THE TAX STRUGGLE WHO IS REALLY WINNING?

In 1978 what had once been a low rumble had grown to a roar and now is being echoed across the land. TAX REVOLT! The American taxpayer has rallied around many and varied "Grass Roots" Committees in an attempt to stop if not even push back the rushing flood of taxes that are engulfing all of us. The struggle is on. But who is winning? Tax payers? Tax committees? Tax assessors? Government officials? The answer could be surprising.

Without attempting to study and analyze the entire spectrum of taxes, let us study a taxing situation close to home - COBB COUNTY PROPERTY TAXES. Is this close enough? Do you feel your temperature rising? If you think Cobb County has upset you enough as it is, let me fan the fire a little bit.

What brought about the cry of "Blood" from the masses was the new appraisals of property made by the county tax assessors in 1976. The actual case history illustrated below is an example of the drastic changes that took place under the new appraisals on a home and five acres located in Northeast Cobb County. The home is 17 years old, well maintained, and has not had any exterior construction during this time. Figures are rounded to the nearest thousand on fair market value and

assessments and homestead exemption is not considered.

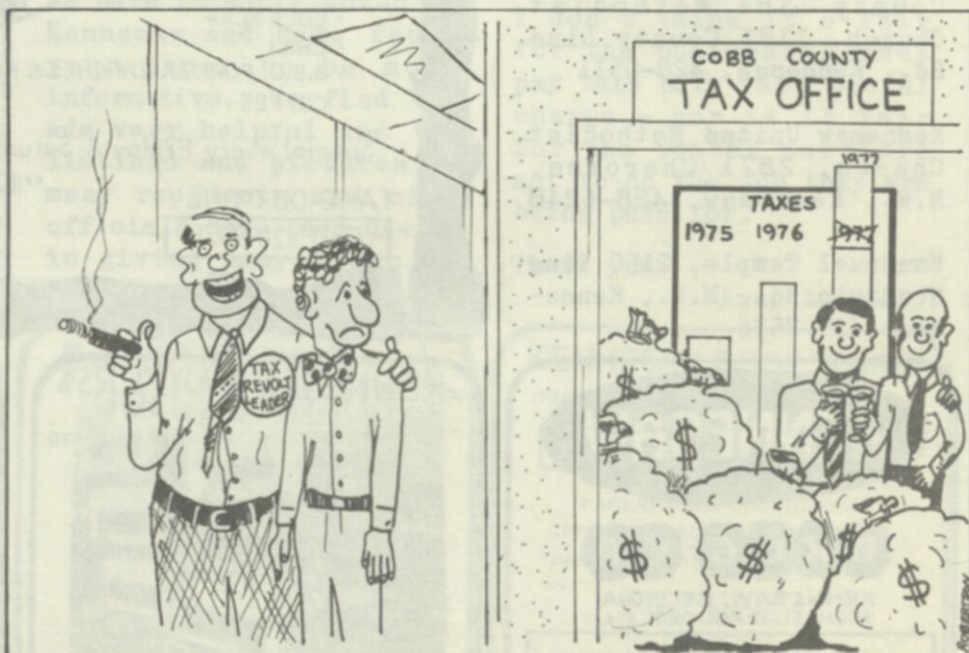

Although newer homes with less acreage did not experience this drastic an increase, the fact remains that the reduction of 3.75 mils was nowhere near as great as the increase in the appraised value. Similar situations involving over 100% tax increases were prevalent throughout the county. Needless to say, this was a bit too much to take lying down.

Tax revolt committees sprang up like spring flowers and the fight was on, but it was a mismatch from the start. In the thick of the fight the new tax appraisals were put on

"hold" and everyone saw a glimpse of victory flickering by. Perhaps floundering would be a better word.

Now enters one of the great paradoxes of all time, the great American Civic Leader. All movements, groups, committees, clubs, or what have you, always seem to have a few of these modern day Sir Galahads who arise out of the rank and file to accept the challenge of leadership. The only problem is that most of them range from stumbling mediocrity to being out and out unqualified to lead. It is a rarity indeed when there emerges a man or a woman who is qualified, willing to serve, and has the time. Yes, rare indeed. The great tax revolt, Cobb

County version, may have had some of those rare "Gems" of the civic world, but I must have overlooked them.

Of course the new appraisals were shelved for awhile, we were allowed to pay an interim tax bill based on the old assessments, a few taxpayers received moderate adjustments on the fair market values after standing in line for hours, new tax statements were prepared and mailed after things had "quieted down" a little and most of us have reluctantly paid them.

