I've heard that there has been quite a lot of complaining about the activity fee by the student body. Well, for those of you who are against the paying of activity fees and for those of you who are apathetic please read on.

In the next few months, your Student Government will be considering two proposals.

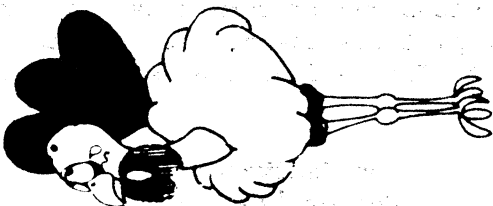
Plan A: Increase the Student Activity fee by \$5.00 now and \$2.00 more in two years.

Plan B: Increase the Student Activity fee by \$7.00 now and call it an Athletic fee.

In both cases, the fee increase is due to the fact that we can't support both the proposed student center (something for all students) and our illustrious athletic program (everyone knows the school will certainly cease to exist if our athletic program ceases to exist!) It should be known that the athletic department does not financially support the intramural program (or lend any other kind of support to the intramural activities).

VETS

A veteran on Co-op has the option of receiving one of two payment plans:

- (1) The veteran can elect the cooperative rate (which is less than the regular GI Bill rate) and receive a check every month (while in school and in the field) until his/her 36 months entitlement is exhausted, or
- (2) The veteran can elect to receive the regular GI Bill rate, which entails receiving a check when enrolled in school only. No checks will be received when in the field working.

Under this plan, the veteran is re-certified each quarter that he/she is enrolled in school.

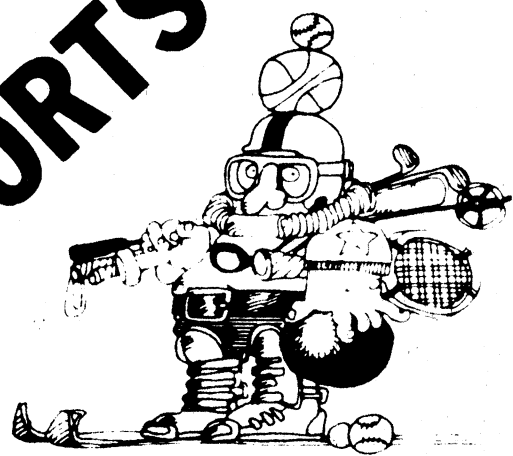
If a veteran desires an Advance Payment he/she should inform the Office of Veterans Affairs at least 30 days in advance of the registration date for the quarter that he/she will be enrolling.

The veteran should inform the Office of Veterans Affairs of his/her choice of payment plans (see 1 or 2 above) upon determination that he/she will be on Co-op.

Southern Tech cross country runners scored 27 points to capture a three way meet at DeKalb County's cross country course, Golfmore, Thursday, October 31.

Roy Allen of Gainesville Jr. College led a field of 22 runners over the 4.4 mile distance grass course to finish first, although Gainesville finished second with 36 points followed by DeKalb Jr. College (Central Campus) with 59 points.

Allen's time was 26 minutes and 2 seconds. Tech men scoring points were Lee Thomas, 2nd place, 26:24; Louis Pannell, third place, 26:37; Tommy Nelson, fifth place, 27:01; Shad Atkinson, sixth place, 27:27 and Rick Terry, ninth place, 28:00.

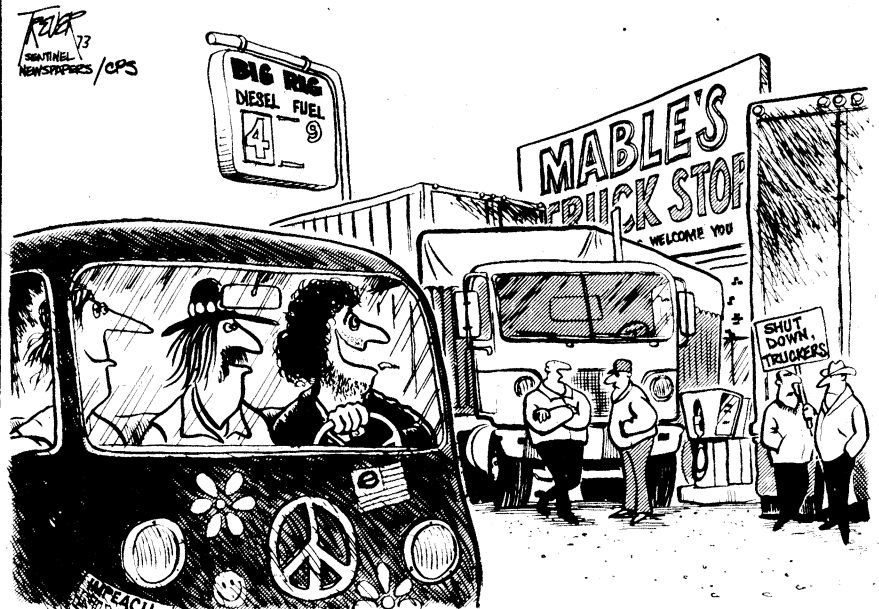
According to Southern Tech cross country coach Clancy Head, whose team was plagued by injuries in the recent Georgia Collegiate Cross Country Championship where they finished ninth in an eleven team meet, all his injured have recovered and their running much improved.
