services, Regina Doyle, expressed that the demand for a format that corresponds with the semester system is so new that she and her staff have been unable to even review the issue yet. She said that the first step would be to consult with other schools that have co-op programs but that are already on the semester program.

The biggest problem, she felt, would be determining

how to deal with the summer quarter. Should it be one regular-length semester, or should it be divided into two shorter mini-semesters?

Also, should the requirement of four work periods be shortened to three to accommodate the increased length of semesters?

Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York has divided their semesters into two four-month semesters for spring and fall.

Their summer semester, however, is divided into two short sessions. The co-op students there usually work during the Spring and Summer semesters consecutively and go to school in the fall.

The engineering department of Cornell University in Ithica, NY, has its students take their first semester of junior classes during the summer of their sophomore year.

They then co-op during the fall semester, attend school for spring semester, and complete their co-op program the following summer.

Athletic Department Is a Waste of Money

Another year of Hornets sports begins Friday, November 4 at 7:30 pm. While I wish them good luck, I also think it's time to give serious consideration to abolishing the Athletic department.

A varsity Athletic program serves two basic functions: (1) public relations for the school, (2) entertainment for the students. Our Athletic department fails miserably on both accounts. By reallocating these resources, both goals could be more ably met.

How can sports provide any public relations benefit for Southern Tech if they don't even publicize themselves? Personally, I was here three quarters before I knew we had varsity sports. While the sign facing South Marietta Parkway is occasionally utilized, and the Athletic department places a sign in front of the gym, that is about it. No one shows up to watch the teams and the attitude from the Athletic department seems to be that it's the responsibility of the students to show up. This point was driven home in a meeting last December when Athletic Director George Perides met with members of campus organizations. While feeding these people pizza, Coach Perides went on about how not many students showed up for basketball games. His reason for calling the meeting was to find out what we as students were going to do to get more students to attend. Not how we could help him, but how we were responsible. When asked what he had done, as far as publicity, Coach Perides candidly replied that he hadn't done much in the last couple years. At least he gets a couple of points for honesty on that one.

All of last year a Committee on Intercollegiate Athletics met to determine what the role of Intercollegiate Athletics should be at Southern Tech. One of the issues covered was the recognition that this had become a "commuter" college and ways needed to be found to involve more students in athletics. In looking at ways to increase a sense of community on campus, the committee targeted the possible addition of female sports, cheerleaders, a pep band and recommended that the coaches and the AD work

more closely with student organizations. All good ideas, and none that should require an actually interested Athletic Director to wait for word from President Cheshier.

If no one goes to the games and the Athletic Department doesn't seem too interested in that fact, lets do away with it. Would any of you actually have declined attending Southern Tech if there were no varsity sports (excluding scholarship athletes)?

If one of the goals is to get more students involved in athletics, we've just freed up a big pile of money to do that. Currently we have a new athletic building planned that will not fit the constraints of the budget. Planned racquetball courts may be half-constructed (finished when we find the money) and the planned pool may be completely cut out.

If these, and other cuts, take place all we have is a second gym. Plus, it still hasn't been determined how to pay for the operating costs once it's done. Transferring over the current Athletic budget, nothing gets cut, we renovate the old building, and operating costs are covered. As a bonus, with two gyms, a pool, and brand new fields, Recreational Sports can be even bigger; they already involve more students than the varsity program.

This is my favorite part: the Recreational Sports budget comes out of Student Activities. If we put it under the now defunct Athletics budget, we've cleared up almost \$60,000 that can be applied to the professional organizations that compete regionally and nationally. No longer having to beg for money, Southern Tech can concentrate on design and implementation. We have the talent to compete with anyone and by killing the Athletic department, we've created the budget to compete with anyone.

There it is: dropping varsity sports creates more opportunities for students to get involved athletically and frees up money to properly fund organizations in competition.

So I ask you what could be better publicity for the Southern College of Technology than winning all the competitions in our future job fields?

Southern Tech should focus its resources on its strengths. The breadth of technical expertise among Southern Tech's students is incredible. The civil engineers came in third overall in a regional competition against huge schools like U. of Miami and U. of Alabama. Georgia Tech didn't even place in the top five. The steel bridge team is going to nationals for the fourth time, and has been seen on CNN and network TV. This is what will build Southern Tech's image.

The Civil department is not the only one doing great things. There are many sophisticated projects going on at this school. They are successful because of talented, dedicated students. Mechanical Engineering students are building a Formula car from scratch. They are also designing a radio controlled plane. Electrical Engineering students built one of the most sophisticated robots at the IEEE slamfest competition. Other Electrical students are building a self-navigating helicopter. These projects deserve our verbal and monetary support. They demonstrate that Southern Tech students not only know what to do; they are doers.

The administration should actively encourage and support the professional organizations like SME, ASCE, IEEE and ACM because they represent what this school is all about. Every department should sponsor highly visible annual competitions or fairs to show off, to the rest of the school, what their students can do. Each department should have a budget dedicated to supporting teams and special projects. Professors should mentor these groups and encourage students to participate.

