AMBULANCES OF MERCY

The National Ambulance Service is located in downtown Kennesaw. Pat and Mary Ellen Atkins opened this service in February 1977 after several of Kennesaws' citizens convinced them that they could offer the community a badly needed service. The last company serving our community left when the funeral home closed, leaving our community without emergency ambulance transportation.

Mary Ellen and Tommy Atkins, Pat's younger brother, manage the company full time, along with three other professionally trained attendants. This allows Pat to continue his career with the State of Georgia, where he instructs emergency services in a vocational program. Pat travels to fourteen vocational schools in North Georgia teaching students how to become professional medical technicians. In his spare time he works diligently with his family members as they maintain a very busy 24 hour schedule.

Quoting Mr. Atkins, "Our job is to make our services available as quickly as possible. When we arrive on the scene, we are thoroughly trained to administer whatever aid necessary to preserve life and move the patient directly to the nearest medical facility. Our four ambulances are staffed and equipped with the best and we maintain a 24 hour vigilance to serve the people".

If they don't show a profit in a reasonable time, Private Ambulance Services are forced to move their offices to another area. This is alarming and all the residents of our area should be aware that, if National should be forced to move to another location for better business, we would be without help for emergencies.

If the County commission received the available funding from the state as other counties in Georgia have, we could set up a

professional team of para-medics stationed at the proper fire stations throughout north Cobb County. One elite team in Acworth and another team in Kennesaw. Their job would be to receive all calls of emergency and speed quickly to the scene to administer aid. The private company monitoring the call would then proceed simultaneously to the scene to receive the patient and then transport to the nearest medical facility. This would relieve the para-medic team and allow them to take other emergency calls. This unit would function very much like the T.V. team on "Emergency One". According to Mr. Atkins, this would greatly increase the effectiveness of emergency services through proper coordination and always guarantee the injured and sick immediate help.

This problem of proper emergency aid and transportation has been a controversial issue for years and the county commission has failed to take advantage of the state's good offerings. "If all we had to maintain was the equipment and reasonable medical personnel on board our units, then we could cut our expenses as much as 50% and we could afford to stay in business. As it stands now, if you are a small company without any influence, it's very hard to operate.

As we closed our interview with Mr. Atkins we were impressed with his concern for his community and for it's future and we can't help but think there are sound and valid issues raised that need attention.

We published this article featuring a business as usual, but felt there were underlying issues that effect our community. We sincerely wish all the folks at National Ambulance Service the best of luck and remember, for excellent medical transportation, call the folks at National, 427-3131. Thank you.



GAZETTE EDITORIAL

Which Way is Up?

The early pioneers of Cobb County arrived in the latter part of 1832. They came from everywhere. The Carolinas, Virginia, Wales, Scotland, and of course England.

The people arriving in those days had been lured to this newly created County for various reasons. The gold fever was just beginning and the fertile valley lining the Chattahoochee River offered the finest corn and cotton farming to be found anywhere. The upper part of the County was still considered unknown by the "White-Man" and the Cherokee Indians continued to resist the onslaught of their pioneering through 1838. Forty acres was alloted through the raffel system if gold was suspected, and 160 acres were alloted, also through the raffel, for homesteading and farming.

Quoting Sarah Temple's marvelous book on Cobb County history, "The First Hundred Years", available at all county libraries, "We do not know how rapidly these pioneer settlers came into the County, although by the spring of 1834 the representative population of the County was 1,576 and by the summer 1,891. Certainly there were enough of them early in 1833 to set about the political organization of the County.

The first elections were held on the first Monday in March, 1833, and while it seems to have had none of those distinguishing characteristics for which Cobb's fiery interest in politics has caused it to be noted throughout the years, the imminence of an election would cause the citizens of the County to remark with pleasure — able anticipation that it was about time for the fights to begin, at least it was an occasion of widespread interest in Cobb".
