## SMITH ACTING DEAN OF STUDENTS: FLORIAN RESIGNS

Placement and Co-op Director, Paul Smith, will not be a summer time only Dean of Students, according to Dr. Walter O. Carlson, Dean and Executive Director of Southern Tech.

In a speech before the Student Government Association, Dr. Carlson said that Mr. Smith will be acting Dean of Students until a permanent one is found. Mr. Smith was chosen for this position by Dr. Carlson because of his qualifications and because of the immediate need for filling the office, according to Dr. Carlson. Mr. Smith has a Master's in P. E. and was acting Dean of Students at another institution before coming to Southern Tech.

Carlson told the S.G.A. that in the Dean of Students office there will be two assistants, the Assistant to the Dean of Students for Housing and the Assistant to the Dean of Students for Extra-curricular Activities. Charles Lumsden is the Assistant to the Dean of Students for Housing and baseball coach; however the Assistant to the Dean of Students for Extra-curricular Activities, Fran Florian, resigned this week for personal reasons, according to Dr. Carlson in an interview with the editors of the STING. However, in a memo to faculty and staff dated July 1, Dr. Carlson announced Florian's resignation stating that Florian "feels that for his career objectives that a change is appropriate in view of the changes which are being made in the requirements for the position which he occupies."

It is expected to take between nine to twelve months to find the permanent Dean of Students. We hope it doesn't take this long to find a new basketball coach with basketball practice usually starting in the fall.

Dr. Carlson said that the advertisements for the job of the Dean of Students will be sent out nationally and there should be a great number of applicants. He told the editors of The STING that a screening committee chaired by Dean McClure, composed of half students and half administration-faculty will review the candidates and submit it to the Board of Regents.

Dr. Carlson told the S.G.A. that the minimum qualifications for the position of Dean of Students are:  
1.) Master's degree in appropriate area  
2.) Administrative experience  
3.) Three years experience in the Dean of Students office as assistant to the Dean of Students or as Dean of Students.

Does this eliminate all applicants from Southern Tech?

## PLEA FROM S. G. A. PRESIDENT

"It took 13 years to get the Southern Tech sign and now it's been stolen," said S. G. A. president Scott Dobslaw, commenting on the recent disappearance of the Southern Tech sign at the top of the Marietta Parkway exit ramp.

"I'm really disappointed," said Dobslaw. "However, if the parties responsible will return the sign to me or the STING editor John Reed, no questions will be asked nor any punishment meted out." The whole incident will be forgotten, according to Dobslaw.

In his appeal to the persons responsible for taking the sign, Dobslaw pointed out that it took a visit to Southern Tech by Governor Jimmy Carter in 1973 and a plea to him by then S. G. A. president Jeff Tucker to get freeway signs for the college.

"Please, return the S.T.I. sign to me or John Reed and no questions will be asked," promised Dobslaw.

The Library will not be open on Saturday during the summer quarter. It will be open on Sunday from 2:00 until 6:00 p.m. This is our customary summer schedule.

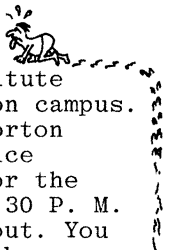
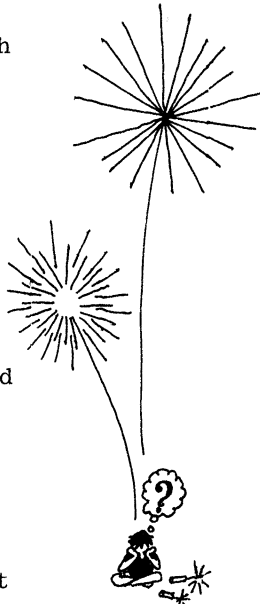
## PLACEMENT AND CO-OP NEWS

Due to a summer slowdown, we do not offer a full breakfast. Donuts, coffee, orange juice and fruit are available, however.

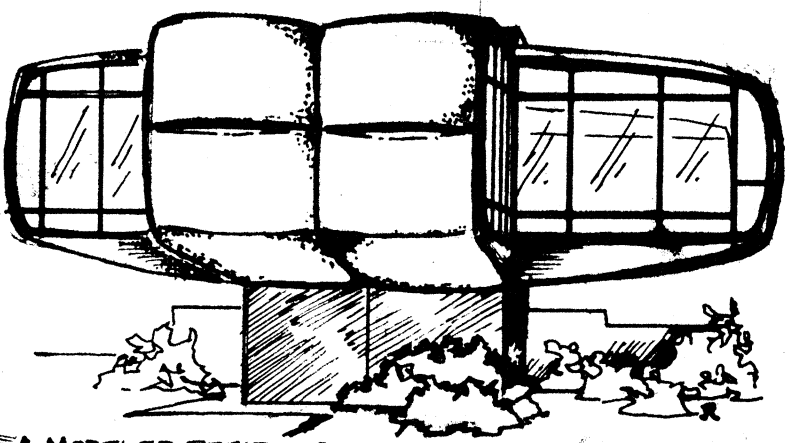
