Kennesaw College is quite privileged to have as its new president Dr. Berry L. Siegel. She came to Kennesaw from Western Carolina College in North Carolina and became the first woman president in the University System of Georgia. Dr. Siegel is a welcome addition and will prove to be a most valuable asset to Kennesaw. The annual staff has chosen to dedicate the 1981 Montage to Dr. Berry L. Siegel.

An interview was conducted with Dr. Siegel by Cullene Harper and Gail Cowart. The interview was published in the October 1981 K.C. publication called The Kenne Scene. The following questions and answers are excerpts from that interview.

**How does it feel to be the first female president in the University System of Georgia?**

I must say that I was delighted when I heard the news. I still feel on a natural kind of high about the opportunity. I think what really impressed me the most was the morale of the faculty. I liked the Search Committee and then when I met the Board, they all seemed so supportive of Kennesaw. The Chancellor had indicated that he felt so strongly that it had a bright future.

**Do you believe being the first female president is an advantage or disadvantage for you?**

I think any professional woman today finds herself in the role of making inroads into fields that have not been done before. I don't think of myself as just being a spokesperson for women. But I'm happy that women are being seen as capable — and able — and viable. When I became Dean of Academic Affairs at the University of Florida I was the first woman Dean in the state, the highest ranking woman administrator. When I became Dean of Western, I was the first woman Dean in its history. It's an important milestone; it's a developmental milestone.

I think the women's movement has made it possible for women to be seen in things that were traditionally male dominated. So I have to say that I'm happy that I'm a woman and I'm happy that I'm a president who happens to be a woman.

**We feel like you are going to be a president who will be ready for exposure in the community.**

I am looking forward to this. The President really has to meet the public, particularly in a school like Kennesaw. What I really want to do first is just really get to know all the faculty and staff. I want to selectively insist that the people who are doing — like the Chairpersons of the Divisions — continue on with a great deal of the energy that they're doing already, to give me some time to really get to know you all.

I'm going to spend a week at the Board of Regents before I come to Kennesaw, and I think that will give me an opportunity to know that innerworking.

I want so devoutly to be the kind of representative of Kennesaw to "do you proud." That's a mountain expression. I love it. "Do yourself proud." And that's what I want to do for you all.

