GAZETTE EDITORIAL

HOW SAFE IS KENNESAW? The recent train derailment in Rockdale county that sent 16 cars off the track and forced the two day evacuation of 250 residents should again serve as a warning to the residents of Kennesaw and to all that live even remotely close to a mainline railroad track. Gas is the reason! At least four of the sixteen cars contained dangerous chemicals, including one full of liquid chlorine and another holding 30,000 gallons of highly flammable liquid propane. Still another car leaked alcohol into a tributary of the Yellow River and the Porterdale water filtration system had to be closed. According to the inspectors who were on the scene immediately, "Nothing was wrong with the track, it was inspected just last week and we check them every two weeks for damage".

All too often we hear this news of the latest "Train-Wreck" and I suppose that we all think that it is just another matter that we have to accept in our daily routine. We submit to you that it is not normal and should be considered as such.

Bear with me for a few moments and lets look at the record of "Train-Wrecks" that have occurred in our own city.

March 20th, 1977

Wreck occurred at Hwy. 293 and railroad bridge just behind Kennesaw Plaza Shopping Center and less than two good sized city blocks from our elementary school.

<u>Damage</u> - Two cars derailed containing Styrene gas.

September 28th, 1977 - Wreck occurred at foot of A. D. Campbell Road approximately 1/2 mile

south of Due West Road. Thirty two cars were involved in this pile-up, in which a Cobb County fireman was overcome by the leaking fumes from a car loaded with thousands of gallons of Anhydrous Ammonia.

December 24th, 1977-78 - Partially empty cars "Wrecked". One car, however, was full of thousands of gallons of Sulfuric Acid and lay leaking on its side, just south of Acworth.

In this current year, two "Train-Wrecks" have occurred and one of them could have had serious consequences. The one that we speak of was in Downtown Kennesaw.

As was stated in this article at the beginning, if you live anywhere remotely close to the mainline of the L&N railroad, you should be concerned about the potential hazards that traffic down the line that has such a historical reputation. We sincerely hope that something can be done by the powers that run our community and our state and that nothing dreadful will live in our memories as that of Waverly, Tennessee, where approximately 32 innocent people died, needlessly. Lets put the railroads in proper prospective and let them know that we still revere those lazy days of Casey Jones and the bustling song about the Chattanooga Choo-Choo, but the politicians in office are aware of the danger and yet, more "Train-Wrecks" have occurred than ever before.

We certainly would not allow semi-trucks loaded with the same gasses and materials to wreck on Highway 41 three times in one year, causing the evacuation of half the city.

King's Center opened April 4th of this year and is an Adult Supportive Living Center.

The Center is owned and operated by Harold and Brenda King, with only one part-time employee, Herbert Bishop. They have 18 residents, male and female, ages ranging from 17 to 74 years of age.

Most residents come from Georgia Regional Hospital, Georgia Retardation Center, and various nursing homes. They help take care of their own

rooms, making beds, etc., take turns cooking and washing dishes and keeping the grounds neat. They all pitch in and really look like one big happy family.

Brenda and Harold take all their people to their doctors, have development or training programs and recreational activities.

The Kings both have adequate medical training. Brenda has had nurse's training and Harold is a Licensed Practical Nurse and administers medication and injections to those unable to help themselves.

Even with the fantastic family atmosphere and wonderful organization, the hours in a day must seem pretty long at times with Brenda having all the laundry to do and has to take 22-30 loads of clothing to a laundromat

weekly, going from daylight til after dark seven days a week.







Most people probably think of a fire department in terms of shiny red fire trucks, spotted Dalmation dogs, or firemen sliding down brass poles. That may have been true in days gone by, but today's firehouses and the firefighters who work there are a lot different from the image we may have learned in grammar school.

That's certainly true of Fire Station No. 8 in Station 8 Kennesaw. became one of nineteen fire stations in the Cobb County Fire Department when the separate fire districts merged into one county-wide system in 1972. Like the rest of the stations, we use three shifts to keep the station manned 24 hours a day ... Each man has accumulated many hours of training and years of experience to perform his specific job in handling an emergency.

Of course, our one-story firehouse has no need for a brass pole, and we don't have a spotted dog. don't even have a red fire engine. As you've probably noticed, Engine 8 is painted white for better visibility at night. Even the nature of firefighting itself has changed over the years, and today's firemen are called on to handle a variety of situations.

In the Kennesaw area, we face a multitude of potential emergencies. Within the past year, Station 8 has responded to several train derailments involving hazardous chemicals; vehicle accidents; aircraft problems; bomb threats; medical emergencies, and

an assortment of investigations in addition to our normal fire alarms. Incidentally, Station 8 is the only station in the county to have a dry chemical truck in addition to our pumper. The ballshaped apparatus mounted in the bed of the red pickup is specifically designed for large flammable liquid fires such as we might encounter in an airplane crash.

This article is the first in what we hope will be a regular feature about Station 8 and the activities of your Cobb County Fire Department, and I hope you'll write me if you have any questions or comments.

I've been a firefighter with Cobb County since January of 1975, and I've worked with the B-shift crew of Station 8 nearly four years. I'm very proud of our station and the men who work there. They're all dedicated. professional firefighters who have a real interest in the Kennesaw community. In future articles, I hope to tell you a little more about them, our station, equipment, alarms, and what we're doing to make Kennesaw a safer community for all of us.


