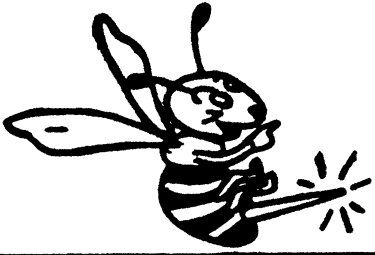

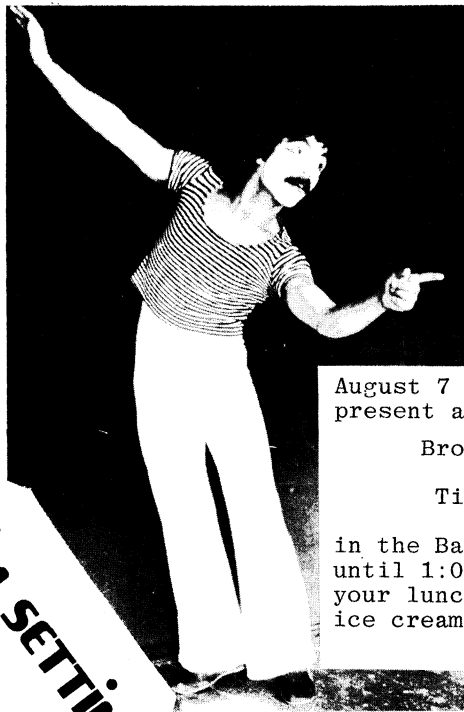

## Celebrate Astronomy Week

### at Fernbank

Governor Busbee has signed a proclamation naming the week of August 7-13 Astronomy Week in Georgia. Along with several state parks, museums and nature centers, Fernbank Science Center is planning special activities to celebrate the week. Programs have been designed to acquaint the citizens of Georgia with the beautiful natural environment found in the sky.

"Astronomy Week" also coincides with the spectacular Perseid meteor shower which occurs reliably during August each year. The Fernbank planetarium will offer a free program entitled "Preparing for the Perseids" from 7:00 - 7:30 p.m. Tuesday through Friday preceding the regular 8:00 p.m. planetarium program. This program will be a constellation study and a discussion of the Perseid meteor shower with advice on how to observe it. The 11:00 a.m. Saturday morning planetarium show will also emphasize comets, meteors and meteor showers.

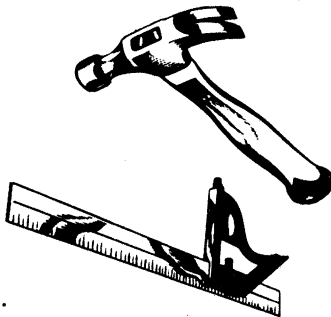

# GRAND HOTEL

A film about a cross-section of life in an upper crust hotel. John Barrymore is a baron who manages to get involved in the lives of several guests. Chief among these is Russian dancer, Grusinskaya, played by Garbo, a lonely, inscrutable woman who gives the picture an air of mystery that meshes well with Barrymore's disciplined performance. Other episodes feature Joan Crawford as a secretary who accepts her boss's advances as a part of her job and Lionel Barrymore as a man dying of heart trouble on a final fling. William Daniels' camera catches the glitter of a cosmopolitan hotel highlighted by a brilliant shot of the lobby shown from a top story which squeezes all the bustle, color, and variety of the hotel into one moment.

The fabulous Fox continues its Family Film Festival with the first big, all-star talkie and the original source of Greta Garbo's legendary line, "I want to be alone." Grand Hotel stars John and Lionel Barrymore, Joan Crawford, Wallace Beery, Jean Hersholt and Lewis Stone and will be shown one time only at the Fox Theatre on Monday, August 21.

The oldest classic movie in the Fox Festival, Grand Hotel won the Academy Award as best movie of the year 1932, launching not only Garbo's career but assuring Crawford's as well.

With the doors opening at 7 p.m., there will be a Pink Panther cartoon, an audience sing-a-long and musical favorites played on the mighty Fox organ by Bob Van Camp, at 7:30.

Due to long lines and expected sell-outs, the Fox management advises that tickets be purchased in advance. Tickets are available at the Fox box office and all SEATS locations for \$2.50 each. Proceeds go toward the restoration of the Fox Theater.