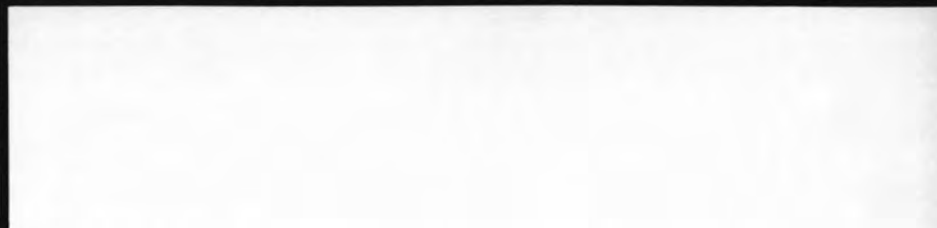

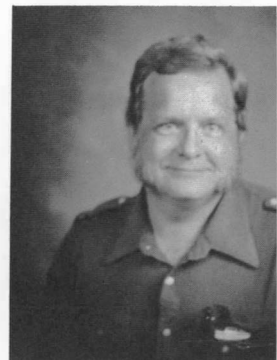


**What do you think of the student/faculty relationship here at K.C.?**

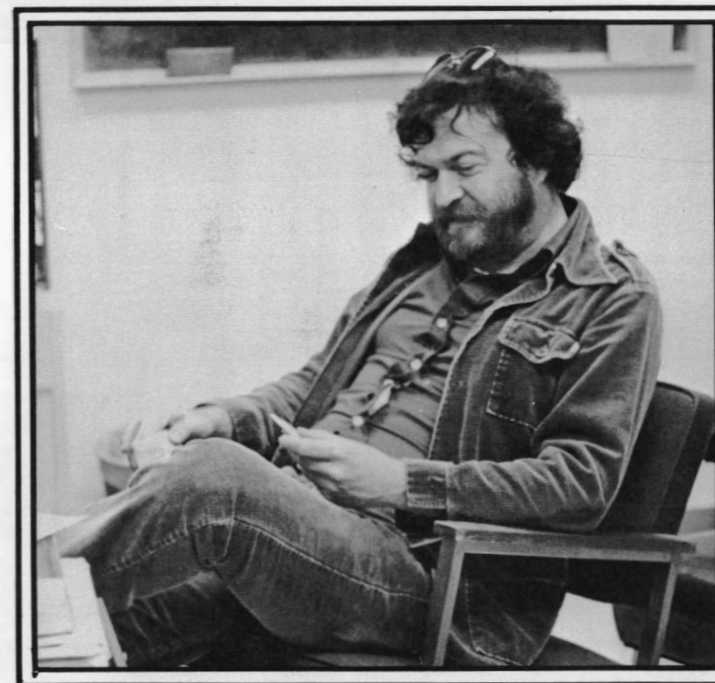




**How do the expectations of students today differ from those of students five years ago?**

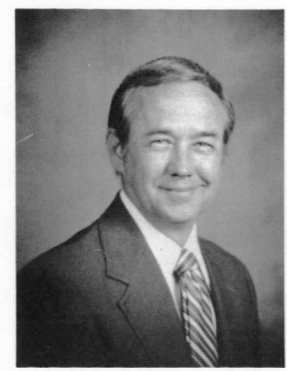
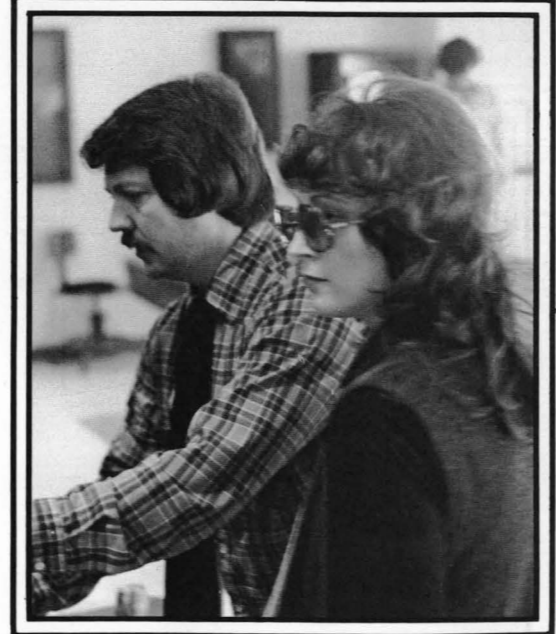
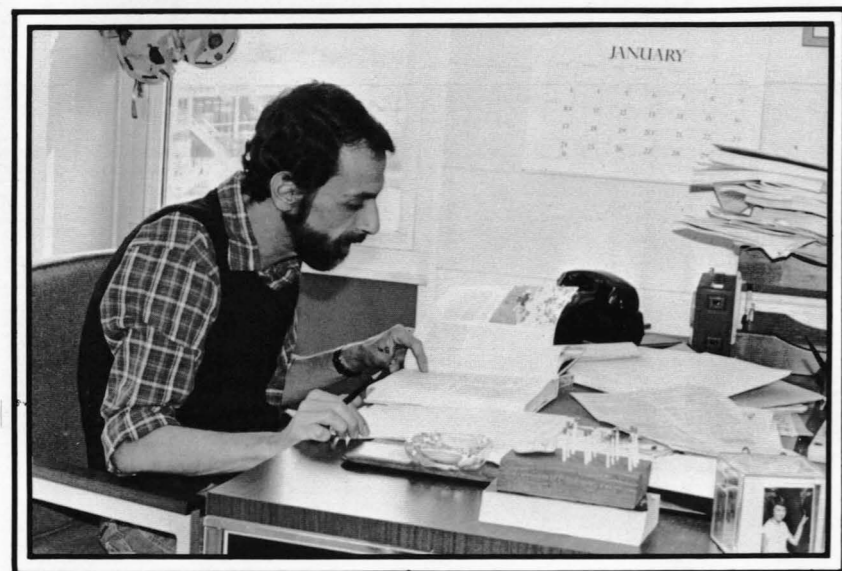