Southern Tech has a unique student body. Most of the

students are not 18 year old high school graduates learning to cope with being independent and responsible or whatever. Southern Tech students are mostly older people who have experience and practical skills that they can contribute to the school. We need to capitalize on these skills by encouraging everyone to share their talents. Active professional organizations where projects and competitions are encouraged is an excellent way to integrate classroom knowledge with practical skills.

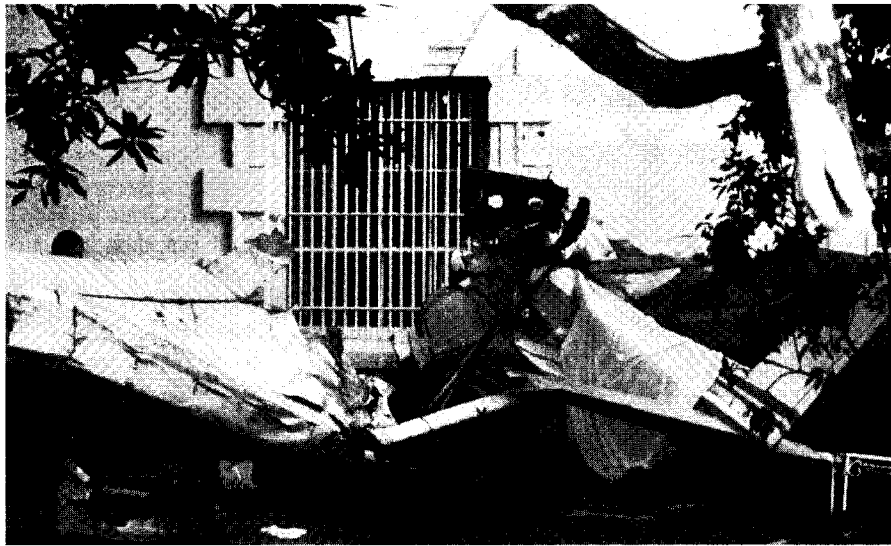
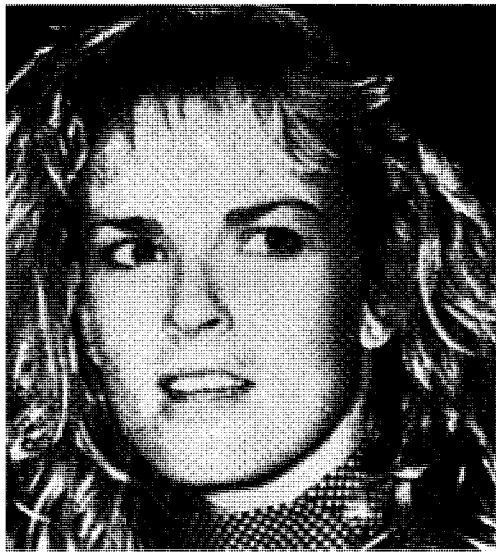
There should be a deliberate, conscious effort to make Southern Tech a dynamic team-project school. Right now, virtually everything that is done, is done because an individual professor or student took the initiative to organize the project. It needs to be bigger than that. The momentum behind these efforts shouldn't rely on the dedication of an individual. 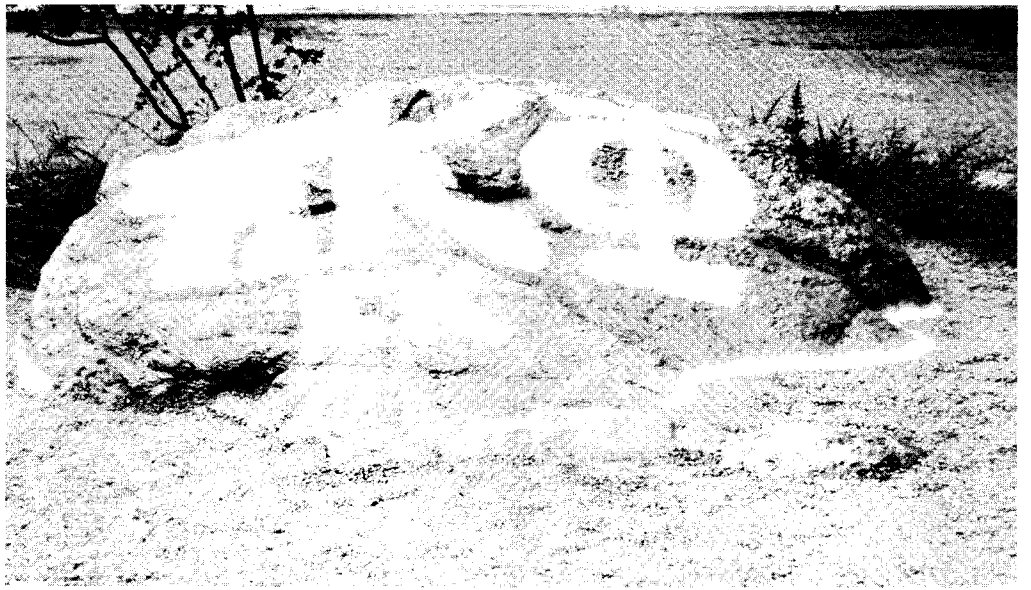
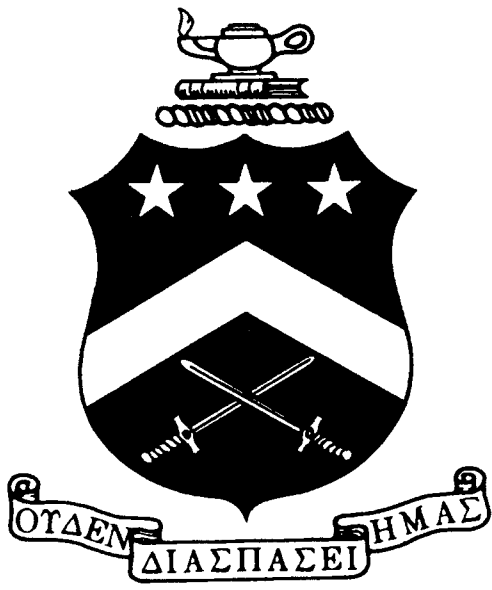


