SKOT'S NEWS

Theoretical considerations show that when a star, having expended most of its nuclear energy, collapses under its own gravitational forces through the white dwarf stage to become a neutron star, the collapse may proceed further: gravity near the immensely dense central mass becomes so great that no light, matter or signal of any kind can escape from its immediate vicinity, which is called a BLACK HOLE. It is correspondingly difficult to design experiments to verify the existence of black holes. One solar mass would yield a black hole 7 km in diameter; its boundary is called the absolute event horizon. If normal physical laws hold for the centre, matter there reaches infinite density and is effectively 'crushed out of existence'.
