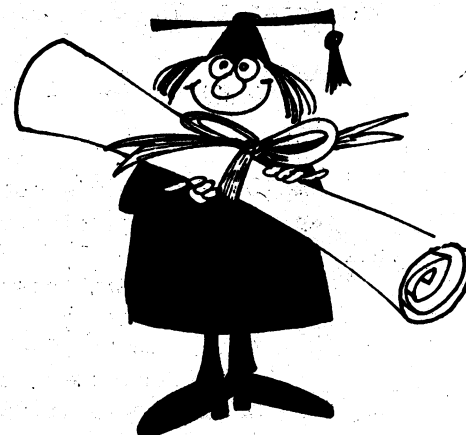

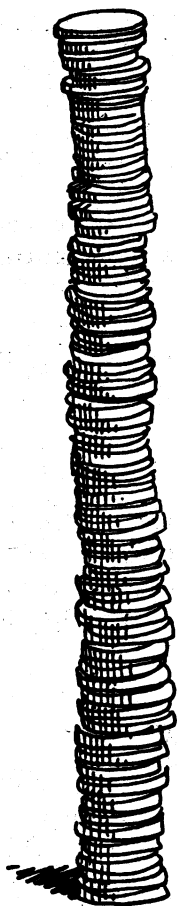
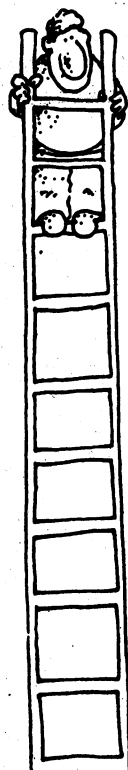

The only other drivers to successfully defend their titles from a year ago were D.J. Fazekas, Dick Davenport and Randall Blessing.

Fazekas, Indianapolis, Ind., topped the field in the Showroom Stock A race. Davenport, Wichita, Kansas, outdistanced the field to take the C Sedan honors and Blessing, Lakeland, Fla., claimed his third straight championship in the A Sedan race.

The brother team of Stuart and Elliot Forbes-Robinson were also winners during the Champion Classic. Elliot, Crescenta, Calif., won his third national title, but his first in A Production while brother, Stuart, Mission Viejo, Calif., made his first appearance in winner's circle

as a SCCA National Champion after winning the Formula A competition.

In the E Production race, Robert Overby, Jacksonville, Fla., broke a three-year domination of the class by Terry Viser. David Frellsen, Wilmette, Ill., became a four-time National Champion in the B Sedan race with his win over the weekend. Frellsen had three straight wins (1973, 74 and 75) but for the last two years, fell short of the mark before regaining the title this year.

All of the 1978 SCCA National Champions were awarded their gold medallions at the annual awards banquet after the final day of racing. In addition to the crowning of the National Champions, the coveted President's Cup, for outstanding effort during the Champion Spark Plug Road Racing Classic was awarded to Don Courtney, winner of the Formula la Vee race.

Gary Rutherford was named the SCCA - S K Tools Mechanic of the Year and Mike Mokler received the Road Racing Drivers Club Award.

