

SUE KONRAD:

NEW STUDENT ACTIVITIES DIRECTOR

A new face has moved into the Student Center Director's office. The face belongs to Sue Konrad, a lady with charm, talent, ideas and most importantly, drive and purpose. She is very much interested in staying at Southern Tech and making the student entertainment program one of her major priorities.

Ms. Konrad is originally from Long Island, New York. She graduated from Hartwick College in New York state with a Bachelor of Science degree in History Education. She earned her Master's degree in Guidance and Counseling at Long Island University. West Georgia College is where she worked (with the residence halls there) before coming here to Southern Tech.

When asked about first impressions of the school and campus life here at STI, she commented that the students here seem to be more professionally orientated. Most of them are here with a definite purpose in mind. At West Georgia the atmosphere was more relaxed and the students were more orientated towards a more free lifestyle with less emphasis on professional orientation.

The merger between the Student Government Association Entertainment Committee and the Student Center to create a central program board was very appealing to the new director. Because the budget for the Student Center is rather small for a campus of STI's size, she has the tricky job of trying to demonstrate what she can do in the way of different entertainment options while balancing the budget. But Ms. Konrad is not complaining about the limited funds. She is more than able to expend her own efforts to secure quality entertainment. Based on her efforts and on several of her ideas, she has the hope that the budget for Student Center recreation can be gradually increased. By demonstrating successfully what she can do with limited funds, she will be making a powerful argument for the effective use of more funds.

When asked how she sees herself in terms of being a productive source on campus, Sue Konrad emphasized that she is very interested in working with the students and is able to help them. She is very interested in being a consultant to students, helping them coordinate any activities they may be interested in.

The final comment made by Sue Konrad was in reference to the projects she would like to see done. All of them will require the firm foundations before they can be instigated. She plans to go slowly and not to try to do too much overnight. She is interested in working together with the students as a concerned party. She is not afraid of long hours. She is not to get bogged down by things. She has a very honest approach to her work and her candor is refreshing. She has a long road ahead of her. Ms. Konrad appears to be determined to reach her goals with her experience, expertise, and interest.

The Student Government held its weekly meeting at 5:00 p.m. in the Student Center. The minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

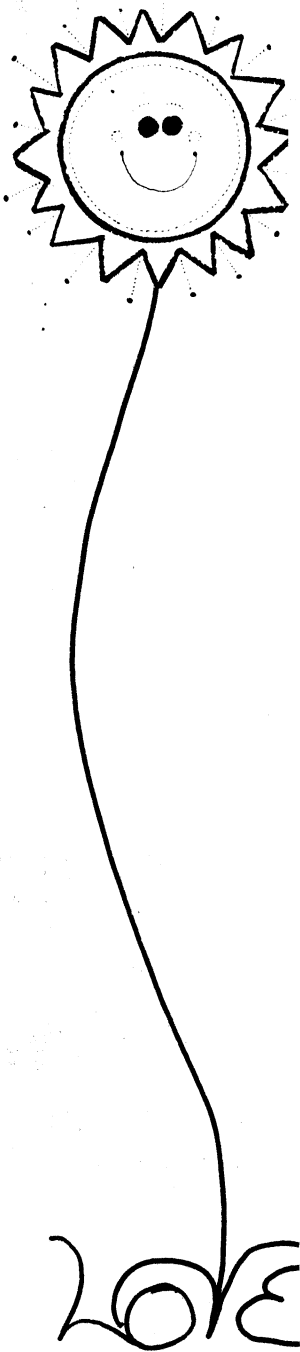

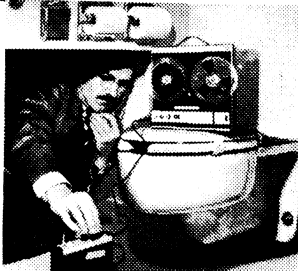
