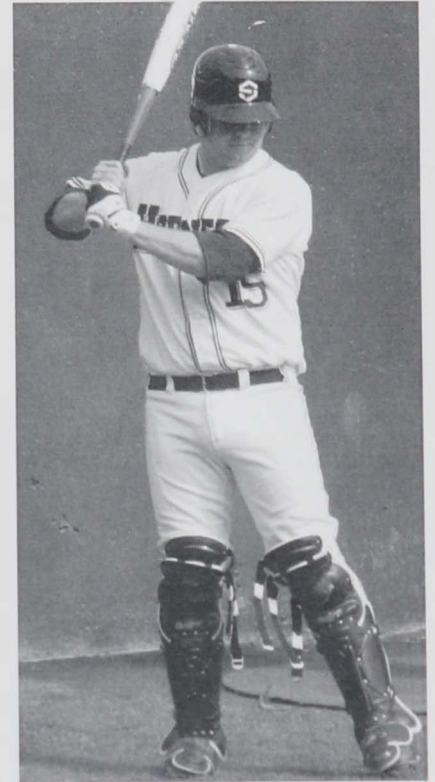

2010 Preview

Seventh-year Head Coach Matt Griffin returns a talented group of players as well as some key newcomers for the 2010 edition of Southern Polytechnic State University Baseball. The Hornets will look to continue their winning ways in the Southern States Athletic Conference. After a 53-10 overall record and a 21-6 conference record, the 2010 schedule is another tough slate that includes numerous ranked teams.

The Hornets will battle the Southern States Athletic Conference and several top teams in the NAIA. The SSAC sent three members to the World Series last season. This year, three SSAC teams are ranked in the preseason poll with two teams ranked in the top five. In addition to the tough SSAC schedule, the Hornets will also face off against a strong NCAA Division II team in West Georgia University.

SPSU returns eight position players Justin Ray (.330 BA, with 40 RBIs), Jono Waugh (.408 BA, 64 RBIs and 26 stolen bases), Jake Barrow (.430 BA, 34 RBIs and 26 stolen bases), Josh Grooms (.335 BA and 64 RBIs), Joe Wilson (.287 BA and 26 RBIs), Mason Heller (.307 BA and 33 RBIs), Jordan Bacon (.246 BA and 12 RBIs) and Ben Fleming (.299 BA and 22 RBIs) from last year's team that outscored opponents 500-235 and batted .332 with 653 hits. Redshirt freshman Noah Hanley is expected to contribute. The Hornets will have to replace hitters Chaise Oliver, Chris Hoffer and Daniel Hester in the lineup. All three graduated and were key components on last year's squad. New to SPSU are infielders Keenan Ivey, Ryan Davis, Brandan Chastain and Edmond Sparks. Outfielders battling for playing time are Andrew Root, Gary Owens and Daniel Renfro. The pitching staff returns four strong arms (2009 SSAC Conference Tournament MVP David Harden, D.J. Nordquist, Hunter Dinsmore and Zak Ivey), but did graduate the 2009 SSAC Pitcher of the Year, Sean Teague, 2008 SSAC Pitcher of the Year, Mark Doll, and bullpen ace Dustin Carder. All three have moved on to the professional ranks—Teague to the Marlins, Doll to the Phillies and Carder to the Orioles. The team will miss the leadership of Drew Saberhagen, who saw limited mound action due to injury, but whose leadership was instrumental in the team's success.

Last year, Southern Poly posted a 3.41 ERA and struck out 368 batters while holding opponents to a .266 batting average. A group of talented newcomers will join the staff this season with plans on continuing the Hornets' success on the mound. Nick Fuller, a redshirt junior will be back. Newcomers from the right side are Brad Hutson, Blake Mainor, brothers Chas and J.B. Skees, Tucker Stone and Matt Graff, who will all be looking for quality innings. Left-handers new to the pitching staff are senior Greg Hendrix and junior Ty Williams.