But what about the "little" interim millage hike of 3.50 mils? What increase you say? Let me repeat - the millage rate was very subtly increased from the proposed 30.25 mils in the fall of 1977 to a substantially higher 33.75 mils on your actual tax statement. This is the slickest move yet by your county commissioners. While we are busy trying to establish a reasonable fair market value for our property, they simply add 3.50 mils to the 30.25 mils originally established for the new appraisals and nobody even notices. Using our \$50,000 home, again this is an additional increase of \$70,00. Simply stated, we have been "had" again. Good Grief!

So, this brings us to the original question about the great tax struggle, "Who is really winning?" Actually it should be, "Who won?" The answer is simple: Cobb County by a landslide! To draw an analogy. If this struggle were a football game it would be Cobb County 42, Taxpayers 3 late in the fourth quarter. Additionally, your coach quit, the

fans are booing, and your star quarterback (fearless leader) still thinks he's winning. Speaking of our great american civic leaders, Where are they? Are they still celebrating false victories, hiding in

Nicaragua, or maybe out "leading" some other cause on to "Glory". Wherever, forget them and look for others - good ones, because its late in the game and you need help. Cobb

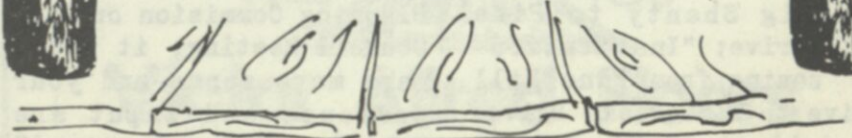

Mayor's Report

I wish to dedicate my column to a summary of key events which took place at the Council Meeting of September 18. Mr. James Powell, Mayor Pro Tem, submitted his resignation for health reasons, effective September 30. Jim and I served on the Council in 1973 and have since remained close personal friends. He brought to his position over 30 years experience in city government and has served Kennesaw as Councilman, Tax Superintendent and Consultant. He will be missed. I recommended to the Council that Jerry Wortham, unopposed candidate for Council, be appointed effective October 1. This was approved.

At the recommendation of the Planning Commission, the Council approved a new "Office" zoning classification which would allow only personal services and be more restrictive than the classification "Neighborhood Shopping". This new zoning class should provide a more favorable buffer between residential areas and commercial zoning.

The Council (4 to 1 vote) turned down a Planning Commission recommendation to rezone all property fronting on Cherokee Street as follows: "Office" zoning from Shirley Dr. and Big Shanty to Pine Hill Drive; "Institutional" zoning from Pine Hill Drive to Timberlake Drive; "Neighborhood Shopping"

zoning from Timberlake Drive to Dobbins/Poplar Drives; and "Light Industrial" zoning from Dobbins/Poplar Drives to Chalker Road. It was felt by the majority that many adjoining residential areas would be adversely affected by the proposal.

However, the concept is sound as we need to eliminate spot zoning on Cherokee Street. Revisions to the plan were discussed, but legal counsel ruled that no changes were permissible since it had been advertised in that manner.

Thus, the Council passed a motion to use the Planning Commission's recommendations as amended (expanding "Office" zoning to Timberlake Drive) in the development of the city's future land use map which will be approved in the near future. This map will guide city officials in future rezoning applications throughout the city.

The above may sound very confusing and it is complicated. However, if you have attended a Planning Commission or City Council Meeting, it would make more sense and your presence and input are needed. Why not attend?

