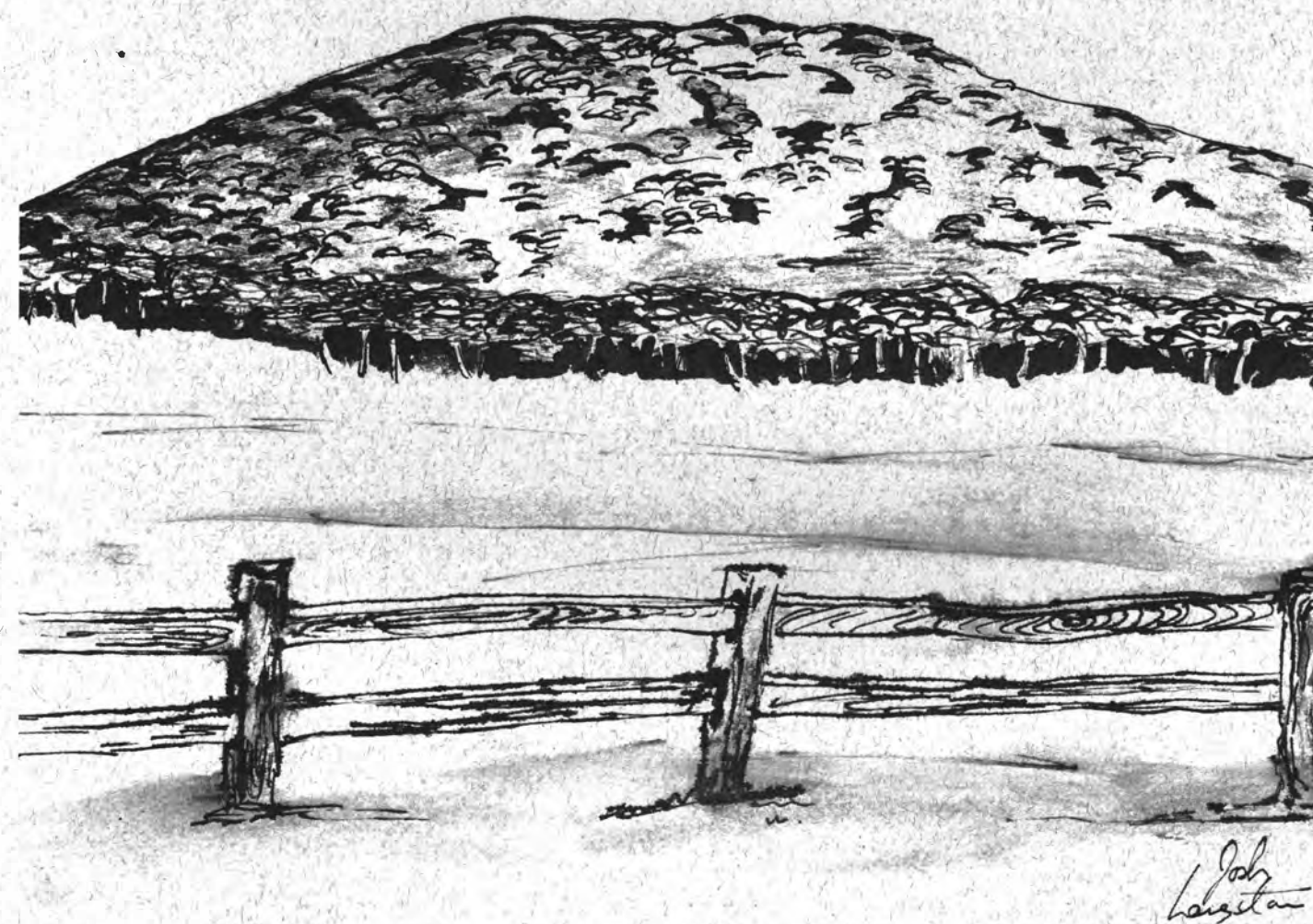
It's hard to promote causes today, especially in our complex society. What are the rewards for involvement in a cause? A bullet? or love? The opportunity is available — what is your choice?

