Here we go again!

I would like to welcome all new and returning students to STI. The upcoming year should prove to be most exciting.

The Student Government Association (SGA) has been working diligently all summer in making preparations for the year.

There have been other changes on campus including a new athletic director and head basketball coach, George Perides, and Student Center Director, Don Nelson. We are looking forward to the opening of the Student Center in November as well as improvements in the intercollegiate and intramural athletic programs.

The biggest change, however, will be the new Dean of Students. This position is now filled by a temporary person and we're looking forward to having the students play a major role in selecting the person for this critical position. The selection process will begin this quarter and the students will have an opportunity for input in filling this extremely important position. Further information will be forthcoming on this subject.

The SGA allocates the monies collected from the Student Activity Fees over the fiscal year. This totals approximately \$90,000. Presently, this money finances the Student Center, LOG, STING, SGA, intramurals, social and entertainment events.

The SGA has been a viable voice of the students in the past and will continue to do so in the future.

The SGA will have its first meeting this Wednesday. The meetings are held in the Library Seminar Room every Wednesday at 5 p.m. The first meeting will be a review of business conducted during the summer, and we will discuss plans for the year.

Before getting fully under way, however, the following positions will be filled.

The S.G.A. is now taking petitions for the office of Secretary and Treasurer.

The Secretary and Treasurer must be a rising sophomore, junior or senior member of the student body. The secretary records, preserves all minutes, by-laws, charters, bills, resolutions and rolls of attendance of the S.G.A. The pay is \$100.00 per quarter.

Both the Secretary and Treasurer are elected by the Student Council.

During the past S.G.A. general elections not all positions were filled. These open positions are filled by appointment by the advice and consent of the Student Council. The following positions are open:

1. Two part-time Representatives (12 hrs. or less)
2. Fall-Spring Co-op
3. Senior Class Representative
4. The following departments do not have representatives, AET, CET, MET, FST, AMET, AND TET. Department Representatives must be either

juniors or seniors.

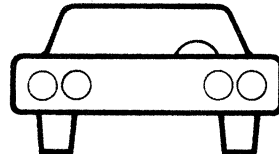
The Judicial Cabinet, which is elected by the Student Council, is taking petitions for 11 Justices. The Judicial Cabinet handles all appeals of campus traffic violations, has the power to interpret the SGA constitution, and oversees other actions of the Student Council. This cabinet also hears cases referred to it by the Dean of Students. The vice-president of the student body is also in need of a parliamentarian. This person needs to be familiar with Roberts Rules of Order.

Election of the 2 Freshmen class representatives and the Fall-Spring Co-op representative will be held the early part of Fall Quarter. Petitions for these positions may be secured at the SGA office located off the Library Lobby. The deadline for petitions is September 28 at 12 Noon. If you have filled out a petition during summer quarter, your petition is already on file.

Make a point to stop by the SGA offices and get involved in what's happening on campus.