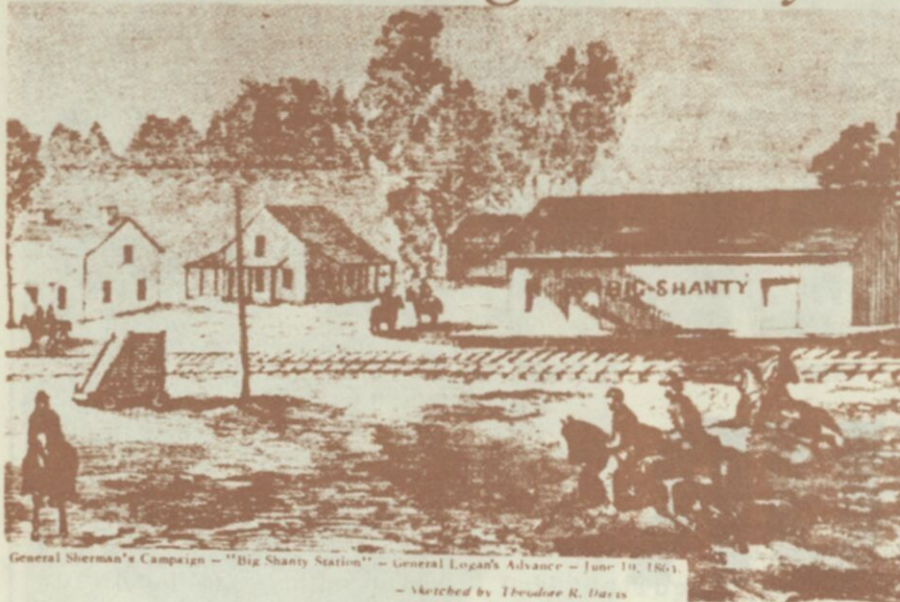

Kennesaw is a town with two names.

It was first called Big Shanty and got this designation when the old Western and Atlantic Railroad was built down from Chattanooga to what is now Atlanta. A group of houses (shanties) were erected in northern Cobb County near the big spring to accommodate a construction crew building the state railroad.

North of the spring was a portion of downgrade track to the Etowah River known to railroad employees as "the big grade to the shanties". The phrase, later shortened to "Big Shanty Grade", finally was dubbed simply, "Big Shanty".

Later the name was changed to Kennesaw. This name came from a tribe of Cherokee Indians called the Kennesaw who lived around the mountain.

CHRONOLOGY OF THE GENERAL

April 12, 1862, was the day of the Great Locomotive Chase. The General, a passenger and freight train, left Atlanta, Georgia, on its way to St. Louis when it was hi-jacked.

Historians have related a colorful story of Andrew's Raiders who made off with the General while the train was stopped at Kennesaw for a breakfast break.

On April 12, 1962, Kennesaw held a centennial in commemoration of the famous locomotive chase. The General steamed into Kennesaw from Atlanta under its own power and retraced its route between Big Shanty and Chattanooga in celebration of the chase.

With this appearance of the General, Kennesaw began to envision the famous locomotive as a

part of their town and residents went to work to accomplish this purpose.

The Big Shanty Historical Society was incorporated for the purpose of bringing the General home, after the Georgia General Assembly approved a resolution to place the engine in a Kennesaw museum.

In 1967 the Big Shanty Historical Society sponsored the Big Shanty Fair September 14 to raise necessary funds for the museum.

Chattanooga Mayor Ralph Kelli and his officials captured the General in the city's freight yard as the train was on its way to Kennesaw for the fair and refused to let it leave.

The battle to retrieve the locomotive was turned over to the Governor's Office when the issue went to court in 1968.

