


President's Message



About SPSU

Southern Polytechnic State University is a member of the University System of Georgia and serves a commuter as well as residential student body. Located in the historic, vibrant city of Marietta, Southern Polytechnic is only 20 minutes from downtown Atlanta. Approximately 4,000 traditional and non-traditional students attend classes during the day, evening,, and on weekends on a campus that combines 232 acres of naturally-wooded landscape with modern facilities to meet students' academic, physical, and social needs.

Founded in 1948 as a two-year division of the Georgia Institute of Technology at the request of the Georgia Business and Industry Association, the University celebrated its 50th anniversary in 1998. Over the years there have been many changes; among the most significant was the establishment of the institution as an independent college in the University System of Georgia.

The University offers associate, baccalaureate, and master's degree programs in a variety of technology and science-related fields through the Colleges of Technology and Arts and Sciences and the Schools of Architecture and Management. Students have a wide range of choices from a two-year core curriculum associate degree in general studies to master of science programs in several fields. Since its founding in 1948, the University has earned an exceptional reputation in the field of engineering technology. Over the years, Southern Polytechnic has expanded and broadened its degree programs in some of the nation's fastest growing fields and offers a diverse Arts and Science curriculum. The School of



Architecture earned candidacy for its accreditation by the National Architecture Accrediting Board in less than two years, becoming the only institution offering a nationally accredited Bachelor of

Acrhitecture degree in Georgia. Southern Polytechnic is an educational institution of "firsts." In the fall of 1997, Southern Polytechnic stepped to the forefront of technological advances in education, becoming the first institution in Georgia to offer a full degree program over the Internet - the Master of Science in Quality Assurance.



Southern Polytechnic provides many learning opportunities beyond the classroom-professional student organizations; Greek organizations; the student newspaper, The Sting; intramural programs; honor societies; WGHR student radio station; and other acitivites and organizations, including intercollegiate athletics.

onship was the first for Southern Polytechnic since the 1987-88 season. The Hornets proceeded to win the GACC Tournament by an average margin of 21 points per game.

It was a year that started to build a basketball tradition at Southern Polytechnic and saw the program flourish under Head Coach Mike Helfer. Helfer has led the Hornets for 3 seasons and has an overall record of 58-41 during that stretch. The 1999-2000 team was his first with all of his own "recruited" players. For his efforts, Helfer was named the GACC Men's Basketball Coach of the Year and the GACC Men's Sports Coach of the Year.

"We have worked hard to get to the top of the mountain," said Helfer. "It's very difficult to win a championship and the credit goes to our players.


They go through the conditioning, practice, and make all of the plays. I just try to focus on the chemistry."

SPSU continued to build on its "up-tempo" style of play by averaging almost 90 points per game during the 1999-2000 campaign. That placed the Hornets 4th in the country in scoring in all of NAIA Division I. Their full court pressing defense forced an unbelievable 27 turnovers per game. "It's a style of play that I believe in and want our players to believe in," said Helfer. "We try to pressure for 40 minutes and utilize a lot of players, which in turn gives opportunities to many different guys to contribute."



The 2000-01 season offers a bright future for SPSU. The Hornets return 11 of 14 players including 4 starters. The nucleus is in tact, but Helfer brought in some quality recruits to add to the fire. Most importantly, he added size to the inside game by adding 3 players 6'6" or taller.

"We will have experience and you can't buy that.
Our focus will be blending the old players with the
new ones and working as a team," said Helfer. "Each
year presents new challenges and new goals. We
want to continue to build a basketball tradition here
and if we work hard and stay together, then we can do
it."





MIKE HELFER Head Coach (4th Year)

Capital University '89

Mike Helfer is entering his fourth year as the head men's basketball coach at Southern Polytechnic. The SPSU program has reached unbelievable heights during Helfer's first 3 seasons. Last year, the "Runnin Hornets" finished 28-7 and won both the Georgia-Alabalma-Carolina Conference regular season and tournament Championships. SPSU went to the NAIA Div. I National Championship in Tulsa, Oklahoma for the first time since 1987. The Runnin' Hornets defeated Point Loma Nazarene in the opening round and advanced to the "Sweet 16" before losing to eventual National Champion Life Univiersity.

Helfer was named the GACC Men's Basketball Conference Coach of the Year for his efforts during the 1999-00 season. He was also named the Male Conference Coach of the Year, which includes all of the Mens's sports in the GACC.

Prior to SPSU, Helfer was at Grand Valley State University, where he served as the top assistant during the 1996-97 season. Grand Valley won the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference regular season and tournament championship while he was on staff. GVSU advanced to the NCAA Div. II National Tournament in March of 1997.

