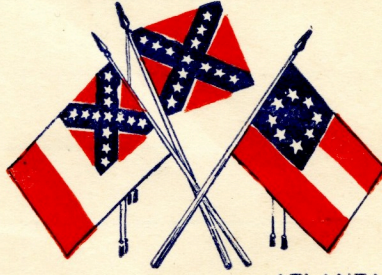

My Dear Mary Warren:

Your Postal was received on Friday. Donald came Friday pm, and left Sunday am for his Term work. If he gets back in time he can get a ride to Brunswick with some one of the family who will take little Tommy to his parents, who are expected at St. Simons next week. Finding myself ^{alone} came here Monday afternoon to remain till Thursday afternoon. I answered Helen's letter and also sent her Friday's local papers. Mr. Charley Brown says a low altitude is good for the asthma, and it is for this reason that one of the Brumbys lives in New Orleans. So I hope Treville continues better than when here. Will will go to assist Uncle Burwell in caring for Treville till school "opens." Tell T. that his father opened the box Mr. Heis sent him, to find (2) eggs. Mary Teen came to borrow a book, and Grace Dadds to use the telephone; otherwise things have been quiet at home, except that one day last week a lightning and wind storm resulted in smashing out three of the glasses in the door to my room, but with no other damage that I know of. I presume that Donald will go on Saturday or Sunday to St. Simons and that you will return with him. I am sorry that you have been sick. Very Affectionately, Papa