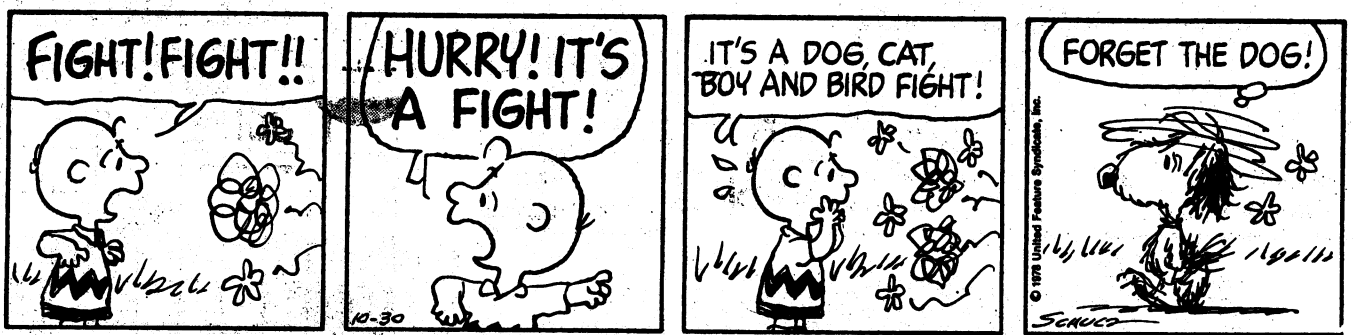
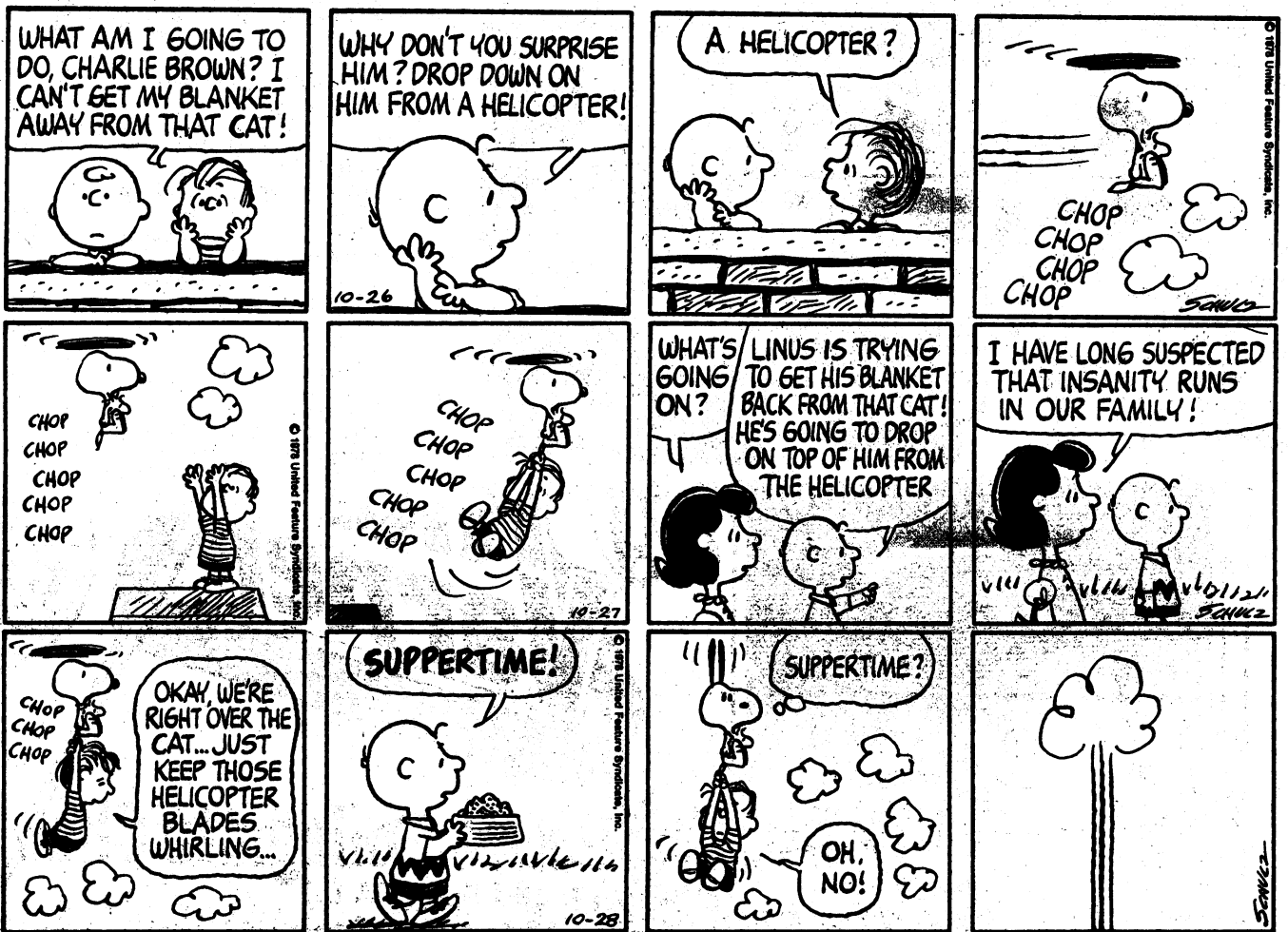

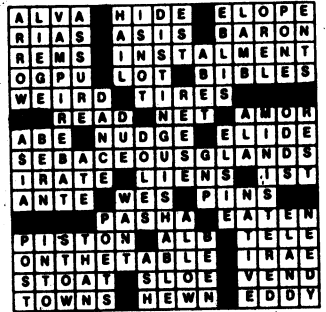