Catchers Daniel White, Ty Adams and Drew Banks are new additions behind the plate and will give depth to the catching position.

"Collectively, last season's squad was one of the very best in SPSU history," says Griffin. "This season, the Hornets will be pushed to duplicate their success."

Head Coaching Totals: 238 114 .676



Matt Griffin is in his seventh season as head coach of the Southern Polytechnic State University Hornets and his third year as Assistant Athletic Director. Last season, Griffin led his team to the NAIA World Series in Lewiston, Idaho, the first Hornets appearance since 1986. The 2009 season also saw several records shattered including the all time single season win total with 53 wins and the highest ever recorded NAIA National Ranking at number 4 in the country. Griffin achieved a career milestone in 2009, winning his 200th game at SPSU. He was also named the ABCA Regional Coach of the Year and coached the 2009 First Team All-American Shortstop, Jono Waugh and 2009 NAIA World Series All-Tournament Team Second Baseman, Jake Barrow. Under his direction, three Hornet pitchers signed professional contracts – Sean Teague, 2009 SSAC Pitcher of the Year, Florida Marlins; Mark Doll, 2008 SSAC Pitcher of the Year, Philadelphia Phillies; and Dustin Carter, Baltimore Orioles.

In his previous six years at SPSU, Griffin has accrued a 238-114 (.676) record and has posted a winning record each of those years with an average of 40 wins per year. Starting with the 2004 season, Griffin began to build a program that is now known nationally as a NAIA elite program. The Hornets have won three Conference Tournament Championships, have advanced to NAIA Regional play four times, and one World Series appearance under Griffin's leadership. In 2007, Coach Griffin was named the Southern States Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. Griffin was also awarded the Georgia Dugout Club Coach of the Year in 2007 and 2008.

Formerly, Griffin was a North East Georgia All-Star shortstop at Stephens County High School in Toccoa, Georgia. Following his senior year, Griffin signed to play for the Georgia State University baseball program. After one season, Griffin transferred to SPSU and had a stellar career. In his junior and senior seasons, Griffin was named to the GAC All-Conference team as a shortstop. Griffin's resume as a collegiate player has him the holder of several Hornets hitting records and is currently second in career home runs.

In the 1998 Major League Baseball Draft, Griffin was picked by the Chicago Cubs and reported to the short-season A-ball affiliate in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. During Griffin's first season of play, he saw most of his action as a middle infielder in the New York Penn League. For Griffin's second season, he was sent to Michigan to play for the Lansing Lugnuts as a utility infielder of the Midwest League.

Griffin is originally from St. Marys, Pennsylvania, but grew up in Toccoa, Georgia. He earned his bachelor's degree in Business Management from Southern Polytechnic State University. He and his wife Leslie, a civil engineer at Geosyntec Consultants, have a daughter named Grace and a son named Luke; they reside in Dallas, GA.

