indiri als, under the horrid cruelties that are daily exercifed to maintain the prefent fystem of govern ment by the Congress and Committees, reftrain me is and other evidence public. when the time shall arrive that may render fuch communications proper, I am perfusded the world will applied my felf denial in refuling myfelf the fatisfaction of publishing to complete a refutation of the afperfions attempted to be threwn on my character by the refo utions of the Congress, founded on a species of tellimony that sould not affect me on any rule of er dence, or any fair conftruction of language.