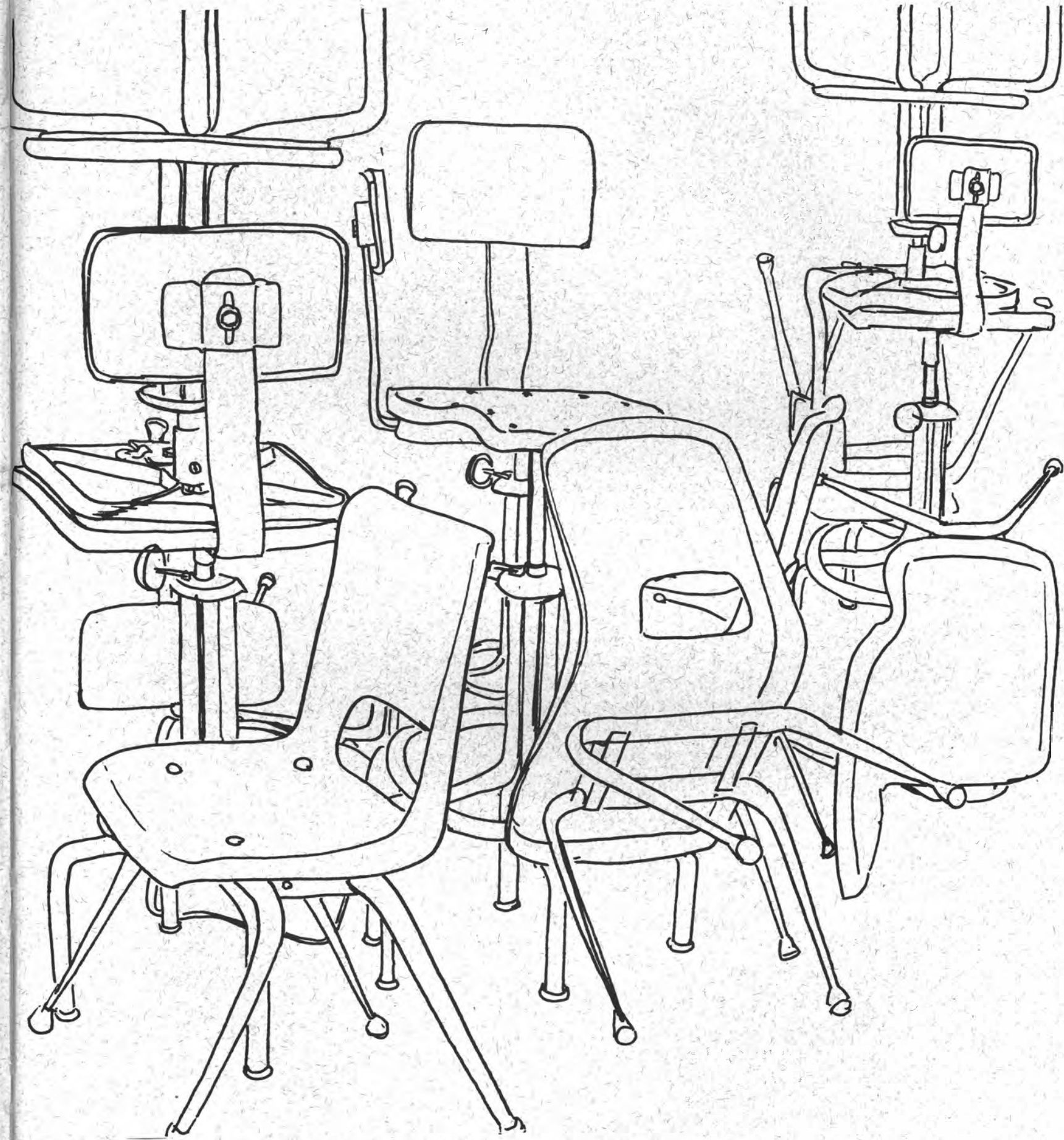

"A norm means an enduring standard. It is a law of nature which we ignore at our peril. It is a rule of