


To All New Students,

THE STI BATHTUB RACE



ATTENTION VETERANS

Due to recent changes in VA regulations, there may be a short delay in September and checks (i.e. those checks due Oct. 1, 1977) for some veterans.

Those veterans who may be affected are:

- 1. new students
- returning students who have had a break in training of more than one calendar month
- students who will have a change in pay status effective September 20, 1977.

Anyone having questions should come by the Veterans Affairs office located in the administration building or call 424-7251.

If you have a lifetime Georgia Driver's License, it must be renewed every four years.

Beginning in 1977, all Vets who do not renew their license will have their records removed from the files and destroyed.

If you are caught with an expired license, you will be fined. However, no penalty will be charged if you go for a re-examination (eyes, photo).

The renewal date is your birthday month, but you can go any time 90 days prior to your birthday.

Check the re-exam date to be sure you are not driving on an expired license. IT'S FREE!
