
### THE NAIA

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association which administers programs leading to national championships in 15 events for more than 500 fully-accredited four-year colleges and universities in all 50 states and Canada.

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball the NAIB evolved from the institution of a "National Small College Basketball Tournament" which was inaugurated in 1937. In 1952, the NAIB expanded to include tennis, outdoor track and golf, and that year the organization was renamed the NAIA.

Since that time the NAIA has further enlarged to encompass football (two divisions were formed in 1970), cross country, baseball and swimming, which were added to the NAIA championship program in 1956, wrestling (1958), soccer (1959), gymnastics (1964), indoor track (1966), ice hockey (1968) and volleyball (1969).

With its national headquarters and staff located in Kansas City, MO., the NAIA is organized into 31 districts. The District Executive Committee is the governing body in each District with the District Chairman serving as the chief officer. Within the district an eligibility chairman and publicity chairman are appointed to handle various duties.



A major factor in the success of the NAIA program is the importance placed on "grass roots" organization, in which each district administers and organizes the programs of the schools within their own district. The districts are usually small enough in the number of schools involved that each individual institution has a major voice in the policy and decision-making process within that district. This procedure carries forward to the national level, where each of the 31 districts have an equal voice in national matters.

The NAIA clearly outlines its own responsibilities and those of its members: a sound athletic program, administered and controlled by those responsible for the administration of the college or university. The NAIA encourages a broad program of athletic pursuits in its member institutions and aims at uniformity and equity in policies and practices through its district and national championship events.

Eligibility rules in the NAIA govern all competition in sports recognized by the NAIA, not just post-season competition. These rules must be adhered to by all NAIA member institutions, including those members holding dual affiliations with other associations. NAIA member institutions must pay the annual membership dues and be in support of the policies of the Association.


This task requires many components that work together to give each student a well rounded college experience. The technical coursework is vital, but must be supported by courses in the humanities, science, and outside activities.

The task of the 1982-83 edition of the Running Hornets is clear: to maintain the winning tradition that has seen the gym wall decorated with nine banners celebrating the conference and district championships of the last five years. But two-time Georgia Coach of the Year George Perides has his work cut out for him. There is no way to replace all time leader Mike Jones, all district small forward Baxter Thomas, and All-Americans Ricky Hudson and Billy Bromell. Also lost to graduation were center Cylde Franklin and guards Ronnie Ward and Charlie Glass.

The Hornets face their toughest non-conference schedule in years as many coaches are becoming reluctant to play STI. This year the Hornets will play tough non-conference foes in Covenant College, Allen University, Wisconsin-Eau Claire, Birmingham Southern, and reigning national champions, the University of South Carolina at Spartanburg. The Hornets will get to play Spartanburg twice! In the GIAC, Georgia Southwestern, LaGrange and North Georgia have had outstanding recruiting seasons and will seek to end the Tech stranglehold on the championship.

But this is not to say that the cupboard is bare. Guards Kenny Peterson, E. J. Abood, Jacobey Simmons and Brad Barnard are returning. Forwards Alan Payne, Greg Fluellen and Jesse Walton will see plenty of action this season. Joe Burgess, Rodney Carter, and Walter Spearman are newcomers who will see action on the front line. Jerome Powell, another transfer, will play at the post, and Randy Ridley, Ron Porter, Angelo Anthony and Charlie Williams will add speed and outside shooting to the offense from the guard position.

Coach George Perides must blend the old and the new. Defense, enthusiasm, execution and dedication have been signs of the Perides' teams in the past. Given time and desire, this team should become a very exciting one to watch. See you at the Nest!



In Perides six seasons at Southern Tech, the Hornets have compiled an 143-53 record and have laid claim to the NAIA District 25 title for a record five straight years. In making the NAIA National Tournament for each of the five years they have been an NAIA member, Southern Tech has posted a 138 and 32 won-loss record for a .812 percentage and an average of 27.6 wins a season.

George Perides came to Southern Tech from small Palm Beach Atlantic College in West Palm Beach, Fla. where his team made one trip to Kansas City and posted an 82-43 mark over four seasons. Overall in ten seasons as a college head coach the Perides worksheet shows an 225 and 96 coaching record.

Assisting Coach Perides for the second year is RICHARD STALLWORTH. Stallworth built an impressive record while playing for the Runnin' Hornets. In his Senior season, Stallworth was noted as a strong defensive and play-making guard.






