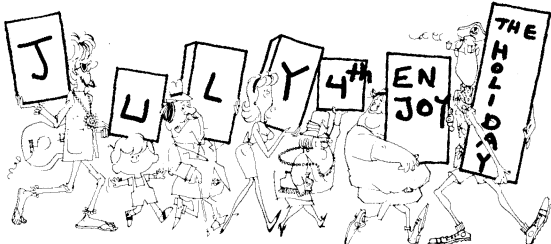
INDUSTRIAL SCHOLARSHIPS
