

The 1969 Montage is a record of the activities, events, social occasions, class-work, and life of the students at Kennesaw Junior College, It is a record of your academic life.



Kennesaw Junior College Marietta, Georgia

Kennesaw Junior College was approved by the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia on October 9, 1963. The physical-plant, the actual campus buildings, was constructed in 1965–1966. The college was open to students in September 1966. The college has 152 acres of land located eight miles north of Marietta.


The college was established to provide students with the first two years of their academic program so that they could transfer to senior institutions and complete their requirements. Programs of adult education and community services are also offered in courses of continuing education.




Student Activities Committee