Creed of Lambda Chi Alpha

Just like the Rock, Sigma Pi's face are different, but their goal is the same - "United In Brotherhood."





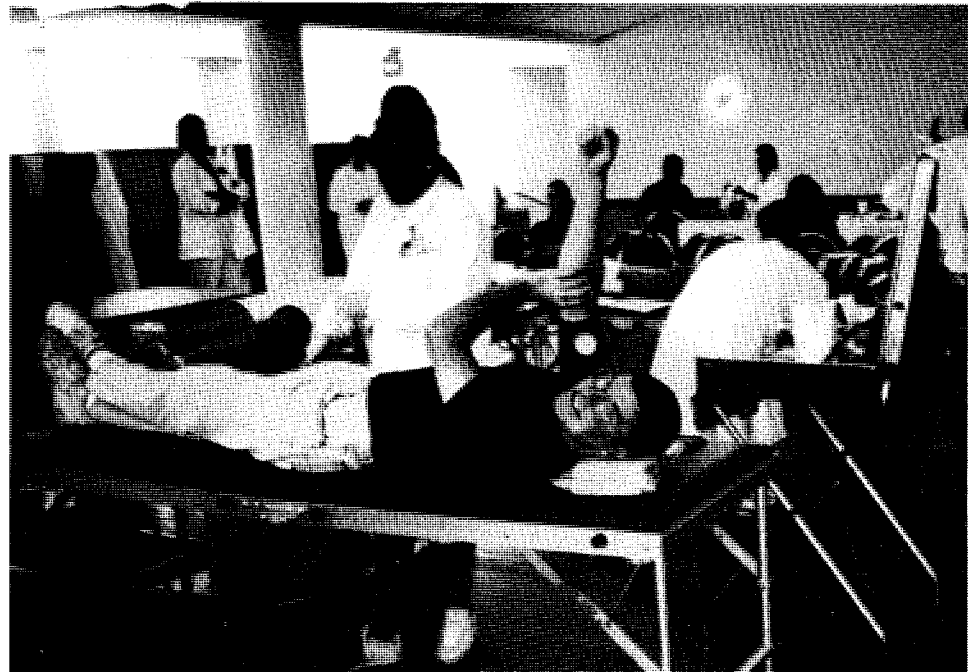

In 1957, the NSPE Board adopted a program of support for Student Chapters. Today, the National Society of Professional Engineers has a membership of approximately 75,000 engineers, 10,000 of whom are engineering students from 160 student chapters across the nation.

The purpose of the NSPE Student Program is to provide for student professional development and to promote among students a sound understanding of engineering professionalism. As future engineers of Southern College of Technology, it is essential that students recognize the meaning of "professional engineer," that these words stand for more than technical skill, that they encompass integrity, responsibility, ethical conduct, a sense of purpose, spirit, indebtedness to the past, and a desire to contribute to the continued strengthening of the profession.

PURPOSE/ We, the Minority Architects and Planners of this Nation, in order to bring the insights and concerns of architecture to the greatest number of people in the communities in which we live and in confrontation with today's world, do establish this organization on the common bonds of professional interest and personal concern which unites us all. Careful thought, good design and fresh ideas, multiplied by the strength of numbers and reinforced by the minority experience in this country, can and will contribute to the solution of the problems confronting our environment. Our concern is that this contribution not be restricted by past and current barriers to equal participation in the mainstream of National Life.

3/To act as a clearing house for information on and for minority architects and maintain rosters for practitioners, and minority engineering, planning and contracting firms;