Before heading to Grand Valley, Helfer was an assistant at NCAA Division I, Kent State University, from 1991-96. Kent State is a member of the always competitive Mid American Conference.

Helfer graduated with a bachelor's degree from Capital University, located in Columbus, Ohio. He played 4 years for the Crusaders and was named a team captain his senior year. During his career, he started for 3 seasons and led CU to the NCAA Division III National Tournament during his senior year with a 21-6 overall mark. He also holds a Master's Degree in Sport Administration from Kent State.

Championships have followed Helfer along his athletic path. As a player in high school, he won two State high school football championships at Newark Catholic High School in Newark, Ohio. He also lettered 3 years in basketball and track and won the Knights of Columbus Award given each year to the outstanding student-athlete at NC.

Helfer has been a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches for 11 years and is currently serving as the chair of the GACC Men's Basketball committee.

Q & A WITH HEAD COACH MIKE HELFER

What is your coaching philosophy?

"First, I want to make sure that each and every one of my players receives a quality education and obtains his degree from Southern Polytechnic. Second, I believe that a coach has the ability to directly affect the lives of the young men that he is leading. I want this to be a very positive relationship that develops beyond the playing floor and exists after graduation. It is important to teach the game of basketball, but it is also important to teach about the game of life."

What did the GACC Championship and National Tournament trip do for the basketball program?

"It taught us to believe in hard work and commitment by a large group of individuals. If you stay focused on your goal and come together, then you can accomplish anything you set out to do. The National Tournament helped put our program on the map. However, to be a permanent fixture on that map, we have to be consistent each year and that means we have to continue to raise the bar and the expectations that we have in our program."

What are the positives about Southern Polytechnic?

"In my mind, Southern Polytechnic is truly a hidden gem. We are a leader in the world of technology and our University ranks second to none. The faculty and staff care about the students and because of our size, each student can benefit from smaller classes and a true learning environment. Potential students need to come and see our University in person and if that happens, I believe they will make the decision to come here."

What is your recruiting philosophy?

"We look at three different categories when we recruit student-athletes for our program. First, we want players who are good students. They must want to receive a quality education and we will make sure that they get it. Second, we recruit players who are good people. I believe in bringing in student-athletes that have character and solid beliefs in who they are and what they stand for. Finally, we want to bring in good players. We want to build a program that can compete for a National Championship year in and year out."

What style of play will fans see when they come to a Runnin' Hornet game?


"Our style of play is very uptempo and exciting to watch. We will put an extreme amount of pressure on the opponents in the full court, both offensively and defensively. We believe in forcing the tempo and utilizing a lot of players. Our style is one that we believe in and one that fits into a championship formula."


What do you think is a good description of the quality of play in the GACC?

"The Georgia-Alabama-Carolina Conference is very underrated in the Southeast. Our conference is strong from top to bottom and consistently has great athletes who can really play the game of basketball. Last year we sent 3 teams to the NAIA Div. I National Tournament in Tulsa, Ok. There are coaches and players in the GACC that know the game of basketball and know how to compete. You can't rest on any given night and that is a sign of a very good conference."

What would you tell a high school student-athlete who is preparing to come to SPSU?

"First, I would tell them to get ready to begin a journey that will change their lives forever. The education and experiences they receive here will affect both their career and personal paths in life. Second, I would tell them to take advantage of everything we have to offer. The resources here are endless and to not take advantage of them would be a big mistake. Finally, they must realize that they are coming into a family and we believe in taking care of each other here at SPSU."






Assistant Coach - Jeff Wilson Capital University - 1990

Jeff Wilson is beginning his fourth season as the top assistant to Coach Helfer. Wilson played three years competitively with Helfer at Capital University from 1986-89. He lettered three seasons at Capital and set a national free throw percentage record (94%) during his senior year. In the Spring of 1990, he graduated from CU with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration.

Prior to coming to Southern Polytechnic, Wilson was an assistant at Marietta College in Marietta, Ohio for 3 years. During his stay, the Pio-

neers posted three of the best years in school history. Before joining the staff at Marietta, Wilson was an assistant at Capital for 2 years.

"I always knew that I would love to coach. It is important for me to be involved with young athletes and give them some direction as a role model as they progress through their college experience. I am looking forward to continuing the successful tradition that we have built here at SPSU."



Assistant Coach - Troy Youngs State University of New York - 1988

Troy Youngs is beginning his second season as an assistant to Coach Helfer. Youngs played at the Junior College level for Herkimer County Community College in upstate New York. In his freshman year they won the Mountain Valley Conference Title. He holds an AAS in Data Processing and a BS in Computer Science from the State University of New York at Utica.

