


The past year has been a time of continuous change not only in the world, but more importantly here at Kennesaw College. These events that touched our lives may have seemed small and insignificant at the time, but they have actually influenced us a great deal. The development that stems from those events has, from one year to the next, made a very big impression in all our lives. We, as the editors of the '83 **Montage.** Kennesaw, sitting on a 152-acre tract of land, was officially opened in 1966 as a junior college. Dr. Horace Sturgis, president of the college from 1965 until 1981, provided leadership in the transformation from junior to senior college status. Effective in the fall of 1978, Kennesaw received a four-year status. In August of 1981, Dr. Betty Siegel was inaugurated and became the first female president in the University System of Georgia.


We, as the editors of the '83 **Montage**, strove to select a theme which would embody the positive growth exemplified at K.C. over the past twenty years. The 1983 **Montage** is a celebration of the development of Kennesaw College. As a result of much brainstorming the staff chose to describe this growth as "Emerging From Within". Just as the butterfly begins life as a small insignificant creature and flourishes into a wonder of beauty, so Kennesaw College has grown to meet the needs of it students faculty, and community. System of Georgia. Physical additions since 1966 include the Carmichael Student Center, a Music building, a Humanities building, an Administrative Annex, and a 5-story library. Student enrollment has increased significantly from 1013 in 1966 to an outstanding 4805 in 1983. Yet another addition to Kennesaw was the incorporation of an intercollegiate sports program. This allowed competition with other schools in the fields of cross country, tennis, basketball, and soccer.

Studying in the library, the everything-goes atmosphere of K.C. Day, organizations and clubs, graduation day — just a few of the myriad aspects that make up student life at Kennesaw College. As the school has grown, so the opportunities for students to expand and emerge have grown. 






### STUDENTS


People we deal with daily - faculty and peers — become friends and family. At school we grow not only intellectually, but we also learn about ourselves through our dealings with others.

The inauguration of Dr. Betty Siegel as the second president of Kennesaw College began as a "Month of Celebration". Committees consisting of both faculty and students were established months in advance and preparations began for the event. Included in the preinaugural activities were a bake sale, car washes, and a schoolwide assembly where the new Alma Mater was presented. Invitations were sent to delegates representing colleges and universities across the nation.

The day began with a Continental breakfast where delegates met with K.C. faculty and student leaders. Dr. Virginia Hinton led the procession which officially began the ceremony. Local officials in attendance included Chancellor Vernon Crawford, Regent Marie Dodd, and Lieutenant Governor Zell Miller. Highlights of the ceremony included the presentation of the inaugural medallion from the Art Department and the congratulatory let-










The weekend was centered on self-awareness and communication with others. Through feedback from the group, we learned of our weaknesses and how to strengthen them with








positive thoughts. The retreat was a tremendous success evidenced by the profound changes in attitude seen back at K.C. Many new friendships were developed and many old ones strengthened.

"Teller Paints A Bleak Picture" read the Sentinel headline. Dr. Edward Teller, internationally reknown scientist, visited campus on February 15, 1983, and spoke on "how to prevent a third world catastrophe and nuclear holocaust." Dr. Teller spoke out against a nuclear freeze. "We may cease to exist as a nation by the end of this century if the nuclear freeze movement is successful!" The U.S. was compared to Russia, and was said to be considerably weaker. Dr. Teller sees nuclear weapons as the only way for the U.S. to have a chance against the Russians.






It is difficult to label the prolific activities of **Dick Gregory**. He became famous as a professional comedian. Today he is a recording artist, author, lecturer, actor, human rights activitist, social satirist, critic, philosopher, and political analyst, who combines all of these roles to serve the cause of human liberation and to alleviate human suffering brought on by ignorance and apathy.

Dick Gregory's moral passion is a

nice contrast to society's definition of success. As he has described it, "The real champion, I have come to understand, is the man who has risen to the crest of life's highest purpose — singular and complete devotion to serving one's fellow man." Dick Gregory has ardently pursued his definition of "championship" by doing the things he does best: making people laugh, making people listen and, ultimately, helping them understand one another.



National security, world debt, and the nation's economy were the main topics of Georgia's senior U.S. Senator **Sam Nunn's** address at Kennesaw College on February 14, 1983.


Senator Nunn discussed the economy, saying that President Reagan's estimated national deficit of nearly \$800 billion over the next four years could be reduced "if everyone will sacrifice a little bit so no one will have to sacrifice a lot." He also expressed concern that a world-wide trade war could lead to a depression.

According to Senator Nunn, the all-volunteer military is at its best; however, he sees a need for reinstating a draft for reserve personnel in the future. He said that the military should move toward a stronger conventional armament.

Senator Nunn concluded his lecture with enthusiastic support of the government's strong points and assurance that he is working hard to improve our country's future. January 31, Senior Judge Tom Cauthorn addresse the Student Nurses' Association of Kennesaw Colleg on child abuse. Judge Cauthorn informed KC's studer nurses that child abuse is not limited to big cities, bu takes place right here in Cobb County. Tom Cauthor is the founding president of the Cobb County Chi dren's Center, Inc. The goal of Georgia's law is rehabil tation of the family unit, rather than prosecution of th criminal. Child abuse is one crime where the victim I not always better off with the criminal behind bars – especially when that criminal is Mommy or Daddy.