human conduct and a measure of public virtue."

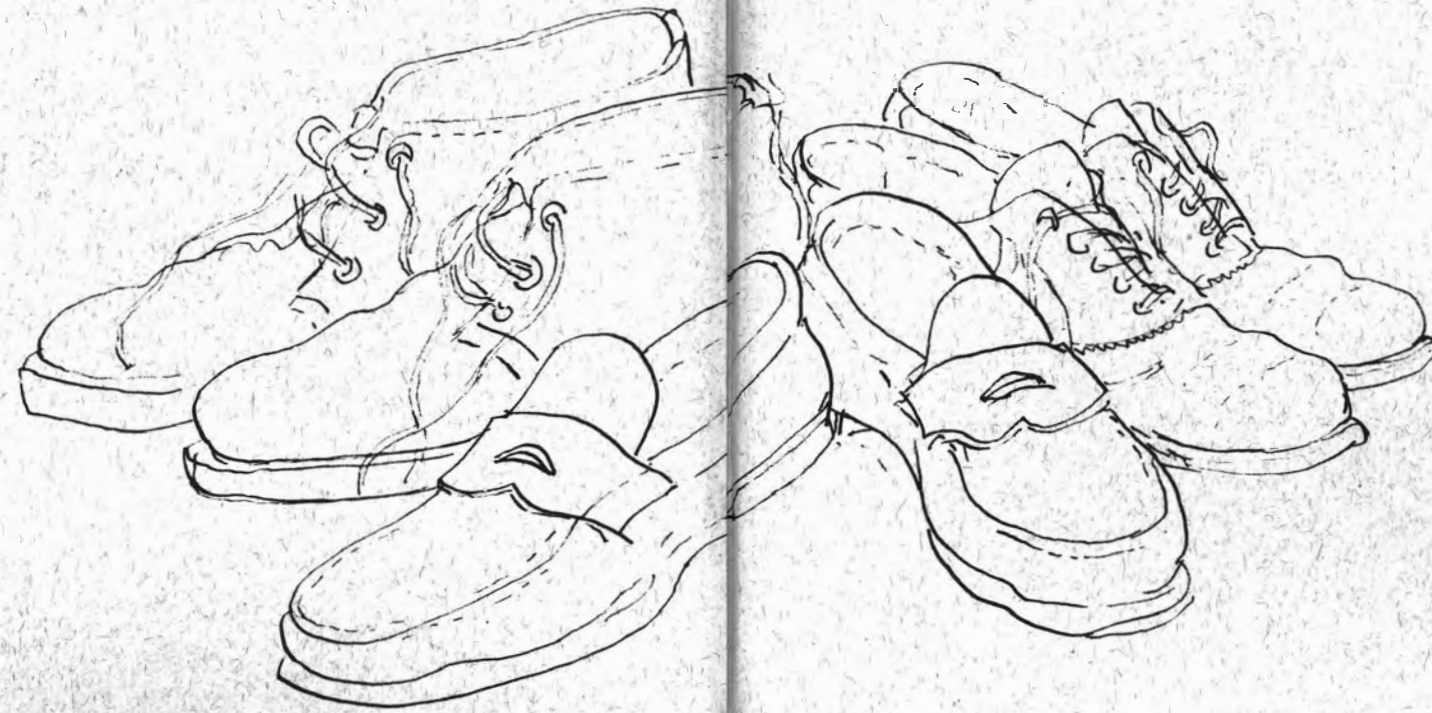

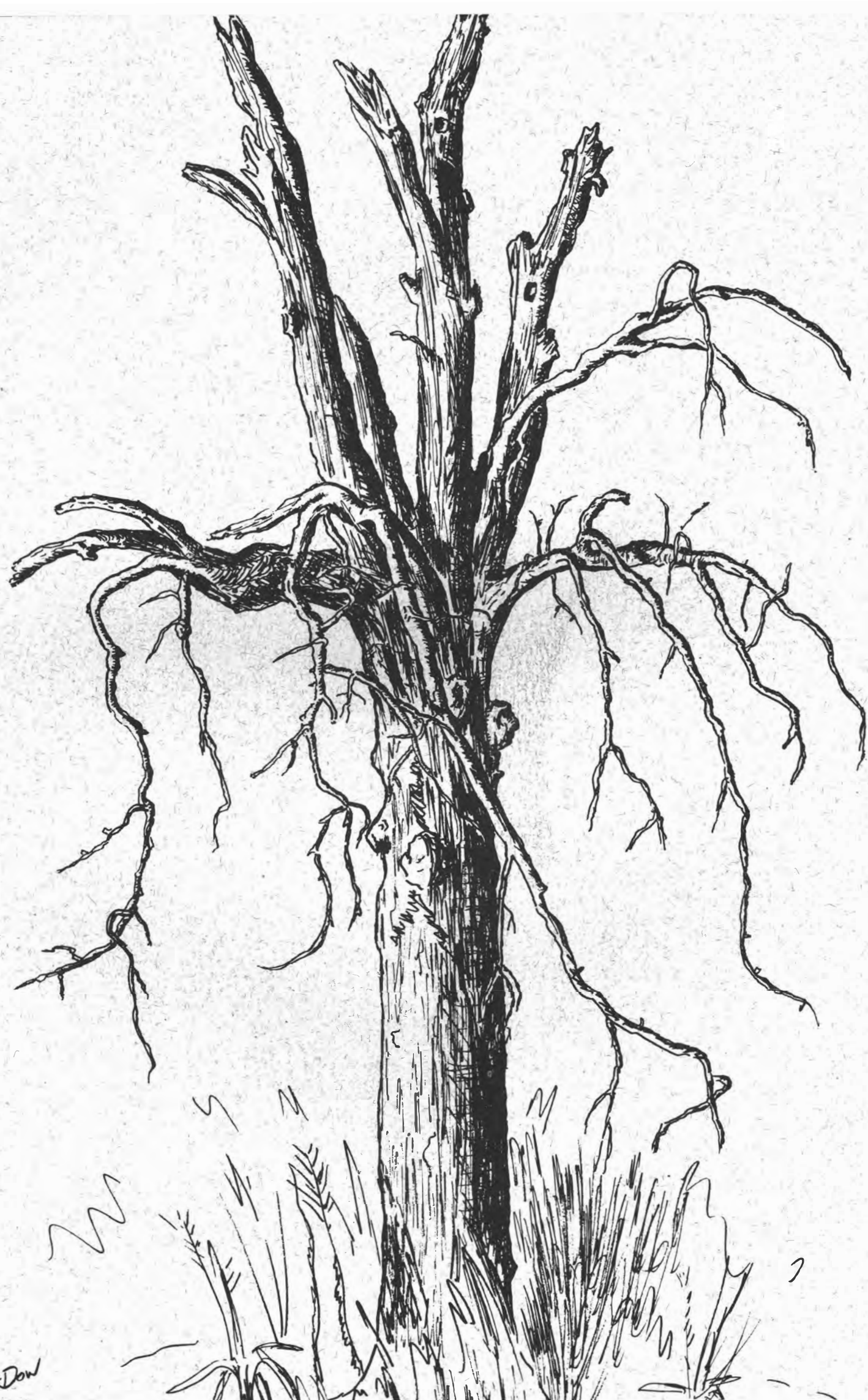
## Ode To A Fool
