**CALCULATOR LANGUAGE**

Although calculators are not toys, they can be used for fun. Most of us know of several games that can be played using calculators, but for the benefit of our new students and others who have not been exposed, try this.

Example:

If 142 Asian countries fought 154 European nations in 69 districts for 5 years who would emerge the winner? To answer this question punch the numbers into the calculator:  
142 154 69 X 5 =

The answer is revealed by reading the display upside down.

Here is some more fun with your calculator: By punching numbers into the calculator we can develop our calculator vocabulary. For example: when 7714 is inserted, the display reads (upside down) HILL.

The conversion code is as follows:

- 0 = O      4 = H
- 1 = I      5 = S
- 2 = E      7 = L

Sorry, but these are the only numbers or letters that can be used in the vocabulary. The combination of letters can be used to form over 1000 word combinations. Here are about 40 words to get you started.
