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Kennesaw College is quire privileged to hove as its new president Dr. Betty L. Siegel. She came to Kennesaw from Western Carolina College in North Carolina and become the first woman president in the University System of Georgia. Dr. Siegel is a welcome oddition and will prove to be a most valuable asset to Kennesaw. The annual stoff has chosen to dedicate the 1981 Montage to Dr. Betty L. Siegel.

An interview was conducted with Dr. Siegel by Cullene Harper and Gail Cowort. The interview was published in the October 1981 K.C. publication called <u>The Kenne Scene</u>. The following questions and answers ore excerpts from that interview.

How does it feel to be the first female president in the University System of Georgia?

I must say that I was delighted when I heard the news. I still feel on a natural kind of high about the apportunity. I think what really impressed me the most was the morale of the faculty. I liked the Search Committee and then when I met the Board, they all seemed so supportive of Kennesaw. The Chancellor had indicated that he felt so strongly that it had a bright future.

Do you believe being the first female president is on advantage or disadvantage for you?

I think any professional woman roday finds herself in the role of moking inroads into fields that have not been done before. I don't think of myself as just being a spokesperson for women. But I'm happy that women are being seen as capable — and able — and viable. When I become Deon of Academic Affairs at the University of Florida I was the first woman Deon in the state, the highest ranking woman administrator. When I became Deon at Western, I was the first woman Dean in its history. It's an important milestone; it's a developmental milestone.

I think the women's movement has made it possible for women to be seen in things that were traditionally male dominated. So I have to say that I'm o woman and I'm happy that I'm o president who happens to be a woman.

We feel like you are going to be a president who will be ready for exposure in the community.

I om looking forward to this. The President really has to meet the public, particularly in o school like Kennesaw. What I really wont to do first is just really get to know all the foculty and stoff. I wont to selectively insist that the people who are doing — like the Chairpersons of the Divisions — continue on with a great deal of the energy that they're doing already, to give me some time to really get to know you oll.

I'm going to spend a week of the Board of Regents before I come to Kennesaw, and I think that will give me on opportunity to know that innerworking.

I wont so devoutly to be the kind of representative or Kennesaw to "do you proud." That's a mountain expression. I love it. "Do yourself proud." And that's what I want to do for you all.




Do you feel that K.C. should have a Masters program incorporated into its current degree program? If so, what areas should offer a Masters degree?




Have students changed in the past ten years? If so, how?

How does the educational quality of Kennesaw College compare to larger colleges and universities?

I believe that the educational quality of Kennesaw College compares quite favorably with larger colleges and universities. As evidence of this, one might point to statistics which show that our students who transfer from Kennesaw to larger colleges do not, as a rule, suffer a decline in their grade paint overage ofter transferring. This illustrates, I think, that the educational level or Kennesaw is comparable to that of larger schools. In addition, the high success rare of our students on the Regents Exam (Kennesaw has several times ranked number one in the University System and consistantly in the top three), the excellent reputation of our nursing program, and the large number of students in the education department who score exceptionally well on the Criterian Reference Test, a requirement for certification in Georgia, ore but a few concrete examples that show our students are achieving as well, if not better, than their counterparts in large schools within the system. There is onother odvontage to a smaller college such as Kennesaw which cannot be measured by rests and that is the opportunity for more reocher-student interaction that is often missing in large colleges and universities. Many students seem to freet to question and to express their ideas in the otmosphere of a smaller classroom than they might in a large lecture hall. 



What could be done to allow the Student Body to participate more in campus activities?

There his team unearthed the oldest complete skull of an early human, its age established or nearly two million years. In addition, he is the author of two best selling books, The People of The Lake and Origins. 
"Education — compulsory schooling, compulsory learning — is a tyronny and a crime against the human mind and spirit. Let all those escape it who can, any way they can." John Halt made this statement while speaking on Kennesow's campus. Mr. Halt challenged his audiences to explore with him the alternatives to education outside formal schooling. He believes a superior education will be acquired by those children who are educated in the home because of increased flexibility in curriculum and planning, individualized attention and intimate knowledge of the children's needs. Mr. Halt is a former reacher and an author of nine books including Teach Your Own, and How Children Learn. He also produces a bi-monthly newsletter "Growing Without Schooling", for parents who have taken their children out of school and enrolled them in a home study program. Concerning attendance or a college for higher education, Mr. Halt states that college is not manditory. "I no longer believe learning is an activity that is separate from the rest of life. Or that it's done best when doing nothing else. Or that it's done best where nothing else is going on. For the vast majority of things . . . you don't need a special institution." Mr. Halt was also brought to Kennesaw by the Chautouqua to discuss his views an formal schooling for the education majors. Many educators from around Cobb Country also attended the lectures. 
























Snow Days ...


Sigma Phi Epsilon