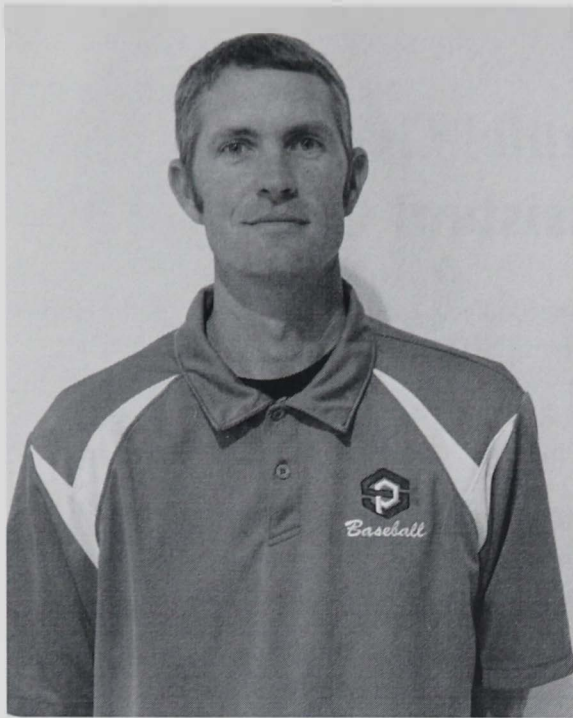

Gary Bohannon

Assistant Coach

Gary Bohannon enters his seventh season as assistant coach of the Hornets. After a successful college and professional career, Bohannon has shaped the Hornet pitching staff to one of the best in the SSAC, as well as the NAIA. In 2009, the Hornets ranked third in the country in team ERA.

While a player at baseball powerhouse Kennesaw State University (1997-98), Bohannon helped guide the Owls to the College World Series twice and compiled a 16-2 career pitching record.

At the completion of his KSU career, he was drafted in the 38th round of the 1998 MLB Draft by the New York Mets. From there Bohannon's 6-3 record on the mound in the Appalachian League (1998) earned him All-Star honors. His stats for that season included a 2.56 ERA with 49 strikeouts in 60 innings, and only 5 walks. Bohannon stayed in the Mets organization through 2000 and was named Organizational Pitcher of the Month in June of 2000 for 26 scoreless innings, including inherited runners.

Bohannon came to the Hornets program after spending two years as an assistant at Chattanooga State (2002-03). Bohannon is married to the former Bonnie Smith. The couple have a son, Cohen William, born February 22, 2008, and reside in Dallas, GA.

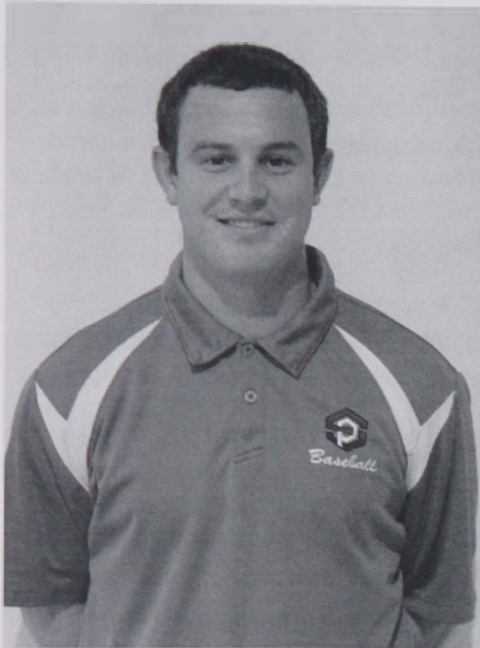

Daniel Griffin Assistant Coach



Daniel Griffin is entering his second year as an assistant coach of the Hornets. Griffin played three seasons for SPSU and was a two time all-conference selection. Along with his many accolades, Griffin broke the SPSU single season record for batting average with a .452 mark. 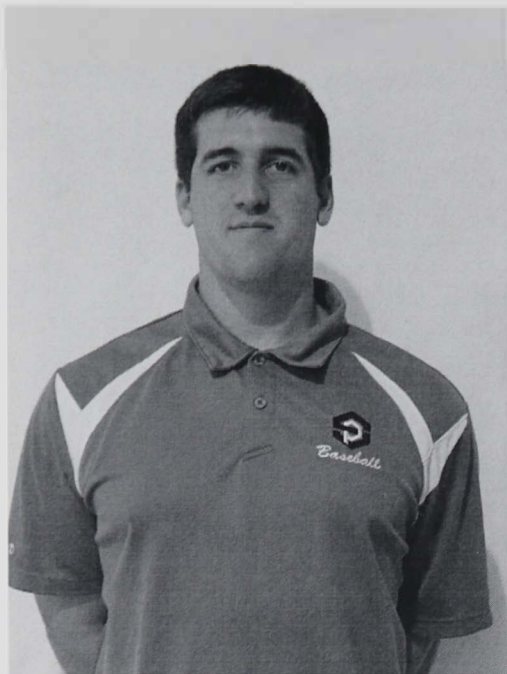
Rob Ehlers Assistant Coach

