"Our company, the Bell Aircraft
Corporation, was asked by the
United States Army Air Corp to
produce Beeing bombers of a new
type," O'Connor asserted in a

The bornber is called the B-29 and has not yet been put into production. Tests of this new plane, which has the longest range of any bombers now flying, will be completed in August. It will have four motors and crews of eight.

Foresight Praised.

The aircraft official praised the foresightedness of Cobb countians in building their new airport, which will be donated to the bomber plant by the county. The county has options on all land needed by the company for its

To Open Office.

"It appears there are about 10,000 workers in this area who are now available for jobs in this plant," said O'Connor, adding he hopes that virtually all the labor will come from this section. In Buffalo, he said, his company is advertising in more than 200

newspapers for workers.

A personnel office is to be set up in Atlanta soon, probably next month, and persons hired to help make the bombers will be spe-

O'Connor said his company will gladly allow the Naval Reserve to use the airport for the next eight months, and he was scheduled to talk with Commander Harrigan to attempt to work out a solution.
The attorney pointed out that

nothing official has come from the Navy to himself or to the Cobb county officials which bars the deal negotiated yesterday. "We are ready to go on and are going on," he exclaimed. "We have been authorized by the Army Air Corps to proceed."

Only Suitable Site.

If machinery and equipment and labor can be procured according to schedule, O'Connor said the bomber plant will be in maximum production, employing 40,000, by March of 1943. He said one of the reasons he chose Atlanta was the availability of labor.
