## SAFETY CLASS HEARS SPEAKER

Professor McClure's evening IET 350 safety class was privileged to hear a guest speaker who is in both the safety and the insurance business. The speaker was Mr. Rudy Fuglaar and he presented an interesting talk on safety from the viewpoint of an insurance company that handles industrial fire insurance. Mr. Fuglaar has over 20 years in the safety business. The last 10 of those 20 years has been spent with a very reputable insurance firm.

The product liability aspects which deal with claims involving faulty parts and/or faulty operations were cited as a contributing factor in determining what rates a company will be charged. Amount of exposure to hazards was also mentioned as a large factor in determining rates.

Mr. Fuglaar also explained the relationship between good safety practices and money. He stressed that the reason for the intense concern over safety programs in large plants is mainly because of rate costs which can mean more or less money being spent. A plant with a good safety record can save lots of money on its rates. That money saved is money in the bank which is a compliment to good business practices.

Plant safety work as a future employment opportunity was also discussed. Personnel are very much in demand. The demand for qualified people has increased even more since the passage of the Occupational Safety and Health Act. Accident investigation is also interesting work to go into because it can provide clues as to why an accident happened.

Mr. Fuglaar's parting comments reflected the attitude that it is far cheaper to prevent accidents than to let the accident happen and then pay compensation for it. He also stressed the importance of making students aware of the insurance industry as it relates to safety and the manufacturing industries.

## ROAD ATLANTA

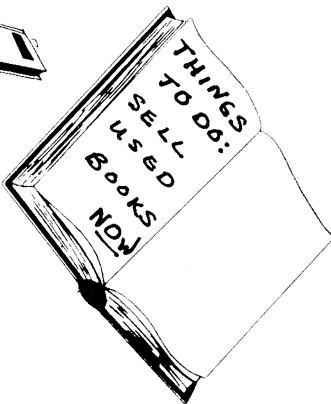
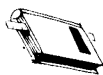