Southern Polytechnic State University

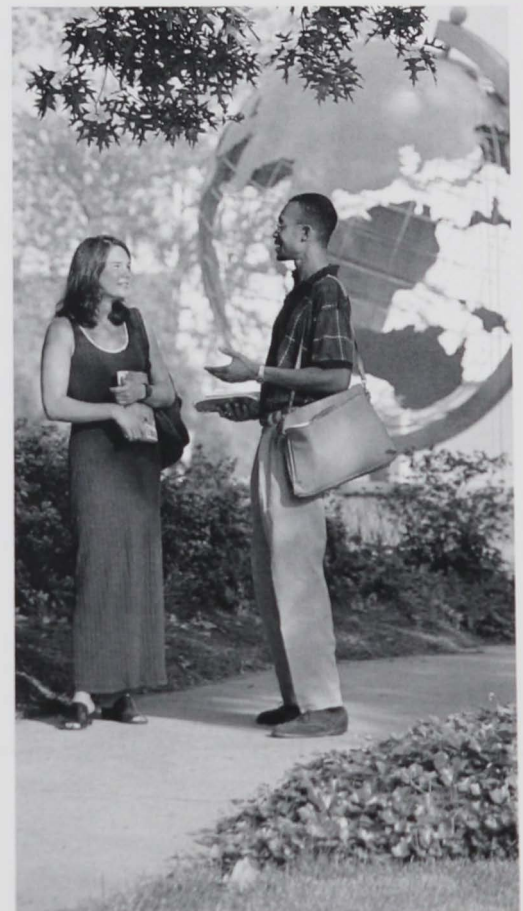
Founded in 1948 as a two-year division of Georgia Institute of Technology, SPSU was established at the request of Georgia business and industry. It first opened its doors as the Technical Institute in Chamblee, Georgia, with 116 students, all but 10 being World War II veterans, and a staff of 12.

In 1949, SPSU became the Southern Technical Institute and was recognized as a college-level school by the U.S. Department of Education. Less than a decade later, the college migrated to its present campus in Marietta, Georgia.

In 1961, Hoyt McClure was named acting director and led the movement to build eight new buildings on 120 acres of land. Since then we have continued to expand--our campus now encompasses more than 230 acres and contains 35 buildings.

SPSU became accredited as a four-year college in 1970, and was one of the first colleges in the nation to offer the bachelor of Engineering Technology degree. We also earned independence in the University System, separating ties with Georgia Tech. In the summer of 1980, SPSU officially became the 14th senior college and the 33rd independent unit of the University System.

The college's first president, Dr. Stephen R. Cheshier of Purdue University, was named in 1980 and served with distinction until his retirement as president in June 1997. He saw SPSU through two name changes--Southern College of Technology in 1987 and Southern Polytechnic State University in the summer of 1996, when the school also became a university. Dr. Daniel S. Papp served as interim president from July of 1997 to August of 1998, when the university welcomed Dr. Lisa Rossbacher, formerly of Dickinson College, as its president.

