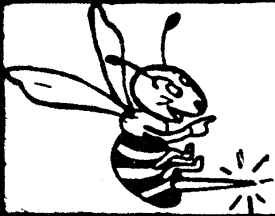

We appreciate your interest and ask you to continue to plan for a grand opening which now may take place at the beginning of winter quarter.

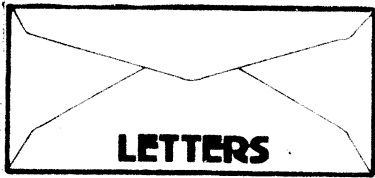
NOTICE TO ALL STUDENTS

Students name, address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, date of attendance, degrees and awards received, and the most previous education agency or institution attended by the student.

One of the first major actions taken by this S.G.A. was to set up the S.G.A. social and entertainment committee. The purpose of this committee is to take a long range look at the entertainment plans for the upcoming year. In the past, separate committees have been set up to handle one event and then disbanded along with their experience with putting on an event. This new committee will be interested in expanding old ideas and trying new inovative ideas and is open to suggestions.

The committee is in the process of determining what and when events can be held, while remaining within the budget.

There is only \$4,000.00 allocated for entertainment events in S.G.A. Budget. There is also money in the student center budget which will be used for events in the student center. Quite frankly, \$4,000.00 doesn't seem like much for an entire years events, however, if properly planned and managed the money can go a long way.

It is a common myth on this campus that the \$16 Student Activity fee goes for nothing but entertainment events. Actually the \$16 pays for the STING, Log, Intramurals, Radio Station, and a majority of the costs for operating the student center.

ATTENTION VETERANS

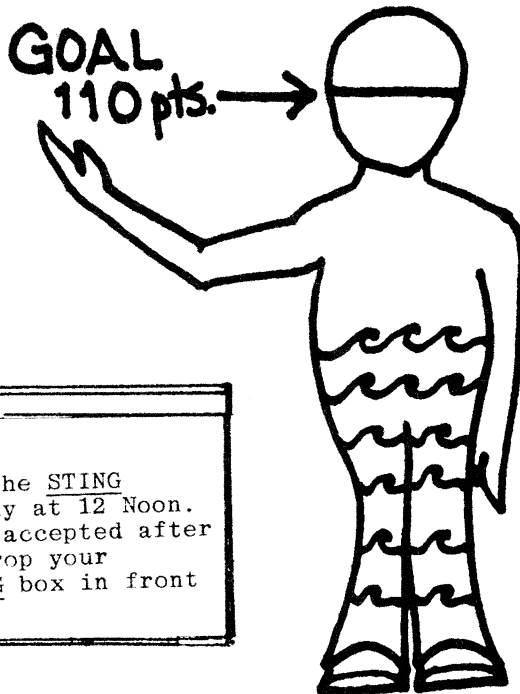
Beginning winter quarter--any veteran who fails to complete a Veteran's Status Card, will have his or her benefits interrupted.

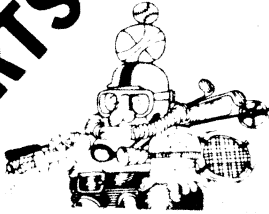

The Southern Tech Cross Country finished second in the South Atlantic Conference Cross Country Championships held at Valdosta State on November 6. Team scoring was as follows:
