# The 1981 MONTAGE is dedicated to Dr. Horace W. Sturgis President of Kennesaw College From July 1965 to March 1981




Dr. Horace W. Sturgis, the founding president of Kennesaw College, retired this spring. During his sixteen-year term as president, Dr. Sturgis successfully guided the college through the growth that has made Kennesaw the eighth largest institution in the University system. Begun as a junior college in 1966 with 1,014 students, Kennesaw became a senior college in 1978, and had an enrollement of 3,903 students Fall Quarter 1980.

Dr. Vernon Crawford, Chancellor of the University

System of Georgia, gives much of the credit for Kennesaw's high academic standards and growth to Dr. Sturgis. After citing Dr. Sturgis' "strong dedication to high quality education" and his "widely recognized leadership abilities," Dr. Crawford said, "I think he has done a superb job as president of Kennesaw College."

Faculty, staff, and students miss his presence on campus, but we recall with gratitude and appreciation all that he continues to mean to the college.

A native of Pennsylvania, Dr. Sturgis received his BS degree from Piedmont College, his MS degree from the University of Georgia, and his Ph.D. from New York University. He served as director of the Ground School of Aviation at UGA and also served in the U.S. Navy during W.W. II.

Prior to becoming the founding president of Kennesaw, he was an associate registrar at Georgia Tech, where he had also served as an assistant professor of physics. Before beginning his 39 years in the University System of Georgia, he spent seven years in public schools as a high school principal in Fayetteville and Eatonton, and a teacher at North Fulton High School in Atlanta.


Dr. Sturgis has been active in the leadership of several professional and civic organizations as well as in community affairs. He is a member and past director of the Cobb County Chamber of Commerce, a former member of the Board of Trustees of the Metropolitan Atlanta Chapter of the American Red Cross, and a member of the Board of Trustees of the Cobb Community Symphony Orchestra. He is also a member and past president of the Marietta Kiwanis Club. Dr. Sturgis is a past president of the Georgia Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers. He has held membership on committees of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, and is a past president of the Georgia Association of Colleges.




## Lights, Camera, Action!

Before I moved out, I was interviewed by two TV stations. They called me Kennesaw College's first resident student. The newspapers called me an environmentalist and a naturalist. I was just having fun.