**Have students changed in the past ten years? If so, how?**

**How does the educational quality of Kennesaw College compare to larger colleges and universities?**

I believe that the educational quality of Kennesaw College compares quite favorably with larger colleges and universities. As evidence of this, one might point to statistics which show that our students who transfer from Kennesaw to larger colleges do not, as a rule, suffer a decline in their grade point average after transferring. This illustrates, I think, that the educational level of Kennesaw is comparable to that of larger schools. In addition, the high success rate of our students on the Regents Exam (Kennesaw has several times ranked number one in the University System and consistently in the top three), the excellent reputation of our nursing program, and the large number of students in the education department who score exceptionally well on the Criterion Reference Test, a requirement for certification in Georgia, are but a few concrete examples that show our students are achieving as well, if not better, than their counterparts in large schools within the system. There is another advantage to a smaller college such as Kennesaw which cannot be measured by tests and that is the opportunity for more teacher-student interaction that is often missing in large colleges and universities. Many students seem to feel free to question and to express their ideas in the atmosphere of a smaller classroom than they might in a large lecture hall. On the whole, I would have to say that students who come to Kennesaw are in no way sacrificing educational quality but are enhancing their ability to learn in a sound educational community where students do not become simply a number but are viewed as the individuals they are.

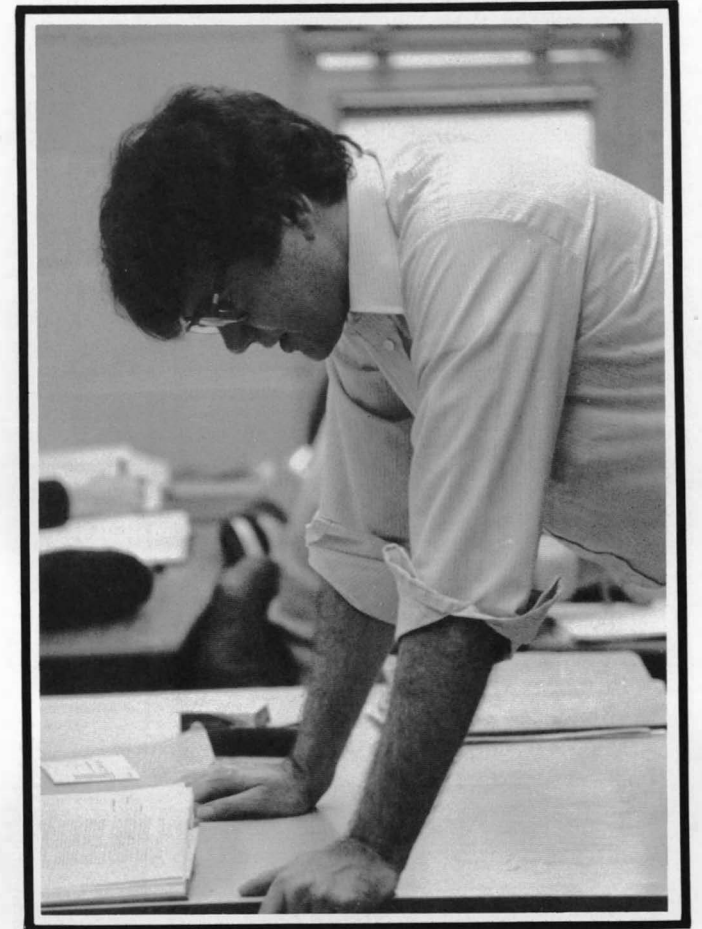

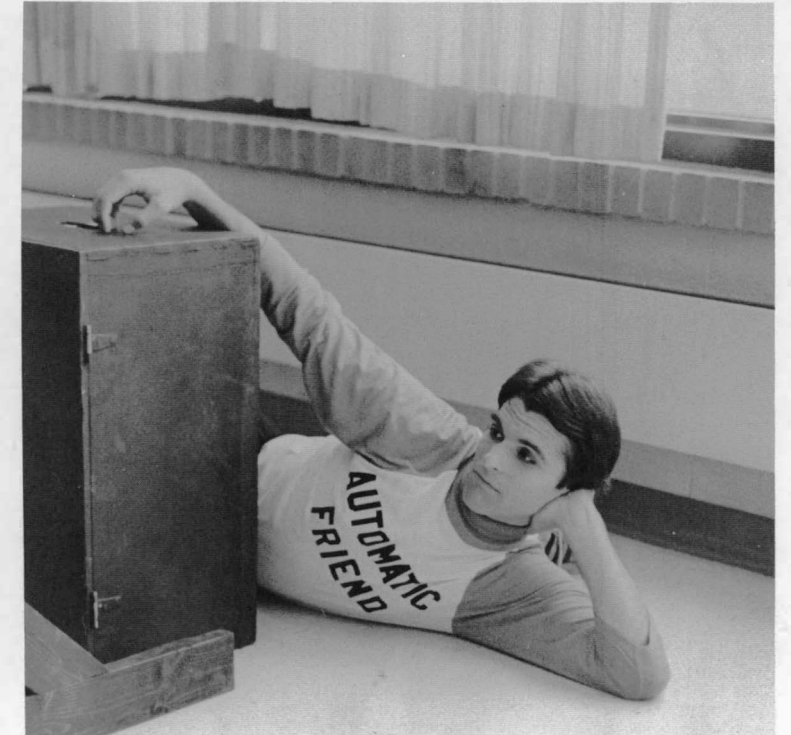
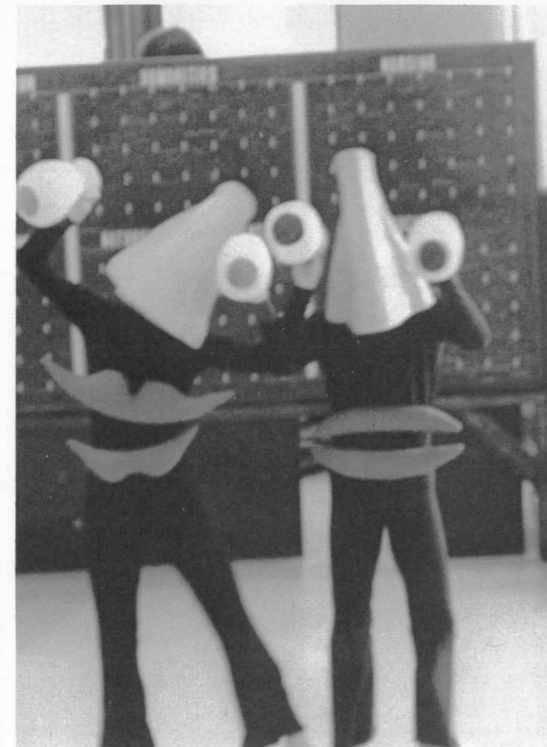
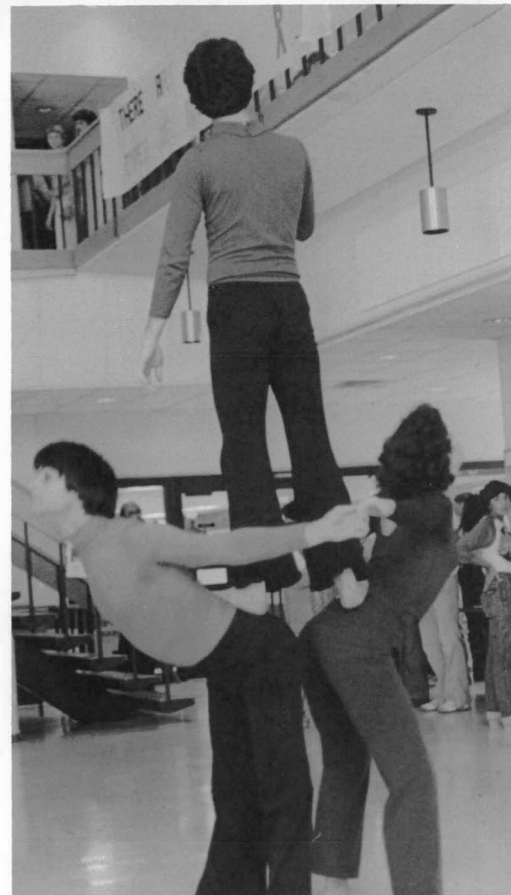
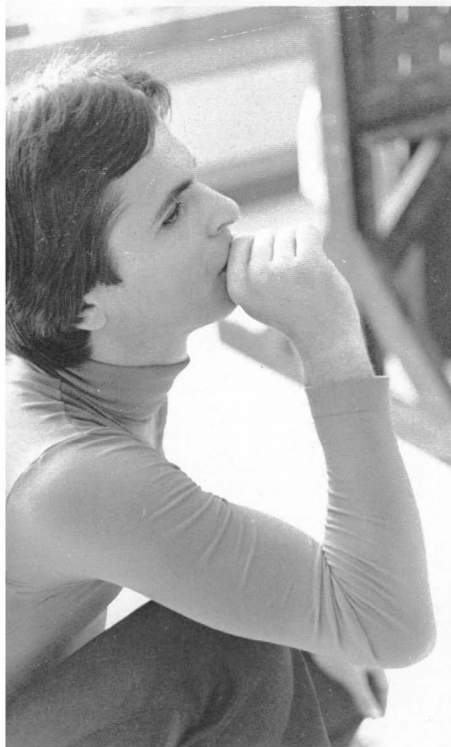