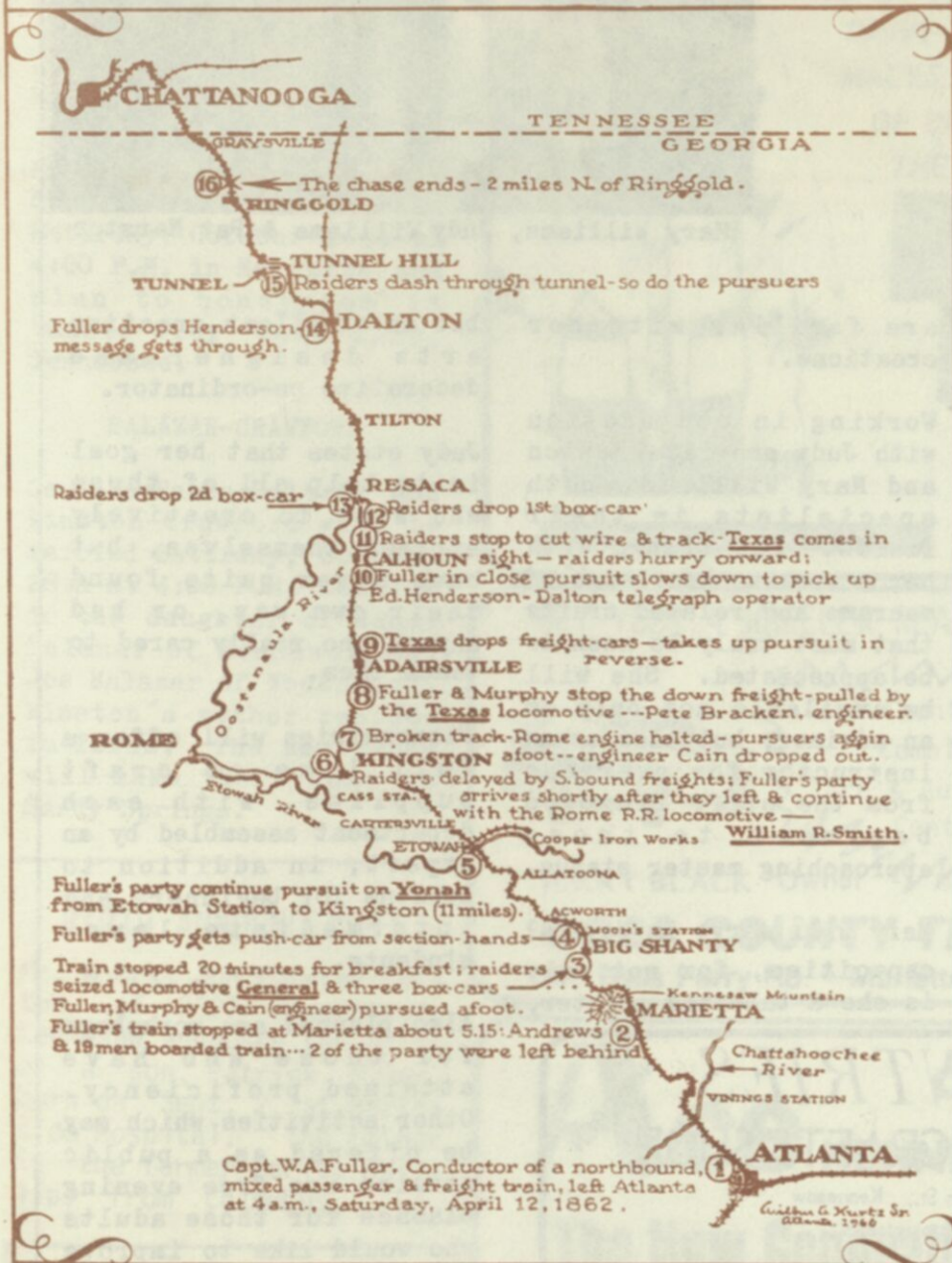
The General, meanwhile, was taken to Louisville, Ky. and wrapped in protective covering to wait the long court battle between the State of Georgia and the City of Chattanooga.

The United States Supreme Court ruled in 1970 that the L & N Railroad had the right to give the train to anyone.

The suit was settled in November, 1971 by the U. S. Supreme Court, which let stand a lower court ruling that the railroad could take the engine anywhere it wished.

On February 20, 1972, L & N Railroad President W. H. Kendall presented the train's deed to Gov. Jimmy Carter in Atlanta. Following approval by the State Properties Commission, the General was turned over to Kennesaw for enshrinement in the Big Shanty Museum.

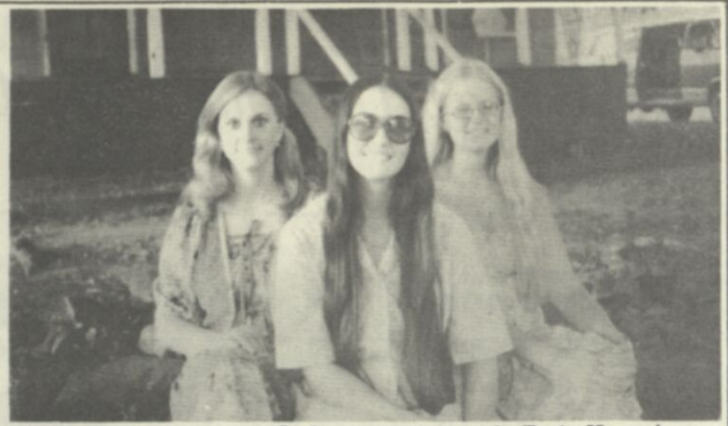

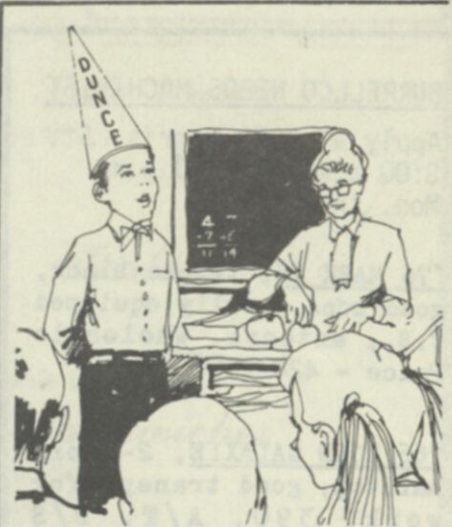
