FOOD SERVICE NEWS




As many of you know, the food service has had difficulty over the past several years in keeping their operation "in the black." Because state funds cannot be used to support the food service, it <u>must</u> support itself.

This year the food service is not only operating at a loss, but it is losing at a faster rate as the year progresses. For this reason, we have no choice but to make some hard decisions. After several weeks of discussion and deliberation, we have decided on the following changes, beginning with the Spring Quarter:

- a) All food will be offered a la carte (no meal plan).
- b) The selection will be more restricted. For example, we will offer only a continental breakfast and reduce the number of entrees at other meals.
- c) Because of the a la carte operation, beverages will be sold and controlled as they are at most restaurants.
- d) The snack bar will be moved to the Student Center and will be strictly a short order operation.

The hours of operation also will change somewhat, as follows: Breakfast 7:30 a.m.-9:00 a.m.
Lunch 11:00 a.m.-1:30 p.m.
Dinner 4:30 p.m.-6:00 p.m.
Snack Bar 7:30 a.m.-7:30 p.m.

All food service will operate Monday through Friday. These changes are for the Spring Quarter only. A permanent plan for operation next fiscal year will be presented some time during the Spring Quarter.