*"Education — compulsory schooling, compulsory learning — is a tyranny and a crime against the human mind and spirit. Let all those escape it who can, any way they can." John Holt made this statement while speaking on Kennesaw's campus. Mr. Holt challenged his audiences to explore with him the alternatives to education outside formal schooling. He believes a superior education will be acquired by those children who are educated in the home because of increased flexibility in curriculum and planning, individualized attention and intimate knowledge of the children's needs. Mr. Holt is a former teacher and an author of nine books including Teach Your Own, and How Children Learn. He also produces a bi-monthly newsletter "Growing Without Schooling", for parents who have taken their children out of school and enrolled them in a home study program. Concerning attendance at a college for higher education, Mr. Holt states that college is not mandatory. "I no longer believe learning is an activity that is separate from the rest of life. Or that it's done best when doing nothing else. Or that it's done best where nothing else is going on. For the vast majority of things . . . you don't need a special institution." Mr. Holt was also brought to Kennesaw by the Chourouquo to discuss his views on formal schooling for the education majors. Many educators from around Cobb County also attended the lectures. (Marietta Daily Journal)*

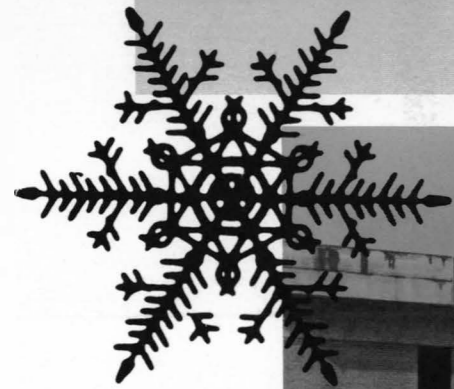






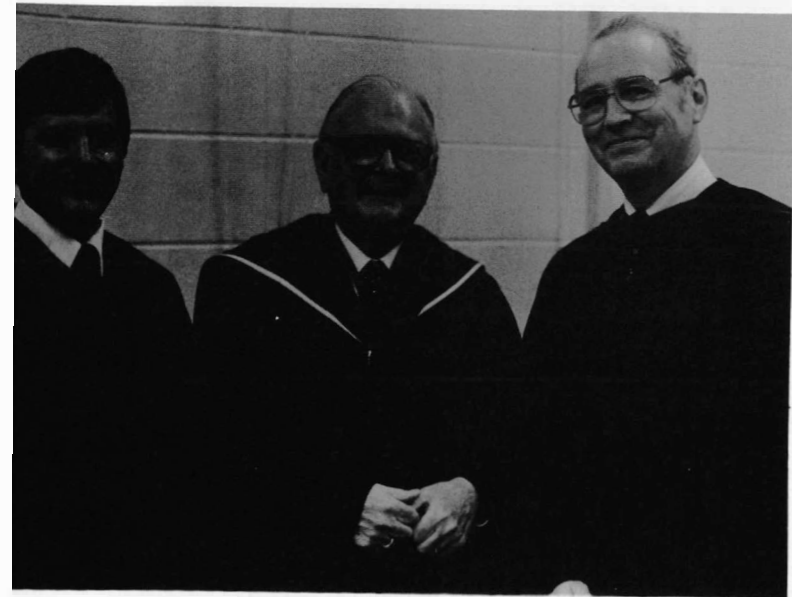
## Snow Days . . .

