March meeting, but few attending, the snow heing deep, the party present, voted to build but one house, and that in a place in the woods, remote three miles from the settlements and ten miles from a great part of the inhabitants, and voted the money sufficient for the frame which they forthwith erecked, and to make all sure tacks on some boards, to the value of nine pounds more than they had voted to be raised to prevent (as is supposed) its being taken down.

Maich 1773. At a sull meeting, after debating the matter, it was voted by a great insjority, that there should be three houses built agreable to the vote of the said committee, and that the frame should be taken down, and a committee was accordingly chosen for that purpose, viz. Alexander Nickells, Etg.; Deacon Jones, and Mr. Robert Sprout.

At May meeting a party had it inferted in the warrant to reconsider the above vote, it being a sull meeting it was voted by a great m jority, not to reconsider it.

On the 7th June. The said committee attended the husiness and employed therefor about 40 hands, and transported what rigging they could get, seven miles to the said frame, it being three miles in the woods remote from the body of the settlement, the said committee and company in general carried their provisions to encump there one or two nights.

F S the public have several times of late As the public have leveral times of late her favored through the channel of the her favored to find, and fuch a regiment of militia in the province.—I have been led to the following observations, viz.

First, What is the end and designed forming a militia?—is it not this, namely, that by disciplining (and forming to some degree soldiers) a certain part of the community they may become

certain part of the community they may become both as to offence and defence, the guard of the flate.—And in order to their answering this im-

portant design,

Secondly, It is of the last importance (if any real advantage is ever to be expected from them) that they be taught the use, end, and design of discipline, as it respects subordination, the manual exercise and the managures—as from the first ari-fes that strict attention so absolutely essential in foldiers, from the second the dexterous and agile handling of their arms in the most useful and expeditious motion—from the third the changing their position with the utmost exactness and expedition; as circumstances may render it necessary in the field of battle, and the importance of each in assimpty the most lively representations should be impressed on their minds, and every thing su-persuous or dangerous should be exploded—

from hence then,
Thirdly, Since such vast improvements have been made in the ari of war,—and so little time alotted to the militia (only four days annually) to acquire military knowledge and skill in the use of arms.—It is highly expedient that the best modes and methods of discipline should be practifed—and fuch in special as are calculated for ex-pedition and real fervice, and in order that the condition of the militia and the proficiency which the officers and foldiers have made in their duty, he from time to time fully known.

Fourthly, Reviews become necessary,-at which a few complimental falutes and simple motions are by no means fufficient.—The regiment which is at any time reviewed, should rather exhibit their at any time reviewed, should rather exhibit their attainments in the manual exercise,—the freings, and of these a variety.—And also their exactness in performing their manuaves, which should also be displayed in variety—without this how shall the reviewing general determine whether the troops reviewed by him, be properly disciplined and sit to take the field or not,—or by his own view fee what cautions,—new orders or regu-lations are requisite which are some of the princiadvantages that can refult from a review, which for the most part is attended with no small

I am not miltaken in the foregoing observations, gentlemen and spectators who have attended at the late reviews, may determine what end has, or can be answered by them,—as they may have come up to,—or sallen short of the proper design of their institution.

Several Thousand of Weavers, in Dublin, have assembled and paraded the Streets, threatning Destruction to the Venders and Wearers of any Commodity, but such as is manusatured in this Kingdom; and, to fill the Measure of our Woes, a Stamp-Act Scheme is, with some Certainty, talked of, nay, it is beyond a Doubt, that the Heads of it have been long formed, but kept back as a dernier Resource. To affait, our Readers, who live remote from this Merr pole so conjecturing the probable cause of this multing appearant, we would inform them, that the East India Company in London, by rea-

fon of the great d-crease of the importation of English Tea into America, (and indeed the total stoppage of it in the Southern governments) in confequence of the non-importation agreement, have become firing follicitors for the repeal of the ad of the British Parliament, by which a Tribute is exacted on us for every pound of TEA, against our confent, petitions and remonstrances. The Ministry, resolved against such repeal, and alto with a view of pacitying them, after the most violent infragements that have been made on their rights as a chartered company, procured the patting an act of parliament lati May, whereby the company are allowed to export their Teas themfelves (which they were before reftrained from doing) in fuch quantities as the Lords of the Treatury thould think proper. This Tea is upon its experiation from London to be discharged, as a further encouragement to the company, from certain-duties which by a former act were paid there; but the duty of three pence flerling on the pound is to be required, as utual, on its importation bere, agreeable to the obnoxious act of parliament, made for the purpose of railing a Revenue in America, which full remains in force, it is eafytofee that this measure is calculated, and no doubt defigned to increase and effablish the Revenue, which is a favorite object with administration. The cities of Philadelphia, New-York and Boston, to which places the cargoes of Tea are deftined, are greatly alarm'd at the measure, and refolv'd, if possible, to prevent its taking effect. The Citizens of Phila-delphia met at their Coffee House, and voted, that oephia met at their Conter Foute, and votes, inde-vident attack upon the Liberties of America; it and "that wholoever fhall directly or indirectly countenance this attempt; of in any wife aid or