In January of 1981, the Children's Center was inco porated by a group of concerned citizens for the sol purpose of establishing and operating a children's she ter. As Judge Cauthorn stated in closing, "if this she ter touches the life of just one child, it will be worth th half million dollars it will take to make it a reality."






Maya Angelou, author of the best-selling books <u>I Know Why the</u> <u>Caged Bird Sings</u> and <u>Gather To-</u> <u>gether in My Name</u>, has also written three collections of poetry and two television screenplays.

A lady of many talents with just a high school education, Ms. Angelou has been a singer, educator, dancer, author, historian, lecturer, actress, producer, editor, song writer, and playwright. In addition to all that, she also speaks six languages fluently.


In the sixties, at the request of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., she became the Northern Coordinator for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, and in 1975 Ms. Angelou received the Ladies' Home Journal "Woman of the Year Award" in Communications. She has received numerous honorary degrees, and was also appointed by former President Carter to the Commission of International Women's Year and is on the Board of Trustees of the American Film Institute. Ms. Angelou is also one of the few women members of the Directors Guild.


Maya Angelou's wealth of information and ability to speak with authority on countless subjects make her one of today's most in-demand personalities.

The K.C. Mainstage Players' hilarious production of Neil Simon's <u>God's Favorite</u> proved that the drama society does indeed have a wealth of talented actors and crew members in its fold. 
## DEATHTRAP


The newspaper is in its seventeenth year of existence and has become one of the leaders in the Georgia Press Association Senior B Division bringing home, again this year, several awards.









#### Just For Kicks

# **EMERGING INTO**



There were many events during the year which shaped our lives and affected our emotions. It was the year of the all-out Israeli assault in Lebanon that left the PLO homeless and the Israelis themselves shadowed by the horror of a massacre. It was the year of a costly air and sea war between Britain and Argentina for possession of a barren archipelago in the South Atlantic. 1982 witnessed the imperial pomp for a fallen Soviet leader in Moscow and the remembered glory of a fallen American princess in Monaco.

At home there was sorrow enough in the growing toll of joblessness and business failures and the still gloomy prospects for economic recovery. About 12 million workers were without jobs by November, as continued layoffs in the auto, steel and machine-tool industries pushed unemployment to a postwar high of 10.8 percent. Braniff International became the first American carrier since the 1930's to declare bankruptcy. The biggest corporate restructuring in American history began in December, breaking up Ma Bell's monopoly on communications.

Given the downbeat drift of events, it was not surprising that record numbers of Americans jammed into movie theatres to laugh and weep over the arrival of an egg-domed extraterrestrial visitor who enlists a young earthling in his efforts to return home. Millions also cheered when Diana, Princess of Wales, presented an infant Prince William to the world. And they prayed as

the first recipient of a permanent artificial heart implant fought gamely for his life.

Technology invaded our homes and hearts. An estimated 3 million personal computers were sold for use in living rooms and class rooms. In space, the Columbia shuttle launched its first satellite into earth orbit. And the video-game industry gobbled its way into our hearts and spare change supply.

Music also played a major role in the year's events. Fleetwood Mac's success with **Mirage** was certainly no illusion. Asia was organized as a supergroup to yield a super hit, which is exactly what happened. Broadway's singular sensation was the razzle-dazzling "Cats", based on T.S. Eliot's feline whimsy. And the men from the land down under are still hard at work climbing the charts.

In sports the Saint Louis Cardinals took the World Series and the Atlanta Braves won the National League Western Division pennant. Perhaps the culture shock of the year came when national Football League players struck for higher pay, forcing husbands to communicate with their wives for eight consecutive Sunday's! We wondered if there would ever be another Superbowl. Alabama's Crimson Tide along with the rest of the nation felt a great loss with the death of football coach Paul (Bear) Bryant.

The despair and the hope, the tragedy and the turmoil, the foolishness and the brilliance — are all incompassed in the emerging from 1982 into 1983. This past year has sometimes been hard to take. The <u>Montage</u> staff had a particularly trying year, losing two photo-editors and several staff members. With a limited staff we put in a lot of time and a tremendous amount of hard work to make this yearbook one that would stand out from the rest.

It has been a great honor and a pleasure to serve as co-editors this year. We had a wonderful faculty advisor and an unsurpassed school with which to work. We chose our theme "Emerging from Within" carefully to represent not only the rapid growth of Kennesaw College, but also the growth and experiences of the Kennesaw students.

We give special thanks to all the photographers for the countless hours spent shooting, developing, and printing the pictures that we couldn't have done without.

Thank you Pat and Frank for always understanding when we missed deadlines and for never losing faith that we would pull through. Thanks also to Dale Bennett, our company representative, for the hours of creative boosting given to us.

A very special thanks to those of you, the "crew", who were always there through the best and even the worst of it.