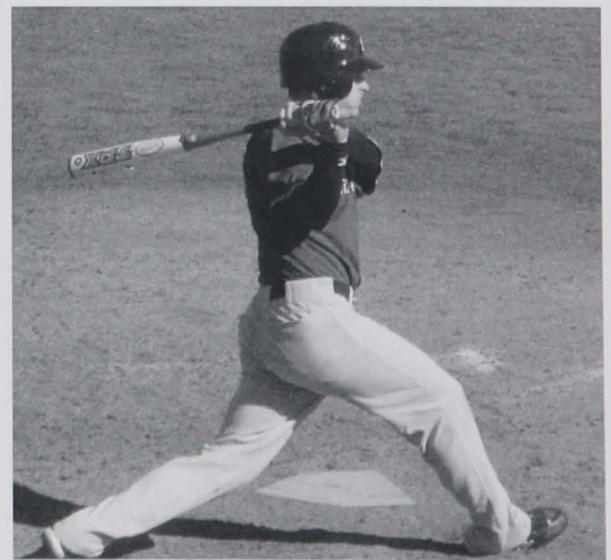
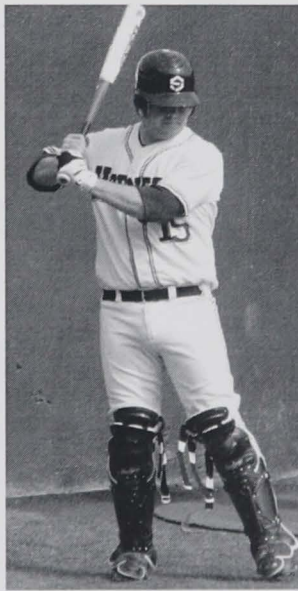

The association that would become the NAIA started in 1937 with the organization of a basketball tournament for small colleges. In 1940, tournament officials formally organized as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball (NAIB). In 1952, the addition of three other sports prompted a name change to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

The NAIA has always been a trailblazing organization – from racial integration to athletic opportunities for women. A strong focus on character development and academics is apparent in the organization's programming and standards. The NAIA's legacy of innovation continues, with the development of the Champions of Character program, which teaches key values in sports. NAIA academic standards require a minimum 2.0 G.P.A. on a 4.0 scale for all student-athletes. Our Champions of Character program, which was launched in 2000, addresses character issues more comprehensively than any other national program for youth.

Today, the Champions of Character program reaches 650,000 students in nearly 300 NAIA member colleges and universities throughout the United States and Canada. Hundreds of NAIA students are recognized each year as All-America Scholar-Athletes, and thousands more are recognized at the conference level. The NAIA offers 23 championships in 13 sports – and helps all students prepare to be champions in life.

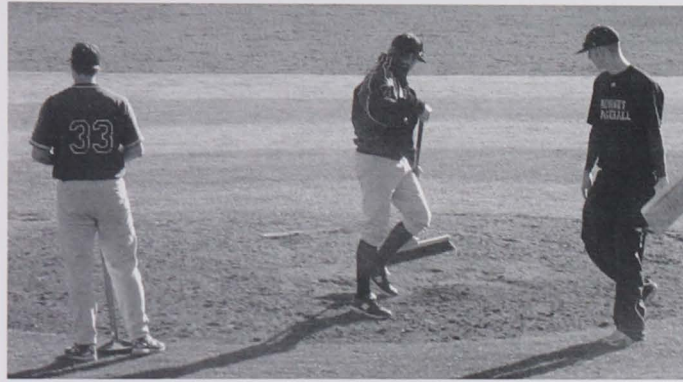

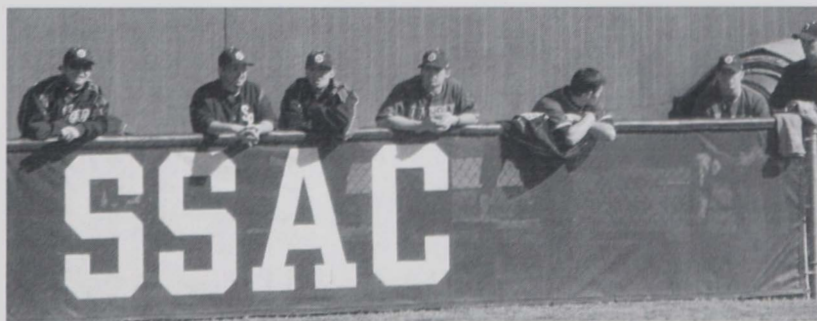