Prior to coming to Southern Polytechnic, Youngs was a Girl's Varsity Head Coach at Holland Patent High School from 1993-97 and the top as-

sistant for the Girl's Varsity Team at Canastota High School from 1987-92. He has run several youth programs and helped assisted at various college camps. Currently he is active with the Kennesaw Mountain Youth Basketball Association and Metro Programs. Troy resides in Acworth, Ga. with wife Bonnie, children Daneille and Troy Jr.

"Since I started coaching in 1987, I have wanted to get to the college level. This has been a great experience for myself and my family. I am extremely grateful to Mike, Jeff, the Team and the entire SPSU family for giving me this opportunity."



Assistant Coach - Jim LaPointe Louisiana Baptist Unviversity -1994



Representing the state of Alabama are Auburn University at Montgomery and Faulkner University. In South Carolina, Southern Wesleyan is the lone member school.

The conference headquarters are located in Dahlonega, Georgia. The GACC commissioner is William E. Ensley. Bill Ensley is in an elite group of individuals having been inducted into the NAIA National Hall of Fame both as a player and a coach.

The conference was started in 1949 as the Georgia Intercollegiate Athletics Conference with six member schools - Oglethorpe Univer-

and Georgia Southern College. Only North Georgia

The conference became the Georgia Athletic Conference in 1980 and remained under this name until 1998 when it came under it's current name, the Geor-

The GACC has worked hard over the years to have member schools that live by an equally strong educational and athletic base.

Since the conference's beginning and affiliation with the NAIA, 12 GACC schools have claimed National Championships, nine athletes have claimed individual national titles; 15 teams have finished as National Runner-up; 157 student-athletes have received All-America Selections; and there have been over 500 All-American Scholar Athletes.

The NAIA....

SPSU is a member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA).

The NAIA is a national organization with more than 300 institutional members that serve more than 57,000 student-athletes in North America. It's current national office is located in Tulsa, Ok; however the national office is planning a relocation in the year 2001. The final site relocation is yet to be determined.

The purpose of the NAIA is to promote the education and development of students through intercollegiate athletic participation. Member institutions, although

> varied and diverse, share a common commitment to high standards and to the principle that participation in athletics serves as an integral part of the total educational process.

Throughout the history of the NAIA, strong leadership and direction has been provided for all aspects of intercollegiate athletics. The NAIA has stepped forward as a leader across the country and has not backed down from instituting change when needed. The organization tackled racial integration in the 1940's and 50's and established it's first women's championship program in 1980.

The NAIA has a primary governing body, the Council of President's. This body is comprised of 32 presidents of both college's and universities across the United States.

Within it's structure, the NAIA embraces the concept of the student and recognizes the importance of the individuality of each member institution, the value of conference and regional structure, and the benefits of membership in a national association.

The NAIA recognizes many student-athletes each year as All-American's and Scholar Athlete's. Thousands more are recognized at the regional and conference level throughout the country.

The NAIA conducts 23 championship events for 13 different sports each season, including 11 for women.

The National Tournament for Men's Basketball will be held in Tulsa, Ok this year. The dates for the tournament are March 14-20.


A LOOK BACK AT TULSA......

The Southern Polytechnic State University Men's Basketball Team reached unbelievable heights during the 1999-2000 campaign. For the first time in 13 years, the Runnin' Hornets went to Tulsa, OK to compete in the NAIA Division I National Championship. After finishing the regular season at 24-6, SPSU went on to win the Georgia-Alabama-Carolina Conference tournament. The Hornets earned one of the GACC automatic bids to the Nationals and were on their way to compete for the National Championship.

The Runnin' Hornets were rewarded for their accomplishments during the regular season by receiving the 16th seed in Tulsa. A total of 32 teams compete for the championship. SPSU was matched in the first round against Point Loma Nazarene, located in San Diego, CA. The Hornets started quickly and built a 23 point halftime lead. In the second half, cold shooting brought back PLN and the Hornet's lead was only 6 with 5:00 minutes to play. However, SPSU regained their momentum and won 74-65. It was the first time a Hornet team had won a game at the Nationals since 1982.

SPSU had the undaunting task of playing the #1 seed, Life University, in the second round. The Hornets and Life are located about 1/4 mile from each other in Marietta, GA. It is a natural rivalry because of location; however, with a National Championship involved, the rivalry only grew bigger. Life proved why they were ranked #1 in the country by handling the Hornets and defeating them by a score of 90-65.

"I was very pleased with the way our guys competed in Tulsa. It's a great accomplishment to make it to the round of 16," said SPSU Head Coach Mike Helfer. "Hopefully we learned a lot about what it takes to continue to advance. The experience should help us this year, but we must remember that it doesn't guarantee us anything."