Sigma Phi Epsilon is a national social fraternity whose organization divides the country into regions, then into districts, and finally the districts are made up of the under graduate chapters and the alumni chapters. 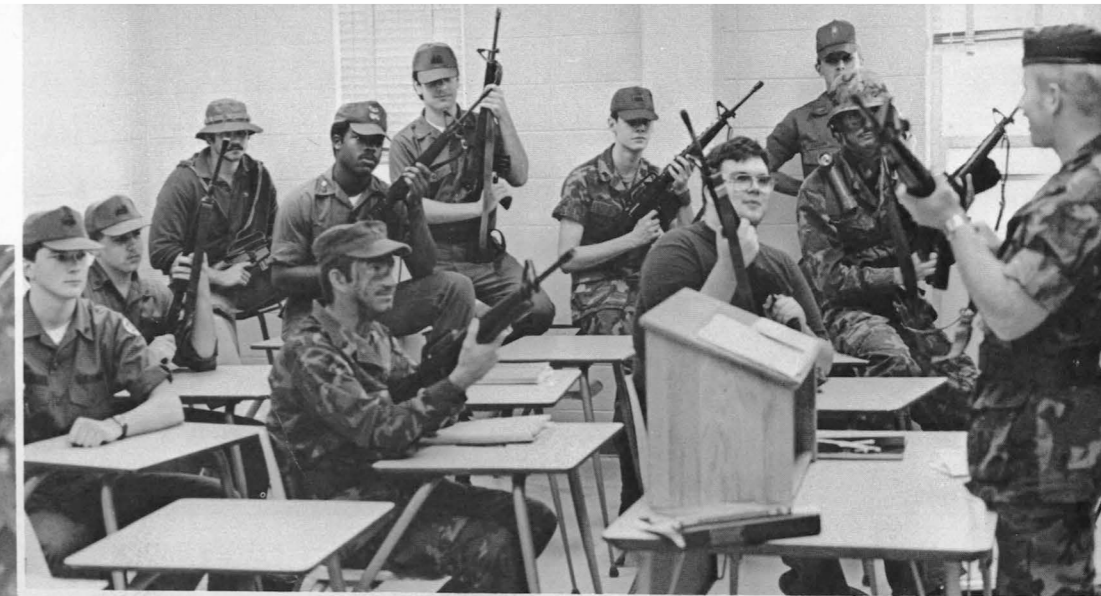

