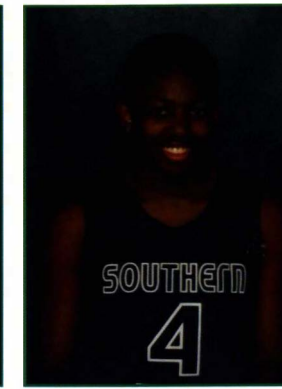

LADY HORNETS COACHING STAFF 2011-2012

LAQUANDA DAWKINS HEAD COACH



Laquanda Dawkins begins her second season at the helm of Southern Polytechnic State University Women's Basketball after leading the Hornets to their second consecutive NAIA tournament appearance. The highlights of the season included Southern Poly women topping Loyola for the second straight SSAC crown and earning the East Division regular season. The Hornets had a season record of 29-5 and were ranked as high as 17th in the NAIA national poll.

In her first season at Southern Poly, Dawkins coached the Hornets to 29 victories, including the program's first against a NCAA Division I team (Winthrop University).

A basketball coach for 12 years, Dawkins has coached at Gardner-Webb University, The University of Iowa, Florida International University and Winthrop University. She has classroom experience at the

university level and is committed to developing young women both athletically and academically.

The native of Shelby, North Carolina was a standout basketball performer for the University of North Carolina, and the Class of 1999 graduate earned her B.A. in Physical Education. During her time as a Tar Heel the team won three Atlantic Coast Conference titles in 1994-95, 1996-97, and 1997-98. Dawkins was named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll and received the Coach's Award.

Dawkins is also a 2008 graduate of the Black Coaches Association A.C.E. Program. In addition, she is a member of BCA (Black Coaches Association) and WBCA (Women's Basketball Coaches Association). Crest Senior High School retired her high school jersey.

STEPHON SERAILE ASSISTANT COACH



This marks Stephon Seraile's first season as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for the Lady Hornets basketball team. In addition to his recruiting responsibilities at Southern Poly, Seraile will assist with academics, team travel, strength and conditioning, player development, scouting, video exchange and on-the-floor coaching.

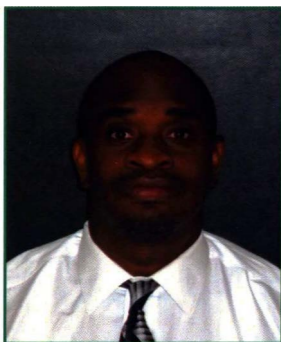
A native of Washington, D.C., Seraile most recently coached for five years at Wootton High School in Rockville, MD where he was an integral part of building their program.

Prior to his stint at Wootton, Seraile was Head Basketball Coach with the Maryland Flames and most recently with the Montgomery County Select AAU.

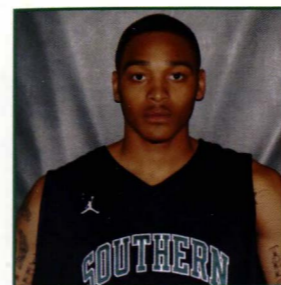

THEO WILLMON ASSISTANT COACH

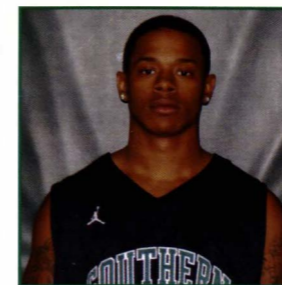

MEN'S BASKETBALL COACHING STAFF 2011-2012

TOMMY DILLON HEAD COACH



Tommy Dillon enters the 2011-2012 season as the Interim Head Coach. The Winchester, Kentucky native is in his third season with the Southern Polytechnic Hornets after serving two years as the Associate Head Coach.

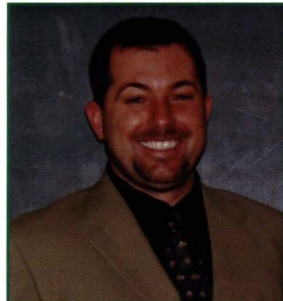
In 2010-2011 the Hornets had a season record of 23-10. Coach Dillon helped lead them to the SSAC second place regular season finish, the SSAC Tournament Championship Game, and the school's 14th NAIA National Tournament Appearance. The Hornets were ranked as high as 7th in the NAIA national poll.

In 2009-2010 Coach Dillon helped lead the Hornets to become the SSAC regular season and Conference Champions, as well as making SPSU's first ever national Final Four appearance with a record of 29-6.

The Runnin' Hornets are the first SSAC team since 2007 to make it to the Final Four. Dillon coached one NAIA All-American, three SSAC All-Conference players, the Conference MVP, and two conference All-Tournament Team members. SPSU Runnin' Hornets were ranked second in the nation in offensive rebounding for the 2009-2010 season and ranked as high as 8th nationally in the country

Dillon, 42, earned his Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration from Flagler College. He played college basketball at Eastern Kentucky University from 1989-1991 before a knee injury ended his playing career. Dillon was a walk-on his first season and earned scholarships both athletically and academically the following season. He was also a part of the ECU Colonels Tennis team from 1988-1991.

FRANKIE WILLINGHAM ASSISTANT COACH



Frankie Willingham enters his second season as an assistant for the Hornets where he is responsible for player development, conditioning, practice/ game planning and scouting. Prior to this season, Willingham spent two seasons (2008-2010) as the assistant varsity and head JV basketball coach at Paulding County High School. In 2007 he was the head coach for South Paulding Middle.

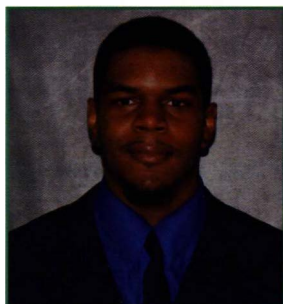
In the spring of 2005, Willingham was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma and required a year of chemo treatment, causing him to miss the 2005-2006 seasons. During the 2004 season, he coached as a student assistant under head coach Kevin Templeton at Tennessee Temple University in Chattanooga. Willingham began his coaching career in 1996 after

two serious knee injuries ended his playing career. That same year he founded the Patriot AAU program.

Willingham was a high school four-year letterman (1989-1993) in both basketball and football at Paulding County High School. The 1993 graduate was a sophomore starting quarterback, and he led his team to a GHSA Class A State Championship. Willingham was named to the Georgia Christmas Classic all-tournament team and was the tournament MVP. His junior and senior year he was named to the all county and all region team in basketball.

Willingham graduated with a bachelor's degree in social science from Ashford University and is continuing his education there to obtain his masters degree.

ERVIN HERRON ASSISTANT COACH



Ervin Herron II enters his first season with the Southern Polytechnic State University Hornets as an assistant coach. Herron will be responsible for scouting, conducting individuals and aiding in recruiting and practice.

In 2010-2011, Herron played his senior season at SPSU. He was a starter and helped lead the Hornets to a record of 23-10 as well as a second place finish in the Southern States Athletic Conference tournament

and the school's 14th NAIA National Tournament appearance. Under Herron's play, the Hornets were ranked as high as 7th in the NAIA national poll.

A native of Memphis, Tennessee, Herron is currently continuing his playing career for the American Basketball Association's Atlanta Aliens. Herron is also in the process of earning his bachelor's degree in psychology here at SPSU.
