I.D. CARD INFORMATION

All students are required to have a Photo I.D. card. Once a student has a Photo I.D., the card is permanent.

NEWS FROM STUDENT GOVERNMENT

The Southern Tech Student Government Association convened for their first meeting of the fall quarter with many council representative seats still unfilled.

At last Wednesday's meeting, acting treasurer Davina Kitchens announced strict accounting measures for the money spent by SGA. She said she intends to limit persons with authority to charge SGA with supplies, materials, etc. Ms. Kitchens also announced that inventory would be taken of all SGA properties, such as the radio station and auto repair shop. Finally, Ms. Kitchens said that all areas funded by the SGA will be required to keep records of expenditures and receipts.

In other action SGA council member Bill Royal, chairman of a committee to find a faculty advisor, said five faculty members were contacted and two of them said they would like to be advisor to SGA. However, according to Royal, one of them has taken a leave of absence from STI and the other one is now not sure. The search for an SGA advisor will continue, said Royal.

President Dobslaw brought up the question of intramurals and who should control the \$2,000 funded by SGA for it. Dobslaw said that he had told the administration that coach Perides, STI's new athletic director, should work thru Student Council on intramurals. Dobslaw asked the Student Council if they minded the administration taking over control of intramural money. Needless to state, the vote was a unanimous "no." The Student Government then formed an intramural committee to work with coach Perides on intramurals.

The Student Government Association meets every Wednesday at 5 p.m. in the Library Seminar Room. All students are welcome to attend the meetings. Also, if anyone would like to have business on the SGA agenda, they must complete the agenda request form on the secretary's door in the Library lobby. The form must be completed and submitted by 5 p.m. Monday before the following Wednesday meeting. By completing this form you will receive priority under new business for the meeting.

The SGA is now taking petitions for the office of Secretary and Treasurer.

The Secretary and Treasurer must be a rising sophomore, junior or senior member of the student body. The secretary records, preserves all minutes, by-laws, charters, bills, resolutions and rolls of attendance of the S.G.A. The pay is \$100.00 per quarter.

Both the Secretary and Treasurer are elected by the Student Council.

During the past S.G.A. general elections not all positions were filled. These open positions are filled by appointment by the advice and consent of the Student Council. The following positions are open: (back page)

1. Two part-time Representatives (12 hrs. or less)
2. Fall-Spring Co-op
3. Senior Class Representative
4. The following departments do not have representatives, AET, CET, MET, FST, AMET, and TET. Department Representatives must be either juniors or seniors.

The Judicial Cabinet, which is elected by the Student Council, is taking petitions for 11 Justices. The Judicial Cabinet handles all appeals of campus traffic violations, has the power to interpret the SGA constitution, and oversees other actions of the Student Council. This cabinet also hears cases referred to it by the Dean of Students. The vice-president of the student body is also in need of a parliamentarian. This person needs to be familiar with Roberts Rules of Order.

Election of the 2 Freshmen class representatives and the Fall-Spring Co-op representative will be held the early part of Fall Quarter. Petitions for these positions may be secured at the SGA office located off the Library lobby. The deadline for petitions is September 28 at 12 Noon. If you have filled out a petitions during summer quarter, your petition is already on file.

Make a point to stop by the SGA offices and get involved in what's happening on campus.

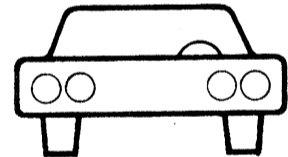