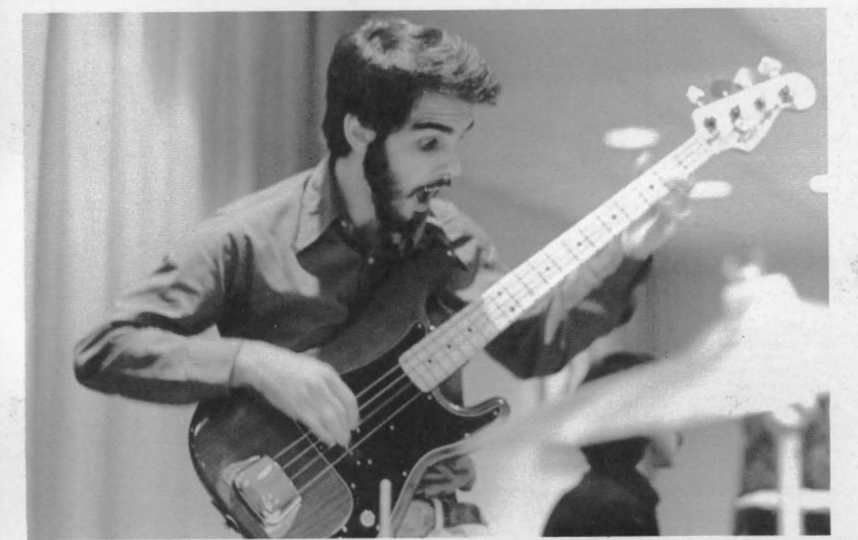
## Percussion Ensemble

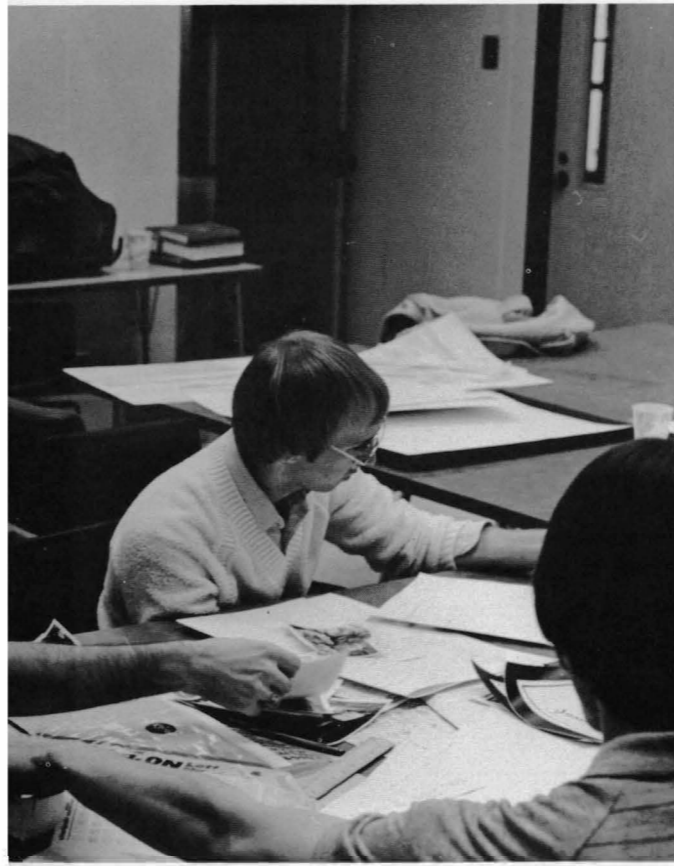
Published three times quarterly, the paper offers current news, editorial comments, and a wide array of interesting feature stories. As the college's official student

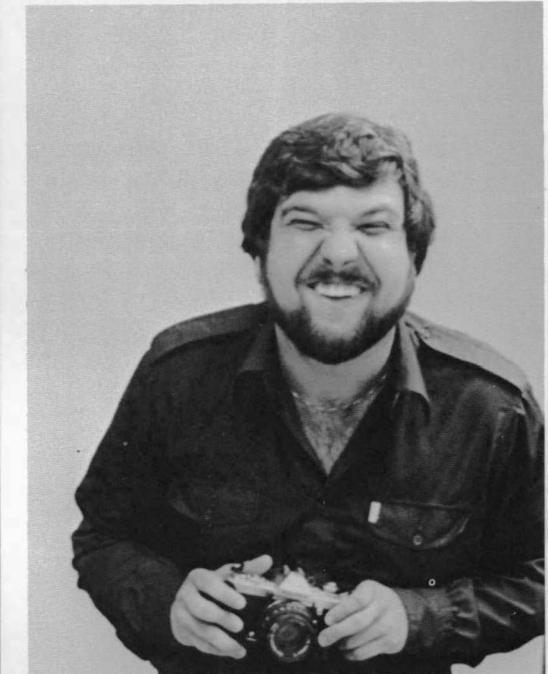
newspaper, the Sentinel has worked hard in order to maintain a convenient forum for the exchange of information between students, faculty, and staff.

