Dear Editor,

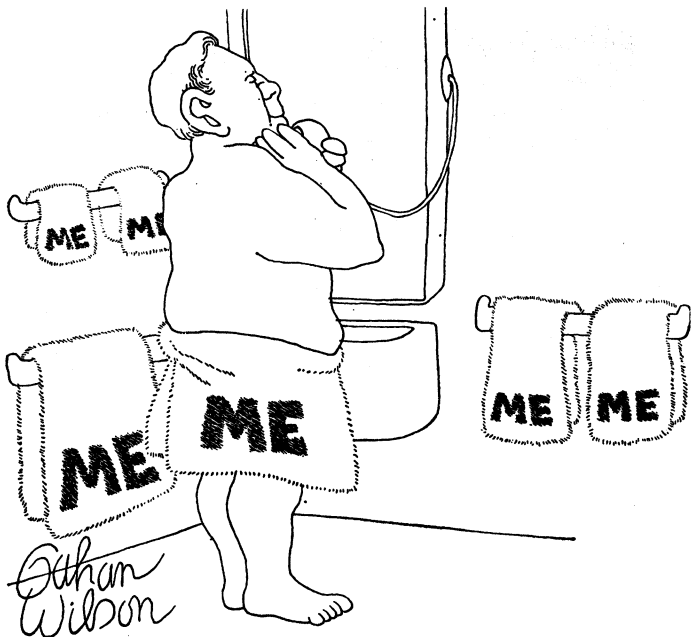

Yes, you read the above want ad correctly. Southern Tech needs a food service. I know what you're thinking, you're thinking we have a food service on the ground floor of the Student Center. No, that is a snack bar; not even close to a food service. The lack of a true cafeteria type food service is hurting, and is going to hurt even more, the prestige of this school.

I know what you're going to say and I've heard most of the arguments. When Frank Jahelka was here, it was that the food wasn't any good and that not enough students ate there.

The facts are that the lack of a true food service hurts the diets of the students on campus, in the recruitment of new students, and when guests of the students, administration, and Continuing Education visit our campus. This

school and everyone associated with Southern Tech are the ones who are going to suffer.

We need a cafeteria in a central location on campus with a nice surrounding atmosphere where students, faculty, and administrators can go and have a good hot meal and interact with each other. If I can drive to two different places about three miles off campus and get a good hot meal with my choice of three meats and seven vegetables with something to drink and dessert, "all I can eat", for about \$2.00 then someone ought to be able to figure out how to serve maybe two hot meals a day here on campus for a good price. If the food was good and the price reasonable then many students would sign up for a meal plan. Maybe you could even get faculty and administrators to sign up for a one-meal-a-day plan.

Someone in this school needs to look seriously at Southern Tech's need for a food service and the consequences of a future at Southern Tech without one. For without a food service the future of Southern Tech is in doubt.