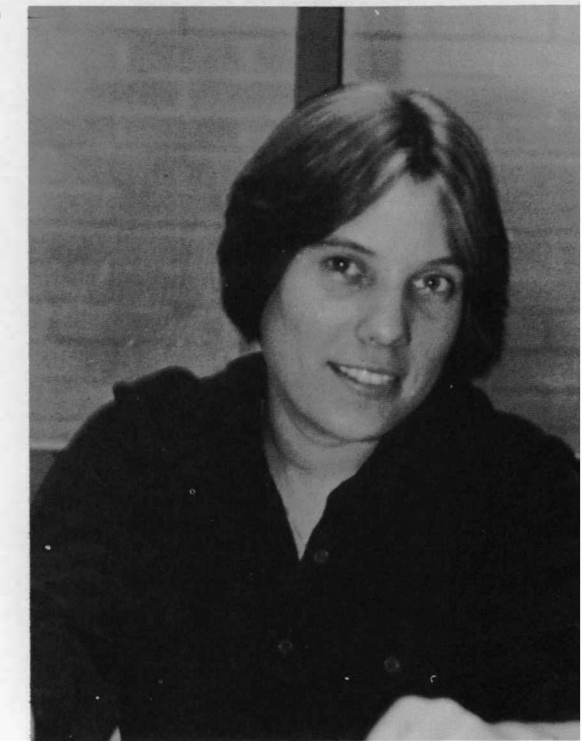




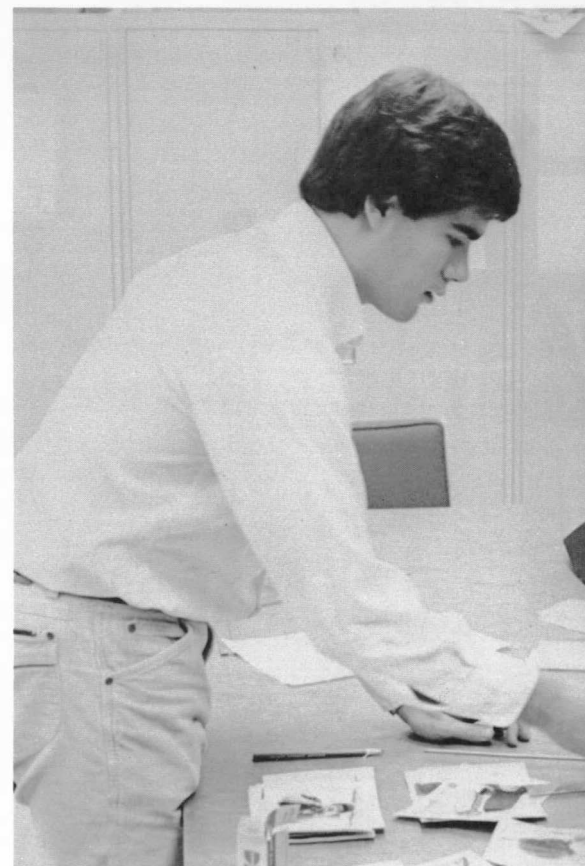

# Retrospect '81-'82

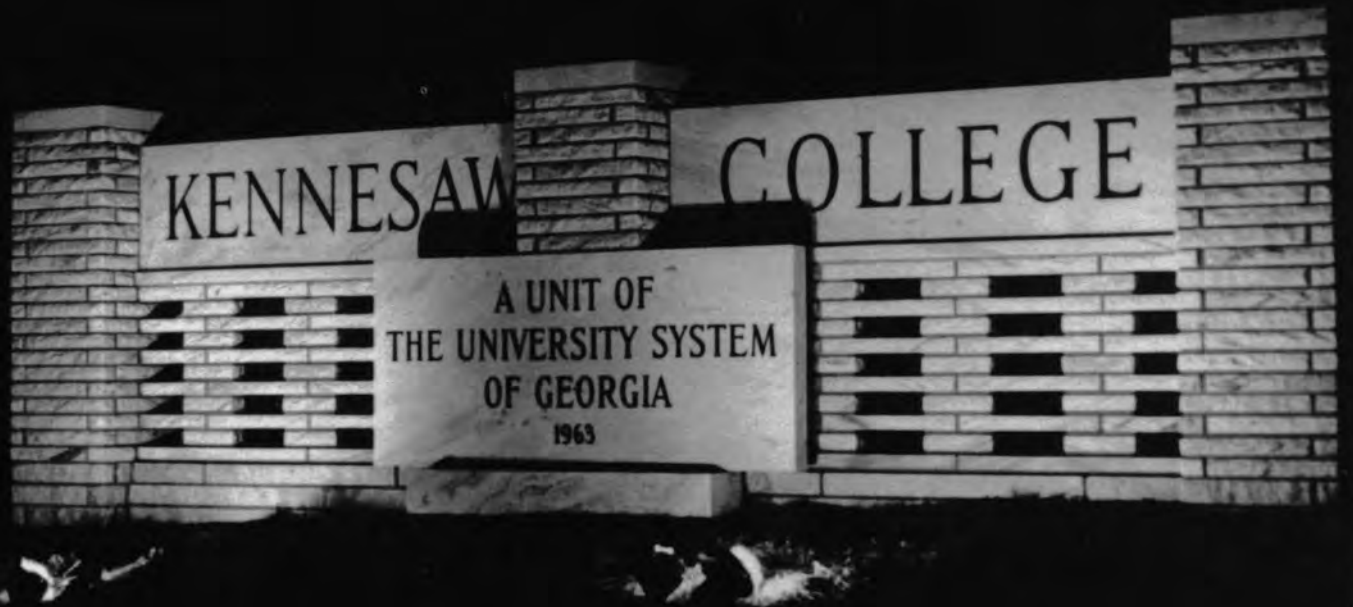
